Dear Mr. & Mrs. Peeples,

Thanks for your letter and I am going to answer while my mind is active and I will try to help you as I did have literally thousands of records, but my son & his wife who live in Bossier City La. & doesn't give a tinker's dam for genealogy or history, have at 3 different times burned a bunch of my precious & costly records when they come in usually unexpected; until the last I am just crushed. 1880 census & 190 censuses of every Burham in Ark that cost me nearly 100<sup>00</sup>. So today I just could not write up any more - have 38 Milam pages and am on Coleman & his family - all my Milam census in one manilla envelope destroyed - so I blew my top & gave orders they do not burn anything else at my place! What today.

You asked me twice about Diatrophus (or Diataphus) called "Dodge" Milam b. 1820 Lawrence Co. S.C. He was the oldest son of John Milam Jr. & Elizabeth - Nancy (youth now who was she? His 2nd wife was ~~Melinda~~ <sup>Melinda</sup> - wife). other chn. Willis m. Martha Washington; Wm m. Polly Nixon; Parthenia m Joseph Garner; Madison m. Beekley —

2nd set. Larkin Cole m. Jeffie Scroggins

Leake J. m. Sallie Pounds; Wylie m. Eleg. Fragua. (one of John Milam's who marr. Ann Jackson oldest sister of Eleg. Jackson) Milam had a son Moses who 1790 marr. Edy Fragua. I have 3 dau. of Ann's dates of marr. & husband. She & Eleg. were d/o Jarvis Jackson said a/k uncle of Andrew, but I don't know as I haven't seen it proved made well Dec. 10, 1796 - ] ;

I have this from the gth. gr. daug. of John Milam III  
 who did not go to the west after his when his father  
 went 1819 to Madison Co., Ala., but went to Pontotoc  
 Co. Miss where he 1860 is listed as 78 years old  
 and is said to be the oldest son of John II. He had  
 daus, before then as he 1790 was over 16 & had one son  
 under 16; 6 females & 5 slaves; but in 1800 John II had 4 sons,  
 3 born 1790-1800. Millie Pitts Milam 1850 was 57 years.

Now to your info: It may be that Coleman Milam  
 marr'd a Leake or Leake as some of John Milam II's  
 chn. did. The Leake family came from Va.  
 I believe I saw that name in Borden's grant in  
 Augusta Co. or Orange one which was formed from  
 Spotsylvania & Augusta from Orange. Borden's  
 grant had thousands & thousands of acres granted  
 by the King for drawing ~~settled~~ settlers for almost  
 a pittance. I think Coleman did not have a wife in  
 1816 as he signed "Coal Mala" with required 3 witnesses,  
 but no lover signed. There was a 5 year span  
 between ~~then~~ Thomas Feb. 1810 and ~~then~~ A. S. 1815.  
 I am sure that before Coleman's last marr'd. there were  
 3 chn 1800-20; 2 chn 1820-25; 2 sons 1825-30 & 1 dau 1830-  
 35. making 8 chn.

What proof do you have for saying Dorcas  
 Rebecca Harris was sister of Wm C. Harris?  
 That Milam family when Isaac was still  
 living in Calif and many of Cornelius Coleman's  
 chn were still living said Dorcas was full  
blood Cherokee Indian. I had a picture of  
 Cornelius Coleman along with several ~~other~~ of  
 his chn. before my son & wife learned them,  
 along with 2 pictures of my dad & mother made  
 Easter Sun when I was 5 or 6 years old.  
 Neatly sure looked Indian; but the descendants of

Martha Harris seen ~~saw~~ don't stand or feed  
headed most table eyed  
John and Alice Harris's son Luther I have  
known since a child before he died in his 90's.  
After he came back from Calif & raised cattle, I  
would see Luther at the feed mill & while waiting  
for our turn to have our hay & corn ground, would  
get into one or the other trucks together & talk family.  
He told me his Grandma & Grandpa Harris had  
9 children and gave from his head? They came to  
Ark. 1880 and was so dry they nearly died for  
want of water. Went up on Mill Creek & hauled water  
in barrels from water holes where cattle were standing  
& polluting with body wastes, & then had to boil it & strain.  
Ch. he gave.

You probably have all this (They w. in Tenn).

You know I learned very early not to write anything unless there is proof of it and I do not want my records messed up with others taking things for granted. In my opinion I do not yet have proof of Coleman being son of Thomas. He could have been one of the 7 of 19 chd. of John T, not proved or of Samuel over in Ninety Six Dist. Samuel is a name in Regis (Uncle Buck's) Land.

And I do not think the Thomas Milam in Milam Gap who had Milam's Apple Fairfax Co. Va. was the Thomas who marr. Mary Bush Adams. for I have copy of a letter written by Judge Buchanan, gr. fa. or gr.gr fa of Thomas who said he lived & died at Milam Gap & had all girls & no sons. Info. like that from one who knows, can be accepted as accurate.

Write the Masonic Lodge in Hardin Co. Tn. & find out what Wm Harris' middle name was. the stone says G very plainly.

Coleman Milam was not on the 1870 census - anywhere

Should have been on the mortality  
schedule, but 1870 of Tenn. just des-  
appeared.

Research is so hard in S.C. as no  
licenses or bonds of marr. required from  
1788(?) to 1911. and census or Bible records (few)  
& estate records all that are left.

Thomas F. (Tom) Milam b. 1797 Laurens Co.

S.C. was the one who w. Priscilla & went to  
Chickas Co., Ga; then before or by 1840 was in Stock-  
bridge, Henry Co., Ga. where Thomas Milam  
(son of John Milam I.) is said to have died  
1823 - No proof - just hearsay. So I have  
written a professional in Atlanta to research it.  
The census 1850 gives Thos. F. in Henry Co., Ga., &  
probated estate of Thos. F. Jr., Oct. 1, 1854 who was  
in Fayette Co., Ga., 1850, with Wm E. Tucker family  
who was probably a sister of Tom.

I feel like a Tendgrass in Atlanta, Ga. who wrote  
an article <sup>Tendergrass</sup> compiling a book in Sedona, Ariz. &  
who told Allen not to speculate on his line ~~as~~  
as he said if a thing fit he put it in & let someone  
prove it right or wrong; for he did not want someone,  
latching onto a statement & taking it as fact & spreading  
it all over - Confusing and he wanted proof.

Another thing: In 1840 Coffee Co., Tenn. this <sup>Coleman</sup> Milam  
family with Walter used Mileham as family name.

P.S. Thanks for the group sheets, but whoever did them has errors. Wm Harris 1850 was 31 - had not yet had his birthday as census taker was instructed not to count birthdate unless already passed that year. This census was taken Oct. 9, 1850 (always get the date on the page heading of census as this is very important) William Harris was born October 18, ~~1818~~ 1818; died May 19, 1881 - I went to cemetery day before yesterday, and checked his rock. It is badly coated with ivy growth. When I checked over Williams before the Low's Creek Cemetery book was ever published I took detergent and a light steel brush & cleaned all rocks & got correct reading off them; but they are terrible again now.

I would like proof that Thos. Milam son of John I was b. 1757 as the 1810 census gave age 25-45, but wife was over 45,

I wrote to census Bureau & got copies of original censuses.

I don't believe Ashford was son of Coleman but could be was b. ~~1820~~ 1819 or 1820 d. 1850-60 & widow Rosannah m. W.C. Kincaid 1-21-1866. Her son Rev Jesse C. Milam b. 1850 or 60 d. 7-11-1927 (74 yrs.) tombstone Hardin Co. Error here.
