

The Miles ~~Family~~^A Genealogy

A Study of Early Generations of the Miles Family of S.C. Planters.

John Miles arrived in Charles Town from England not later than 1687 as proved by the fact that his son, Thomas, who died 21 Feb. 1756 aged 69 was "a native of this province".¹ The earliest record of John is on 9 March 1693 when he was among those appointed to appraise the estate of Thomas Hill, deceased.² On 31 Dec. 1694 John was "being upon Account of arrival nights for himself granted 140 acres ~~for himself of self~~ and Arnold Hoskynns"³ (Hoskins?)³; on 16 Feb. 1695 he was among those appointed to appraise the estate of Capt. Clarke.⁴ He purchased from the Lords Proprietors 160 acres 8 April 1696⁵ and secured a warrant for an additional 500 acres 7 April 1704,⁶ the latter located "between Henry Samways and John Cattle". On 5 Jan. 1708 John and his wife, Mary, signed an indent selling for 13 £ 26 acres on Coppins Creek, part of a 300 acre tract he owned, for glebe lands for St. Andrew's Parish. John witnessed the will of his son-in-law, Richard Vincent, 23 Jan. 1719⁷ and that of John Girardeau 24 Feb. 1721⁸. St. Andrew's Parish Register shows he was buried 28 July 1722.⁹ The seal of John Miles bearing the crest and motto currently used by the Barons Miles of Leigh Court, County Somerset, England is in the possession of a descendant, indicating a common source of the families. Crest: a dexter arm embowed in armour ppr. garnished or, supporting with the hand an anchor also ppr.

Thomas Miles (John') born S.C. 1687, died 21 Feb. 1756 and was buried at his Poplar Springs plantation, St. Paul's Parish.¹ The cemetery is on land originally granted to the immigrant, John Miles, and entailed (no! REFP) through Robert Miles whose son, John, divided the land between his sons Thomas Braley Miles, who received Poplar Springs area, and Smith Miles, who received Raven Woods where the cemetery ^{is} ~~remains~~.

Thomas was co-executor of the will of brother-in-law Richard Vincent 23 Jan. 1719⁷. His own will¹⁸ of 16 Oct. 1751, with codicil of 21 Feb. 1756, proved 19 Mar. 1756, ^{names} ~~names~~ his wife Mary, his daughters Elizabeth Ladson and Margaret Hartley, his brother Jeremiah, his sons John, Thomas, William and Silas, grandson Richard Wickham, granddaughters Elizabeth McPherson, Elizabeth Coats and Martha Wickham. His wife, Mary, is buried beside him, her tombstone reading: "Here lieth the body of Mary Miles who departed this life 23 Oct. 1764, age 77 years." Her obituary¹⁹ notes she was born in America 1687, moved to S.C. 1707, names her late husband; they had "9 children, 57 grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren" of whom "now remain alive 3 children, 23 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren". Her will¹⁹ of 1764, proved 8 March 1765 names sons Silas and John, deceased son William, daughter Margaret wife of Robert Williams, granddaughters Amelia Ladson and Mary Miles; executors were sons Silas and John and son-in-law Robert Williams.

Thomas Miles had land grants of 610 acres, 1000 acres and 390 acres in Colleton County in 1732. Inventories²⁰ of his property at his Saltcather and Horse Savannah plantations, excluding real estate, totaled £12,045-10-0 on 29 May 1756. Thomas and Mary Miles had 9 children:

7. Silas Miles received the 300 acres "where I live" under his father's will¹⁸ and 500 acres on Wammel's Creek.
8. A daughter, apparently deceased by 1756, who married a Coats and left a daughter, Elizabeth Coats, mentioned in her grandfather's will.¹⁸

WILLIAM MILES (John¹), planter of St. Andrew's Parish, born c. 1697, buried | St. Andrew's

again 1 Dec. 1736. His will²⁷ dated 7 July 1752 was proved 21 Aug. 1752²⁶. William

Jeremiah Miles (John') of Berkeley County, born c. 1708, died 7 Feb. 1737;
was elected member of Commons House of Assembly for
St. Paul's Parish, ~~Colleton County~~ 4 Dec. 1736. He married Elizabeth, daug.
Emm's of Ralph Emm's and widow of William Elliott.⁴⁶ They had only
two children, both under 18 yrs. on 2 Feb. 1736 when Jeremiah made
his will,⁴⁷ ~~which was proved 16 Feb. 1737~~. The will, proved 16 Feb. 1737, names
daughter wife Elizabeth, daughters Susanna and Sarah, brothers Thomas
and William, and brother-in-law Edward Perry. Their children:

On 4 Dec. 1766 James Parsons entered a caveat on behalf of
the children of Silas Miles against proving any supposed
will of the said Silas Miles. Jeremiah Miles left his daughter
Susannah a 745 acre plantation on Wannell's Creek.⁴⁹

Elizabeth Emm's Elliott Miles married (3) on 24 Sep. 1738 Elisha
Butler. In 1731 she had been bequeathed part of by her father-in-law, Thomas
Elliott, part of a lot in Charles Town near the Bay next to Col. Brewton.
Jeremiah Miles left her land on Stono river; a house to be built on
Broad St., Charles Town on a lot recently purchased from Rev. William
Guy was to be given to daughter Susannah on Elizabeth's death.
The Inventory of Jeremiah's goods and chattles, excluding real estate,
made 28 Feb. 1739 by Robert MacKown, Benjamin Downing, Burnaby
Bull and Richard Godfrey totaled £8,116.⁵⁰

Thomas Miles married (2) 19 Nov. 1750 in St. Paul's Parish, Martha, daughter of Thomas and Hannah McTeer of Pr. William Parish. Thomas McTeer made his will 15 Sept. 1753. After Thomas Miles also made his will ⁶ Sept. 1753, proved 20 May 1757, naming his brothers William, Silas, John Miles and James Ladson executors, and his daughters Elizabeth, Mary and Martha. Thomas had received 300 acres on Horse Savannah and 430 acres on Saltcatcher under his father's will.¹⁸ After the death of Thomas Miles, Jr. his widow, Martha McTeer Miles, married (2) a Mr. Shaw and (3) Robert Reid whose third wife was Nancy Ann, daughter of ~~Mr.~~ John Peoples of Cedar Grove plantation, Pr. Wm. Parish Marion's Brigade. Thomas and Martha McTeer Miles had one child:

William Miles (John Thomas²) planter of St. Paul's Parish, baptized St. Andrew's 19 Apr. 1719²¹, signed marriage bond 15 Mar. 1743 by which Rev. William Orr was licensed to marry him to Mary McKewn, Spinster, ^{who married 3 Aug. 1723 Susannah Hackett} daughter of Robert McKewn (1698 + 1 Oct. 1766) of Stone; William's will of 29 Sept. 1762 with codicil of 16 Feb. 1764 names his sons Robert and James and daughter Elizabeth and wife Elizabeth,⁶³ with John Miles, Robert McKewn, nephew Jeremiah Miles and John Miles, Jr. and Isaac McPherson as executors. The three children of William Miles and his first wife, Mary McKewn were:

William Miles married (2) Elizabeth, daus. of Robert Ladson and his wife, Sabina, daus. of Thomas Rose of "Accabee". Elizabeth married after the death of William Miles, her cousin Robert Ladson as his second wife.⁶⁴ She and sold it to Francis Rose 7 Dec. 1768. She inherited 400 acres of what is now Magnolia Gardens. William and Elizabeth Ladson Miles had two children:

1. William Miles, to whom his father gave four negroes on 26 Nov. 1757.

2. Mary Ladson Miles, received deed of gift of a negro from her brothers Robert and James on 18 Sept. 1769; she is mentioned in her brother James' will of 23 Dec. 1773. She married on 20 Sep. 1781 John ^{Emper} Farr (28 Nov. 1755 - 23 July 1789), son of Thomas and Phoebe Smith Farr.

Captain Silas Miles (John Thomas³) planter of St. Paul's Parish, died Monday Am 1 Dec. 1766.⁶⁵ He married his cousin, Elizabeth McPherson, daus. of Capt. James (1688-1771) and Rachel Miles McPherson. Their four children were:

Rachel Miles, born 22 Dec. 1755, died 30 Jan. 1802, married 18 Feb. 1773 Thomas Cater (17 Dec. 1751 - 20 Apr. 1805) of Cater Hall plantation, St. Peter's Parish, member of the House of Representatives from St. Peter's Parish, only son of Thomas (1731-1752) and Susannah Baker (6 Apr. 1731 - 8 Jan. 1752) Cater.⁶⁶ Issue.

Press Smith of ^{Soldier from St. Paul's 1791} Charles Town;⁶⁷ she married ② Nathaniel Farr, born 23 Sept. 1757, whose will proved 12 Feb. 1794 names his wife Elizabeth and his son (by his first wife, Mary Dunbar who died 9 Nov. 1778) Thomas Dunbar Farr. In her own will proved 28 Jan. 1823 Elizabeth Miles Smith Farr names her son, P. M. Smith, her granddaughter Harriett Smith and her daughter Anna M. Farr who married a Hutchinson and left a son, T. Leger Hutchinson.

McPherson; he was drowned when the ship "Rose-in-Bloom" sank 24 Aug. 1806. Susannah's will was dated 20 Aug. 1834; she died in Charleston 13 June 1835 leaving descendants.⁶⁹ Susannah was mentioned in the will of her Uncle John Miles on 16 June 1773.⁵²

The will of Silas Miles dated 11 July 1765, proved 12 Dec. 1766 leaves twelve slaves (by names) to his wife Elizabeth; to daur. Ann a slave, Chloe; to daur. Rachel a slave, Venus; to daur. Elizabeth a slave, Nipsey and to daur. Susanna a slave, Philis. Edward Griffith, Jonathan Drake and Elizabeth Miles qualified as executors.⁷⁰ Silas had received under his father's will 300

acres "where I live, after wife's death" and 500 acres on Wannels Creek, half of 1000 acre grant to Thomas on 7 July 1733; Silas and his brother John divided the property 3 May 1763.

The estate accounting of Executor Edward Griffith to 15 May 1772 totalling £19,132 includes £201 to George Mullins 9 June 1768 for his wife's 1/5 share of household furniture, £525 to Job McPherson 15 May 1772 as guardian for the Misses Miles, £100 to James Parsons 10 May 1769 for legal advice, £200 15 Apr. 1767 for Silas' subscription to build St. Paul's Parish Church.⁷¹ On 14 Mar. 1767 the guardianship of Ann, Rachel, Elizabeth and Susannah Miles, minor children of Silas Miles, deceased, was granted to their Uncle Job McPherson.

Mrs. Elizabeth McPherson Miles, widow of Capt. Silas Miles, married (2) 17 March 1768 George Mullins of Stone.⁷²

John Miles (John William³), planter of St. Andrew's Parish, born 26 Nov. 1719,²⁸ baptized 28 Feb. 1720,²¹ died 11 Nov. 1772⁷³, married (1) 21 May 1745 Anne Butler, daur. of Thomas and Elizabeth (dau. of Thomas Elliott) Butler of Schieveling. Anne Butler Miles was buried 23 Apr. 1746,²⁷ leaving one child:

John Miles was a Representative of St. Andrew's Parish in the Assembly.⁸⁹
He received a negro slave under his father's will of 7 July 1752.²⁶

Anne Elliott, daug. of Thomas Elliott, m. (1) Jonathan Fitch, (2) Roger Saunders, (3) — Waight; in her will of 1748 she left 500 A in St. Paul's Parish to her granddaughter, Ann Fitch, one of the two only children, daughters and co-heirs of Jonathan Fitch, Jr. who died intestate, and also one of the grandchildren of Anne Elliott Fitch Saunders Waight, deceased, and a legatee in her will. Ann Fitch's sister, Isabella Fitch, died without issue. John and Anne Fitch Miles on 22 May 1771 sold to John Ainslie of St. George's, Dorchester the inheritance of Ann, a plantation of 500 A granted 14 Mar. 1705 to Capt. Jonathan Fitch in St. Paul's Parish; it had formerly been mortgaged to William and Joseph Miles.

John Miles was formally pardoned on 7 Sept. 1767 for burning the house of and whipping Anthony Diston at Cedar Creek.

John and Anne Miles were frequent customers of the cabinetmaker, Thomas Elfe, buying a "poplar bedstead", a "large dining table", 6 "mahogany chairs with hair bottoms", a "pair of three feet dining tables", a "small cedar coffin w/handles and J.
