Forgive the long delay; but I am researching all my lines and I made some new contacts on Burcham and Bosley families, my line from Grandpa Burcham.

(By the way your gr. parents Mack and Nannie Mc Kenzie lived on Grandpa Burcham's place when Obe (Obediah?) was a young boy and my mother & the other Burcham girls thought so much of Nannie as she was small, weak, and sickly & they would go draw her wash water and help her to wash and scrub, then she would make them some cookies, Obe was their only child and badly spoiled and altho he was about the age of Mama's 3rd sister (6 girls & 3 boys), he did not help his little mother & while Mack made a share crop on Grandpa's place and all Burcham girls walked to school, Mack bought Obe a pony and he rode, Mama says often riding his pony among them coming and going and not working or feeding them. Now to Milams:

Caleman Milam was conscripted
2 different times in War of 1812 -
He received bounty land while
living in Hardin Co. Tenn. (as
service in this war while
living in S.C. I wrote to the
S.C. State Library, but got an
answer that they did no research
whatsoever, I believe he served
under Col. Laidersmill). So
if you are in Charleston, you
might check this and see
what you can find. But then
when a man was conscripted
into military service, actually
not enough family information
was taken to notify the next of
kin if he became a casualty.

I sent \$10⁰⁰ to Natl Archives,
Washington for some military
and other records, among which
was Thomas Milam, wife Elizabeth
who served in Tenn. in War of 1812 -
Sergeant commanding officer, Record
No. etc.; but received a Thomas
Milam - on roll Oct. 4 - 1813 to
Jan. 11, 1814 - Tenn. Volunteers -
#118021 - 1st Lt. - made Sargt. Nov. 14

Entered Sept. 1812 - Disch. Nov or
Dec in Capt. John Porter's Co.
Col. Hinn, Hynn's Regt.

7th Nov. 1813 - Jan 4th 1814
