My Dear Mr. Peebles,

It was a real pleasure to hear from anybody with Miles blood in his veins. The whole family meant so much to me.

You mention that Francis T. Miles and Jeanie Wardlaw Miles had but one child. They had four I cannot give you their dates. The oldest was Francis Turquand who died of diptheria at about five years of age.

Next came my husband, Louis (not Lewis) Wardlaw who was born in 1873 and died in 1944. The third child was Sarah Warley who died of a tubercular hip at about age thirteen. The fourth was Alice Patterson who lived to about the age of six.

Additional facts about Dr. Miles are; He was probably born on a plantation near Charleston (I think in Orange County). He taught at one time in the Medical College of Charleston. He moved to Baltimore after the Civil War. For the first year he had a position teaching in an unknown medical school at a salary of \$600 which equaled exactly the cost of renting their house. You can imagine the struggle. After one year he transfered to the University of Maryland to teach Anatomy there. In later years he became a neurologist.

My husband, Louis Wardlaw, was born in Baltimore om March 23, 1873. He went to school in Baltimore, and was graduated from Johns Hopkins in 1894, and from the Univ. of Md. medical school three years later. He realized that medicine was not for him, and he took a FnD in English at Johns Hopkins. After one year teaching German at the Gilman school, he came to Princeton and taught in the University for twelve years prior to the First World War. The rest you know. We were married in 1908 and had four children.

- I. Francis Turquand Miles born July 10, 1909. He married Carolyn Gale Hum in 1936 and had four children. He is an atomic Chemist at the Brookhaven National Laboratories on Long Island. His children are:
 - a. Leslie Hun Miles born 1937. She married S. Norton Jacobi in 1957 and has a boy and two girls.
 - b. Louis Wardlaw Miles II born in 1940, who married Dorothy Marvin in 1962 and has one daughter.

II. Sarah Bache Miles born December 1910. After graduating from Bryn Mawr College married Charles Poor Kindleberger in 1937. He is now teaching Economics at Massachusetts Institute Of Technology. Their children are:
