William G. Peebles, 51, Greenville Editor, Dies

TAYLORS — William Godfrey Peebles, 51, assistant managing editor of the Greenville News, died early Monday at a motel in St. Augustine, Fla. after taking his daughter to a university there. Death was attributed to a heart condition.

Born in Savannah, Ga. he was a son of Mrs. Marie Godfrey Steidinger and the late Harold G. Peebles.

Mr. Peebles, whose career extended over several states in the South, was a regular columnist in the Saturday edition of the Greenville News-Piedmont. He joined the News in May 1974 as state editor and was named assistant managing editor 10 months later.

Prior to working for the News, Mr. Peebles worked at the Lexington, Ky. Herald Leader where he was a columnist and state capitol bureau chief. From 1950-72 he was with the Courier Journal in Louisville, Ky. as an associate editor and editorial writer. Previously he was a writer

for the Macon, Ga. News and The Associated Press in Charlotte, N.C. and Columbia.

The S.C. Press Association cited Mr. Peebles for outstanding editorials in 1950 while he edited the Hampton County Democrat. In 1956, he won the Sigma Delta Chi award for best reporting in Kentucky.

He was a World War II Coast Guard veteran, a member of the Society of Professional Journalists, Sigma Delta Chi and the Chi Psi Fraternity of Emory University. He was an Episcopalian.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Edith Rule Peebles of Taylors; his mother of Columbia; a son, William Rule Peebles of Louisville, Ky.; two daughters, Mrs. William Pickrell of Pensacola, Fla. and Miss Ann Lawton Peebles of the home; a sister, Mrs. Judith Hamre of Columbia; and two grandchildren.

Mr. Peebles, whose career extended over several states in the South, was a regular columnist in the Saturday edition of the Greenville News Piedmont.

Mr. Peebles and his wife Edith Rule Peebles were vacationing in Florida and also were enrolling their daughter in college.

Prior to working for the News, Mr. Peebles worked at The Lexington (Ky.) Herald Leader, where he was a columnist and state capitol bureau chief. From 1950-1972, he was with The Courier Journal in Louisville, Ky., as an associate editor and editorial writer. Previously, he was a writer for The Macon (Ga.) News and The Associated Press in Charlotte, N.C.
