(ives, daughters, sons d.inf. omitted here, but I have 'em, and have deeds, wills, Bible records, etc., etc., and of course, traditions'.

Peebles, from Pelys, dwellers in tents, applied to a group of highly civilized refugees from disastrous inundations of the sea in Flanders, who before 1115 settled on the River Tweed, Southern Scotland, where now is Peebles, in Peeblesshire.

In the next centuries they spread into other southern counties, and were people of property and standing.

Capt. David Peebles, one of several hundred Royalist officers condemned to the block by Cromwell who escaped to Virginia, patented in July, 1650, 833 acres in what is now Prince George Co. He raised, bought, sold and shipped tobacco. After his death in 1657 suits incident to the business were handled by his widow until his son, William, b. 1635, Fife, Scotland, arrived in Virginia.

William Peebles' will (bks. destroyed, Ct. Ord. Bk remains) was proved June 3, 1695. In 1670 he patented 873 acres 10 miles south of Capt. David's grant, on headwaters of same creek. Known sons: William II, David, Henry. Henry had 6 daus., 1 son dy.

NE So far this William Peebles seems to be the only one who could have been the father of Lewis and Henry Peebles of Fairfield Co., S.C. Henry went Hall Co., Ga., Lewis Chester Co., SC then Henry Co. Ga. Their mother remarried a Morris and had 5 Morris sons, 2 or 3 of which went Henry Co. Ga. Tradition is their mother was Jane Darling. William could have died before 1790, at a distance. Administrations sometimes were as much as 4 or 5 yrs. after a death,

especially if the death was at a distance, as a soldier's might be. Henry Peeples, 1786-1854, had 7 sons, 4 of whom were judges, and prominent. Many dets Ga. Lewis, 5 sons, including a Jesse and a David, all of whom moved westward.

To All "The Peebles":

Just as old-fashioned folk used to say when they meant all of the name in their ken.

This is to inform you that the 5000 or so pages of abstracts of vital records gathered in Va., N.C., S.C., Ga., La., Miss., Tenn. and elsewhere, plus inf. from census, tax, etc., and that sent me by many of you, has been worked into charts which do connect back in the 1600s and 1700s to the immigrant. So many records were destroyed even I did not expect them to.

I express my deep gratitude for the information sent me by many of you, and make a sincere apology for my silence of the past few years. However, no one can keep up a correspondence with 30 or 40 people (especially when genealogical letters run to many pages - those I write, too!) earn a fair share of one's living and do the work incident to living, and at the same time get this preposterous compiling job done. So I just quit writing letters.

The object of this synopsis prospectus is to let those interested realize the scope of the work. Probably no more than two do so - if two! I have gathered all or most of the Peebles lines throughout the South, the old "Middle West", etc., descended from Capt. David Peebles, down into the early 1800s, and some to date. That is what will sell the book to the State Libraries, and others. Orders from members of a family line never yet paid for printing a book - or rarely so - even when printing was not so frightfully high. And books of this kind eventually sell out, then can be obtained only from the dealers in out-of-print books. I have kept in touch with people who sell steadily, and learned the procedures.

For instance, the book on the Epos family of Prince George Co., and vicinity, where the lines are not as well linked as - now at least - the Peebles lines are, can now be bought only from the out-of-print dealers.

I am not in position to finance the book alone, and will have to depend on orders from interested persons - plus advance financial aid - if the book is to be printed. And it deserves printing!

If it is not to be printed, I shall make 4 or 5 volumes of type-script and place in key libraries, keeping a copy for myself and family. That will be a much easier job than typing for printing!

Those who are able and wish to assist in financing printing should eventually get their money back - or most of it. That is, if I live. If I do not, who would take over is anybody's guess!

I hope now to hear from many of you, and to see those of you who may come to Washington. I get mail from post office box once a week, sometimes twice. So write me well in advance, or you may arrive before I get your letter. And the post office does not give out home addresses of box holders. I am in telephone book, however, but do not wish mail to come here because I do not feel settled. Might move any time. So if you do arrive without notice, phone me.
