Dear Dr. Davidson,

I have gone through all of Mother's papers. I am very sorry that I find nothing that I think will interest you. I found that Catherine McBride (father, Alexander McBride) married John Peeples in 1776 at McBride's Ford, S.C. They had 6 daughters and one son, Jesse. One of their daughters, Rebecca, 1794-post1868 married Burwell McBride 1787-1857. Their children were Clara married a Mr. Paul: Isabella married a Mr. Tweedy: another daughter married John W. Hill; and a son, William. I imagine that this is the William in whom you are interested. I know nothing about him.

My mother was descended from Levicey and my father from Jesse, both of whom are children of John and Catherine and so I am very interested in the McBrides from Catherine back.

I do have the names and dates of Catherine's children and will be glad to send them to you if you want them. If there is anything that you would like me to search for in the Georgia Historical Library here, I shall be happy to do it for I enjoy research.


