Dear Dr. Peebles:

I have often seen reference to you in my pursuit of our Peebles family history. The latest was your letter of March 5, 1990 to the Peebles Family News.

As you urged in your letter I obtained many years ago a copy of the Anne Bradbury Peebles volume and in fact have used it to make the connection between Capt David Peebles, John Peebles of Beaufort, and the Allendale line of the Peebles from which I am descended. Enclosed is a copy of my efforts to trace this line. I wonder if you could add anything to this? From which line do you come and what does the E. H. stand for in your name?

It may interest you to know that I have reviewed many of the secondary sources on the Peebles of Virginia in our State Library and Archives and in the Virginia Historical Society. I have also located the site in Prince George County, VA which was once known as "Bonncord", the estate of Capt David Peebles. It is located but 2-3 miles south of the James River and Flowerdew Hundred, the current site of much parallel archeological activity and information.

Work there verifies that John Poythress, one time owner of Flowerdew Hundred, gained control of Bonnicond by marrying Christian Peebles, daughter of Capt. David on Dec. 18, 1688.

In successive generations, the Peebleses drifted south to other Virginia counties and then to NC and SC. Of course, I would like to know more about these first six generations, or about any of them for that matter.

But then you probably know all of this and more. I would be most grateful for anything you might have to share. And needless to say, I would be happy to share any of my discoveries.

One final thought — I plan to make a brief trip to Scotland next summer, spending a few days each at least in Peebles, Edinburgh and St. Andrews, all places which may hold secrets about Capt David Peebles and his children and other of our ancestors. Do you have any leads for me?
