The 1st case of litigation in the colony was that upon the petition of John Norton & Orignall Jackson against Mr. Maurice Mathews, Mr. Thomas Gray & Mr. Wm Owen. On 28 Aug 1671 it was ordered that the petitioners should appear before the Gov. & Council upon Sat. 9 Sep... it was decided that Mr. Norton & Orign. Jackson should have 16 pieces of cedar timber desired & one piece of cedar timber more claimed by the defendants.

Constitution of 10 May 1682 divided province into Berkeley (Barren south of Edisto)
Craven (north) Colleton (south of Stono)

2 Nov 1691 extended Berkeley to Edisto on south.
