PIERRE, bapt. in London, Threadneedle Church, Dec. 6, 1685, the s/o Jean Melet (Melot) and his wife ELIZABETH LeCLER (LeClerc, etc.) fugitives from LaTremblade in 1682. Jean was the s/o David from LaRochele. David died in England in 1691. This information from Mrs. Lois K. Hall, 2664 Palais Road, Anaheim, California 92804. Note: I wonder if this Pierre is the same man as the following:

PIERRE MALLETT, from the book HUGUENOT EMIGRATION TO VIRGINIA BY R. A. Brock. At back of book, "List of Ye Refugees. Aug. 12, 1700, Communication from Gov. Francis Nicholson of Virginia to the British Lords of Trade, Concerning the Huguenot Settlement,.... ship MARY and ANN of London, George Haws, Commander...settled twenty miles above Falls of James River, commonly called Manikin Town.....PIERRE MALLETT....signed Virginia: James Town, July 31, 1700.

PIERRE MAILHET, from THE SOUTH CAROLINA HISTORICAL and GENEALOGICAL MAGAZINE, Volume XII, No. 3, July, 1911, page 151, "Abstracts from the Records of the Court of Ordinary of the Province of South Carolina, 1700-1714, by A. S. SALLEY, JR., page 151, Jan. 26, 1705-1706, PETER MAILHET, Marian Mailhet and Paul Torquet executed a bond to Governor Moore for Peter and Marian Mailhet's proper guardianship of Judith Marian Pepin, daughter of PAUL PEPIN, smith, late of Carolina, deceased, page 54).

PETER MELLET (SENIOR) lived St. Mark's Parish, Craven County, Will dated July 19, 1763, proved June 1764, see page 377, Will Book QQ 1760-1767. Issue Peter, Martha, Mary, Sarah who married 1st a Howze and then Daniel Brunson. Sarah had a daughter Anne Howze. From Mable G. Brandenburg, St. Matthews, South Carolina 29135.

PETER MELLET (JUNIOR), Will dated 1799, Claremont County, South Carolina, wife MARGARET Mellet, four children by his present wife: Richard, James, Margaret and Ann. Says in will that son JOHN MELLET and daughter Rebecka Barden have by deeds of gifts received their portions of his estate. Peter Mellet (Junior) says in Will: my sister Martha.

PETER MELLETTE, U.S. Census of 1820, in Sumter County, 1 male 16-26, 1 male under 10, 1 male 26-45, 1 female under 10, 1 female under 10, 1 female 26-45.

WILLIAM PAGE MOLETT, born 1787 (from his tombstone at Molett's Bend, near Orrville, Dallas County, Dallas County, Alabama) or 1791 (Census 1850, Dallas County, Alabama). He is supposed to have been born "near Beaufort, South Carolina", the son of "PETER MOLETT and his wife Miss _____ Page" from the book "Joy is the Banner" by Olive Floyd.

From "The Ulmer Family" compiled by Vreeland Y. Leonard, February 1951, copied by P. Ulmer Savage February 1966, and submitted to Mrs. Grant H. Molett by Miss Nettie Wheeler, Farmersville, Alabama 36737 in 1973:

ELIZABETH LeCLER

Pierre, son of Jean Melet (Melot) and his wife Elizabeth LeCler (LeClerc, etc.), baptized Threadneedle Church, London, Dec. 6, 1685. Jean Melet (Melot and his wife Elizabeth LeCler (LeClerc) were fugitives from La Tremblade in 1682. Jean was the s/o David from LaRochele. David died in England in 1691.

Elizabeth LeClerc states in New York in 1689 that her husband Jean Melot lost at sea. They had daughters

Martha, bapt. March 9, 1689, French Church, New York, and Elizabeth

Elizabeth LeClerc received assistance from the Church.

Elizabeth LeClair married Pierre Gaillard and they had a daughter Cleremond.

Vol. II, Page 123, gives Mr. Gaillard...From this we may conclude that Joachim Gaillard or Peter who married Elizabeth LeClair, widow, arrived in South Carolina ca 1687....In 1687 - 600 A. to Joachim Gaillard in James Town precinct...

Page 74 - He makes Pierre Gaillard (Liste des Francois et Swiss etc. page 25, No. 62) and his wife Elizabeth LeClair, widow of PETER MELET, ?

the ancestor of the existing family, while documentary evidence shows beyond dispute that Joachim Gaillard (Ibid page 26, No. 74) was the actual ancestor. This Peter, or Pierre Gaillard was probably the one who with a wife Madelaine was imported by Isaac Caillabeux in 1692. He was a blockmaker, and seems afterwards to have married Elizabeth LeClair, widow and to have had a daughter Cleremond born in South Carolina before 1695; this Pierre died ca 1705-1706 leaving a Will now missing; no descendants of his appear on such records as are now accessible.

Page 74 and 75: Joachim Gaillard the ancestor of the South Carolina family is entered in the above men, Liste des Francois et Swiss, which is taken from an old manuscript list of the French and Swiss Protestants who settled near Charles Town on the Santee River in the Orange Quarter, who desired Naturalization and was prepared 1695/6, first printed in 1868.

SNIPES

William Snipes of Ashley River, carpenter, made his Will 10 Feb. 1677. He leaves his son Thomas Snipes, 5000 lbs. weight of Muscovado sugar, when 21; mentions property in St. Michaels, Island of Barbadoes. Leaves his wife Margaret Snipes 5000 lbs. of Muscovado sugar, she to be executrix.

Probate Court Charleston, S.C. Book 1672-1692 Page 55.

Thomas Snipes, son of above William, died about 1709, leaving a will which is missing. He left certainly two children, Mary Snipes, who married first John Perriman, and second MOLETT.

The above from: Mrs. Gregorie Nowell, who was Asst. Secretary of the Huguenot Society of South Carolina in Charleston, S.C. when she sent this information to Mrs. Grant H. Molett Sept. 25, 1970.

From a letter of Olive Floyd, who wrote the book "Joy is the Banner", which is at Tulane University:

In 1725 Molette of St. Paul's Parish had a grant to part of Charles Town Neck between the Ashley and the Cooper Rivers. This Molette married MARY SNIPES, a grand-daughter of William Snipes and his wife Margaret, who had come from the Barbadoes to South Carolina before 1700. St. Paul's Parish, established in 1706, was suspended in 1819. Church was twenty miles from Charles City (another name for Charleston).

In 1779, he was Aide to Gen. Anthony Wayne; was Major in 1783 with Wayne; when in COLLETON COUNTY, S. C., he met Maj. Wm. Clay Snipes; m. 1st, Sarah Snipes, d. of Wm.
