The earliest record of the Milian

family is John Milen Sr. (born about 1725) and who lived in Halifax County, Virginia. His home was on Bradley's Creek, a stream with headwaters near Republican Grove and emptying into the Banister River in the Meadville district. It is believed that he had formerly lived in Louisa County, Virginia. The earliest entry in the Halifax County deed records referring to Fohna Milami is of a deed to him from John Stuart, dated October 1, 1764, conveying 700 acres of land on Bradley's Creek.

The enumerations of heads of families of the County of Halifax, State of Virginia, recorded 28 Aug 1789, for the year of 1782, includes dehn Milamy -800, (he was living in 1788.)

John Milan, Sr., had six sons; Pertletts Semuels Senjamin, John, Thomas and James. Bentlett Milan, Sr., son of John

Milem. Breb acquired lands on Bradley's Creek in Halifax County, Virginia. The deed conveying this land dated November 16, 1775, in the land records of Halifax County. In the records are seven entries of deeds to and from Bartlett Milam. On February 25, 1796 he sold his lands in Halifax County, 'irginia and moved with his family to Laurens Listrict, South Carolina. Three of his brothers Thomas Benjamin and John had moved from Halifax County, Virginia and setled in Laurens Pistrict, South Carolina, several years prior to dartlactta moving there.

The enumerations of heads of families of Halifax County, Virginia for the year of 1785 includes Bertlutt Milan, He died in Laurens District, South Carolina, on September 11, 1822; Missbath Hilam, Wife. Bertlett Miles, died July 18, 1823.
