## 1st Chapter

In a very early period in the settlement of the state of South Carolina came over Thomas and Mary his wife, they settled at the old plantation Poplar Spring in St. Paul's parish. They had six <sup>nine</sup> children, but we will trace two sons on this page, John and William. John married Miss Ladson and from them are descended the Jeremiah, Welles and Dickinsons. William married <sup>1743</sup> Miss McKewn, they had two sons - James - your forefather and Robert, my forefather. James married Miss Joanna Ganner, they had a son James who married twice, his first wife was a Miss <sup>Rachel</sup> Pordier, they had four children, a son James and a daughter Elizabeth. The second wife was Miss Eliza S. Miles. She never had a child. James, the son of the first marriage married Miss <sup>Sarah Bond</sup> Varley; the daughter Elizabeth, married Mr. John Gilbert; the generations were thus:

1st Thomas and Mary

2nd William and Miss Mc Kewn

3rd James and Joanna Ganner

4th James, Miss Pordier, Miss Miles

5th James and Miss Varley

6th Elizabeth and Mr. Gilbert

7th Miss Gilbert and Mr. Prentiss

8th Mrs. Prentiss and Mr. Bancroft

Now we will take my forefathers, Robert son of William and Miss McKean. Robert married Miss Elizabeth Smith, daughter of Brigdon Smith of North Carolina. They had four children to grow up,

Ann Cashaw (? this is unclear) "Aunt Garner"

Eliza Smith

William - never married

John Miles

Grandma

"Uncle Billy"

my grandfather

John married twice - first wife Miss Susan Braley.

They had five children named Robert (the Doctor)

Thomas Braley - my father

William - never married

Mary - never married

Smith and Miss Ryan

The second wife of John was the widow of Gardner.

They had seven children as follows: Henry Evans, Elizabeth, Susan, Silas Josephon & Keun, Septimus

and Charlotte. Generations three -

1st Thomas and Mary

2nd Wm and Miss McKean

3rd Robert and Miss Smith

4th John and Miss Braley and Mrs. Gardon (?)

5th Thomas and Miss Waring

6th E. Scott and Miss Boyle

{ Miss Miles and Mr. Jamison

So you see we had the same forefathers down to William and Miss McKean

## Chapter 2

Thomas and Mary his wife had six children - namely - John the forfater of Jeremiah Miles, Miles and Dickisons. William, who was our forfater, Silas the forfater of the Tunnoe (I can't read this) we think, Thomas married Miss <sup>① Ann Laddson</sup> <sup>② Martha McTeer</sup> McPherson and his daughter Elizabeth, married Mr. McPherson, who was General McPherson of the Revolutionary War. These two last were brother and sister marrying brother and sister. From Elizabeth Miles and Gen. McPherson come the Washingtons. The sixth child of Thomas and Mary is a daughter, Margaret, married to a <sup>① James Hartley</sup> <sup>② Robert</sup> Williams.

## Chapter 3

T. R.  
Mr. Bigdon Smith of N.C. had two daughters, Elizabeth and Ann Smith, his, Mr. Bigdon Smith had married Miss Ann Mashaw (?) and these two daughters are their children. One of them, Elizabeth marries my forfater Robert Miles, and is the mother of my grandfather and others. The other daughter marries Mr. Melcher Garner, and it was their son Harry Garner, who married his first cousin Ann Mashaw Miles ("Aunt Garner") so you see both of my grandfather's sisters married their first cousins; one on the father's side, and

one on the mothers. After poor father Bigdon Smith died, poor mother, his widow, married Mr. Evans, by whom she has a family, three sons, Henry, Lewis and Allen. Not one of these however had a child, so that in this way the name is extinct. But they had three daughters, Martha, Susan (Aunt Lucy) and Mary Ann. Martha and Susan never married, but Mary Ann married a Mr. Jacques, and they had three children, Richard and Thomas and a daughter who mamma thinks married a Mr. Goss. This you see makes the Jacques much nearer to us than I ever knew. But I remember how fond Grandma was of him. Tell Richard if he ever has another son he must call him Evans for they are the only descendants of that branch of the family, and the name should be united, as Miss Evans married Mr. Jacques. This grandmother Evans was the lady who dropped dead at the breakfast table at Poplar Spring. She was visiting her daughter Mrs. Robert Miles. Grandma said she was present when it occurred. She was like grandmother.

I think I have written a very graphic account and I have enjoyed it very much. What an old treasure Aunt Elizabeth was to be able to make out so much valuable record

from different families. If I had been older I would have appreciated her more.

1<sup>st</sup> generation Thomas and Mary his wife came from England. 2<sup>nd</sup> generation their son John married Miss <sup>Elizabeth</sup> Ladson. 3<sup>rd</sup> generation John intermarried with the widow <sup>Reagan</sup> Petty, who had been Miss McPherson 4<sup>th</sup> generation Jeremiah married Miss <sup>Ann Jackson Day</sup> Kessiah, the eldest daughter of Mr. William and Mrs. Elizabeth Day 5<sup>th</sup> generation John died single, Jeremiah was united to Miss Sarah <sup>Farr</sup> Free, the only daughter of Mr. Richard and Jane Farr Waring. He died leaving his two sons John Allen, and Jeremiah. Their mother then married Col. Benjamin Petty of St. Paul's Parish. Kessiah, only daughter of the 5<sup>th</sup> generation married Mr. Thomas Pickens of Pickens District S. C. was the mother of a large family, some of whom are Col. Sam Pickens of Charleston, Mr. Patrick Pickens and Dr. Pickens in the upper part of the state. The daughters are Mrs. Jeremiah Miles of Summersville, Mr. Waring of Charleston and Mrs. Dr. of Barnwell. The eldest daughter Eliza is single.

6<sup>th</sup> generation John Allan Miles was killed in the war in Virginia. He married Eliza Ladson with daughter of Mr. Thomas Webb of Charleston and left one child now Dr. John Allen Miles -

dwelt in the city of Charleston, lately married  
to Miss Fannie Butler of Columbia.

6th generation Germinal married his first  
cousin Anna Pickens. They have three children  
named John Allen, Jeremiah and Sam Pickens.  
These are all at the present time small children.

Mrs. Kesiah, the sister of the first Jeremiah  
Miles, was the wife of the Hon. Judge Dr. Lee.  
Their children formed the fifth generation and  
follows. Dr. William Lee married Miss Barber,  
Stephen married his cousin Caroline Lee, daughter  
of his uncle Mr. William Lee and his wife Miss  
Baker (?). They had a family of twelve children  
Thomas another son, whose wife was Mary  
Singleton, daughter of Mr. Benjamin Singleton.  
Singleton died in 1853. Isaac McPherson  
Miss Elizabeth Lee died in Alabama, U.S.  
Intermarried with a cousin in Alabama, U.S.  
daughter of Major Paul S. H. Lee, and after his death  
to one of Mrs. Francis Lee's daughters. He had two  
sons by his first wife Marion, and two daughters  
named Jane and Kesiah, and several children  
by his second wife, name not told. Dr. Lee  
Lawrence Lee married his first cousin Miss  
Sarah Dickinson. The 6th generation includes the  
many children of the above. Dr. William Lee's son  
John Lee, married Miss Elizabeth Miles, the

daughter of Mr. John Miles and his second wife  
(she died 1855 - he John Lee died 1865)  
The widow garden, originally Miss Bradford.  
She died leaving two young daughters, Annie  
married twice, & two brothers named Mc  
Swain (?) Henrietta married Mr. Turnel.  
We return to the 4th generation where we  
find Miss Rachel Miles (became Mrs. Francis  
Dickinson. Their son Jeremiah Dickinson first  
marries his first cousin Caroline Lee daughter  
of Mr. Stephen Shreve and his wife Miss  
Dickinson. The second wife of Jeremiah Dickinson  
was Miss Logan. The second wife died in  
Mobile in 1852 leaving their eldest son in  
Mobile and five younger children to their  
grandmother who brings them back to South  
Carolina. They are as follows: Susan dies single  
Sarah married Dr. L. Lee, Rachel is Mrs Green  
we so far take "3rd set" here we find Joseph  
and Allen dying without issue. Of the same we  
have Mary - m. Edward Drayton. Then in the 4th  
generation their son married Miss Drayton.  
In the 5th generation Edward Drayton Drayton  
who was first married to Miss Carroll and after  
her death to Maria Headley, the widow of Mr.  
Mangin. After Mr. Edward D. Drayton's death

she again marries a Mr. Fuller of Beaufort.  
In the 6th generation the children of Edward  
Perry and first wife Miss Carroll were Ann,  
Edward, Charles, and Mary. By second wife  
Mrs. Manger, one daughter Miss Anna Perry,  
who became Mrs. Thomas R. Waring of  
Charleston. Their children were Hayne Waring  
married Miss Dawson. Edward married Anne  
of Columbia.

We shall go back to the 2nd generation <sup>Thomas, Jr.</sup> Silas  
<sup>m. Elizabeth McTeer</sup> (son of the immigrants Thomas and Mary) left  
a daughter named Martha. She became Mrs. Edw.  
Griffith, afterwards Mrs. McNeil. Another  
daughter was Mrs. Tuxam. <sup>Silas, son Thomas + Mary Mills</sup> Thomas, 2nd  
generation son of the immigrants married  
Miss McPherson. His daughter married her  
cousin, Gen. McPherson. Another daughter,  
Rachel was Mrs. Coker (?) and still another  
daughter Mrs. Nathaniel Farr. Elizabeth, daughter  
of the immigrants was Mrs. I. MacPherson  
The 3rd gen was James F. McPherson. In the third  
generation, after the death of James' wife with  
Miss Joanna Gainer, their son was James in  
the fourth generation who was your great  
grandfather. Joanna married Robert Reid  
from whom came Robert Raymond Reid of

the 4th generation. He married a Miss McLaws. Another child of Joanna and Robert Reid was Sarah Hanson married to Mr. Wm Black. In the 5th generation Robert Raymond Reid's children are James and Robert, daughters Joanna married to Mr. Black and Flora to Mr. Dancy.
