




Miles

Arms: (Miles of Leigh Court, County Somerset, Baronet)

Azure, a chevron erm between three maces argent each charged with a fleur-de-lis sable

Crest: A dexter arm embowed in armour ppr. garnished or, supporting with the hand an arbor also ppr.


Motto: "Sola Virtus Invicta" (Virtue alone is invincible). It is generally accepted that the origin of this surname is taken from the Norman "Milo" rather than a corruption of "Michael" as heretofore known.



Seats:

Abbots Leigh, Bristol. Sir Henry Robert William Miles (Baronet creation 1859 of Leigh Court Somerset). Fifth son of the first baronet, Sir William Miles.

Dear Robert -

I have been very much interested in your "Miles Genealogy" which has appeared in the S.C. Historical Magazine. It must represent a vast amount of patient, careful research and I congratulate you for such a thorough job.

If it is not too much trouble, could you answer a question for me? You note that the family motto is "Sola Virtus Invicta" and give the description of the family crest. Have you been able to establish a connection with the Barons Miles of Leigh Court, County Somerset, England?

I am very uninformed about heraldry, arms, etc. and in looking up the Miles family in Burke's Peerage noted that the ~~Baron~~ was created in 1859. Does this simply mean the title of Baronet? or was the coat of arms created then also? My slight reading in heraldry indicates that a crest cannot be claimed unless one also possesses arms (ie = a shield). I assume therefore that if John Miles who immigrated to South Carolina in the late 17th century had a ring with a crest, his family also must have been entitled to a shield as well.

If you have any specific information about this - or have been in communication with any of the Miles family of Leigh Court - would you let me know? I have no particular interest in the crest or family arms per se but ~~I~~ would like, if possible, to know more about the connections with the English branch of the family. I had thought of writing the present Baronet but felt it might be more useful to ask you, in case you had already done so.
