corresponded visited Milgram Church and
castle and sent a ~~free~~ brochure which
I abbreviated and have included. I
can't work very long until I am exhausted
and have to lie down. I guess with my
health as is time is running out on me.

But yesterday I read over your letters
(I think I have misplaced some) and I went
to correct or question some of the info
in them. I should have jotted down as I
read and save the time of re-reading,
but I did not.

About Coleman Milam marrying a dau.
 of James Leake, I do not know, but I
 always suspected he married a White
 since Thomas H. Milam & wife ^{Margaret Amanda Bell} named 1st
 dau. Margaret ~~Anna~~ Salina, the Margaret
 continued from her mother, gr. mother, & gt.
 gr. mother. The 2nd dau. was named Malinda
 White Milam and called White all her
 life, so since Bells had no White, I
 concluded Thomas H. Milam's mother
 must have been a White, but don't know.

Bartlett Ferrell Milam ca. 1750 -
 Sept. 11, 1822. had two chw. who never married
 Feril and Nancy and moved to Bartlett,
 Co. Ga. & both buried Eucharlee Cemetery with
 grave markers. Nancy lived until 1888 and
 left a Bible with her nephew's family with whom
 she had lived many years that said John
 Milam had 6 sons: Samuel, James, Bartlett
 Farrell, John, Benjamin, & Thomas. She seemed
 not to have mentioned any daughters. She was
 born 1796 about the time Bartlett moved to
 S.C.

You know Benjamin ^{son of John} was not married
 1782, and I believe in York Co. He was
 the Benjamin with 4 white females: Judith,
 Nancy, Hannah Bartlett & Johns gr. dau.
 Mary Ireland. & when Laurens Co census was

Taken I believe he & Judith were only ones together & Hannah ^{pancy} & Mary elsewhere.
Noe Berg moved back to Va
Pittsylvania Co. where he intermarried into Peter Milam family.

1810 census gives John, Micajah, Sarah, and Zachariah 474, Bedford Co.; and Simeon Kanawha Co. \$14; & Bush Milam Botetourt Co. 641. Pittsylvania and Halifax Cos. are missing in 1810.

Then 1820 are Allen 43A; Harris 699; John 66; Lewis 71A; Halifax Co.

Benjamin 43A; Solomon 44; Zachariah, Jr. 43A; Zachariah Sr. 44 - Bedford Co.

Jacob 133; & Walter 133, Lee Co.

I wonder if the Judith Milam 1820 is John's widow. She would be about 90, improbable, but not impossible.

I thank you so much for John Milam's will in York Co. June 1789. The last record I had of him was in Halifax Co. 1788. ~~Longman~~ James Milam never did leave Halifax Co. and Grace Milam Chumley was living nextdoor to James. I thought by her marriage she was not James dau. But possibly sister or cousin. One James Meylum or Martha Webster had a dau. Sesannah b. July 3, 1765 in Pittsylvania Co. Va.

The chn of Coleman Milam - Thos. F. 1810;

1821 or Ashford 1820-21; Martha L. 1820-25)
Pleasant Coleman 1827; Albert G. 1829;
Sarah 1833. Before his last marr. he had
8 chn. I believe Ashford or James one was
son of one of a woman living with Elizabeth Milam
Franklin Co., 1830 Tenn. Census.

Had nearly \$100⁰⁰ research by Thos. E. Wade of
 Enville, Hardin Co. TN. wasn't worth a damn.
 James M. Milam 3 Nov. 1873 declared lunatic & ~~admit~~
 & Court found entirely insane & D. S. W. Crumby & R. East
 appoint a Commr. to let him out to lowest bidder
 or private contract until 1st Mon. in Jan 1874.

Since I do not know where Coleman Melam was living 1821, I do not know whether James Morrow b. Ala & sometimes said Tenn, was Coleman's son or not. His grandson said he died 1901 Pope Co. But I'm sure both Wm & Gerald were James Morrow's sons. None of the whole mess could read or write according to the census.

This is Cornelius Coleman Melam son of James M. Marr. 1st. Deensha Ann McDaniel in Searcy Co. 1871 and had 11 chd. the 6 last of 11 given here. Then 9-30-1900 he marr Martha Susan Gilliam b. 8 June 1878 d. Oct. 23, 1935 Douglass Ark. Neal d. 2-20-1929. & they had 9 chd. making 20 for him. I think I sent you the records of James M., Cornelius, & James Jr., No wills or Admin. in Hardin Co. of Melam, so Wade said. Books 1, 2, 3, & 4 -

Book F, 1850 - Oct. 2, 1852

Patience Cooper Melam for dower of estate of Jonathan Cooper, dead her late husband, appointed as her dower, land on Hardin's Creek 6 1/4 acres land, etc - equals 1/3 of estate of Jonathan Cooper - as her rights, & she pay all costs of this suit to retain during her natural lifetime.
(But no mention of the Melam husband. I wonder)

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if it could have been Albert, whose estate
was in Minute Book F, p. 203, Monday Oct. 4, 1852
by Thos. F. Milam which was the same day
Patience Cooper's estate was settled. But she
married Albert & she ^{previouly} had this land and
Albert died (Milams were tubercular) she used to get
her dower. I don't have any more from it. Thos. F.
made bond & was issued letters of administration

P. 150 Jesse C. (Coleman) Milam age 74 white male
born at Savannah, Ga. died July 11, 1927 -
cause: Cardiac Stenosis - This was Ashford's
& Rosa's son, a minister.

Hardin Co - Bethel Cemetery -

Lorangi Milam b. 1854 d. 8-12-1856
(This could be Lorenzo Montgomery Milam,
son of Thos. F. & Margaret Annanda Bell Milam
who died young according to Goodspeed's N.W. Ark.)

not ours as far as known.

Settlement of Poindexter estate, Martha m. Rufus Milam
49 acres hers - \$350⁰⁰ - 10 heirs -

That's what I got for over \$80⁰⁰.

I have all Confederate Pensions in Texas (I think)
if you want them. All are initials but one or two
and darn initials. Don't tell a thing!

Thiley Glen's records -

Thos. Milam b. ca 1800 Laurens Co., S.C.
went to Wilkes Co. Ga. then to Henry Co. Ga.
Stockbridge - Land owner, wife Priscilla d.
before Thomas. Both buried 2 miles so. of
Stockbridge. 4 sons & 1 dau.

Wiley & Riley - turns b. Nov. 14, 1823.
Wiley d. 16 Oct. 1910; Riley d. 22 Jan. 1875
Henry Milam; John Milam b. 1833 d. 1863
buried in Concord Cemetery, Stockbridge Ga,
and Priscilla Milam.

I have 1850 census of Henry Co. Ga. with Thos
F. Milam - mechanic, b. 1798 I believe 52, and I
also wrote & they said they had will & estate
settlement of Thos F. Jr. by Thos. F. Milam
Sr. in 1850's or 60's & now I can't find it.
I have so darn much. When I try to do anything
I am in a constant state of confusion.

But I had company Mon. P.M. - a distant
relative wanting Burham info & I pushed
aside Milams & got Burham records to help
her & she stayed until almost sundown & then
I put records away & found first 4 pages of
your letter pushed away with Burham marriages.
So the papers on Thos. F. Milam family of Henry
Co. Ga. may be mixed in. I was so-o-o tired!
