

George Norton (b. 1613 d. May 1665) arrived in Barbados from England 2 May 1635 when 22 yrs. old. His will of 3 May 1665 showing him "of St. Michael's Parish, Barbados" was proved 12 May 1665, naming his "brother John Norton of Killingworth in ye County of Warwick Gentleman", his sisters Mary wife of Richard Bayly of Coleman St., London and Hannah wife of Edward Walker, his son John and daughters Mary Norton and Hannah Norton both under 16; his son

John Norton arrived S.C. 1670 from Barbados, married Sarah, dau. of Jonathan Fitch; his will was dated 30 Sept. 1705; 1.5 was c. 1645 + 1705 involved in the 1st recorded lawsuit (which he won) in S.C.; issue: 7 children:

Jonathan Norton

Planter of 596-acre plantation on St. Helena's Island.

(14 July 1705 - 28 Apr. 1774) m. 16 May 1732 Mary Ann Chaplin (22 July 1716 - 10 Jan. 1764, dau. of John Chaplin (born on Stone River, S.C. 1682, died on St. Helena's Is., S.C. 5 Jan. 1752, son of John and Ann Chaplin) and his wife, Phoebe hadson (1691-1764, widow of Caleb Toomer, dau. of John Ladson, member of Council 1691-98, died on John's Island 1 Sept. 1698, and his wife, Mary Stanyarne (1667 Barbados - 8 Dec. 1707, dau. of Thomas Stanyarne who arrived S.C. May 1675 from Barbados with his wife Mary (^{Wright} ~~Fitch~~), making his will which (dated 14 Apr. 1774 - will of Jonathan) was proved 14 Feb. 1683.) Vestryman of St. Helena's Parish 8 Apr. 1751; Overseer of the Poor for St. Helena's 25 Apr. 1762

Sarah and Susannah to whom their father left Colginse Point Plantation to be equally divided. Sarah Green eventually inherited all her father's estate and m. (1) a Tucker, m. (2) William Pope, Sr., their children's children inheriting all the Green plantations. William Pope, Sr. m. (2) 25 Jan. 1798 Sarah, dau. of Joseph + Catherine (Adams) Scott of Grasslawn Plantation; he m. de his will 18 March 1823, proved 9 July 1827; William Pope, Jr. m. 1 Oct. 1806 Ann Scott, younger sister of his father's second wife, and in 1852 bought 1000 non Cotton Hope plantation to which he moved.

4. Jane, b. 18 Sep. 1738, bap. at St. Helena's

5. Mary Ann, b. 21 Oct. 1740, bap. at St. Helena's 18 Jan. 1741

9. Elizabeth, b. 11 Dec. 1750, bap. St. Helena's 13 Jan. 1751, m. Rev. William Eastwick Graham, Rector of Prince William Parish 1785-98, Rector of St. Helena's Parish 1798-1800, b. England 1748, d. Beaufort 4 Oct. 1800; owned plantation on Hilton Head Is. adjoining nephew William Pope. No issue.

10. Dorothy Phoebe, b. 10 Nov. 1751, d. Mar. 1808, bap. by Rev. Peasley at St. Helena's 30 Mar. 1752, m. 1771 Dr. George Mosse (1742-17 Feb. 1808)

④ Jane, b. 27 Dec. 1783, bap. St. Helena's Ch., d. 23 May 1857 bur. Lawtonville, m. Tues. 16 June 1803 Savannah, Ga., Benjamin Themistocles D'Ion Lawton, planter of Lawtonville, St. Peter's Parish, S.C. (22 Dec. 1782 - Albany, Ga. 18 Apr. 1846); issue: 11 ch., including Charlotte Esther Lawton (2 Nov. 1813 - Glen Springs, S.C. 16 Aug. 1886 bur. Lawtonville) who m. 1830 Capt. Edward Harden ("Ned") Peebles (Pr. Wm. Par. 9 Oct. 1811 - Lawtonville 24 Nov. 1892, 5 ft. 4 in. tall, dark brown hair, brown eyes.)

⑤ Mary Ann, b. 11 May 1785, bap. at St. Helena's, m. at her father's home in Savannah 1803 Adam Fowler Brisbane; their son, Rev. Dr. William Henry Brisbane (Robertville 12 Oct. 1806 - Arena, Wis. 5 Apr. 1878) m. 28 May 1825 his 1st cousin, Anna, dau. of Deacon B. T. D. Lawton, became a Baptist minister, an abolitionist and Chm. of the U. S. Direct Tax Commission; their dau. Eliz. married her 1st cousin, Alexander Benjamin Lawton.

⑥ Martha, b. S.C. 5 Sept. 1789, m. 15 Nov. 1809 Col. Alexander James Lawton (Mulberry Grove Plantation, St. Peter's Par. 21 Nov. 1790 - 8 Apr. 1878); issue: 12 ch. including Gen. Alexander Robert Lawton, Commissary General of the Confederate States of America, b. 4 Nov. 1818.

⑦ Sarah Norton, b. S.C. 28 Feb. 1790 m. her 1st cousin, Robert Godfrey Norton of Robertville; their only son, Dr. Alexander R. Norton of Savannah was father of Dr. Robert Godfrey Norton of Savannah.

11. Martha, b. 20 Apr. 1757, bap. at St. Helena's 30 May 1757 by Rev. Jenkin Lewis, m. Pope; issue.
