

Hampton, S. C. March 21st 1922

My dear Mamma :

I have been to see Mr. Hiers relative to the Will of Aunt Carrie's and he stated that Uncle Joe had brought a Will of hers over to be recorded but that it was not probated therefore it was of no value, furthermore, Aunt Carrie had deeded her property to her three sons and the will was useless. There is no record at the Court House of her will. I happened to see some of Baynards papers there and found that the date of his death was March 1st 1920, and I remember Aunt Carrie died on March 3rd two years before, you will remember she died the March before you all moved to Beaufort the following January, so you can tell by that.

We are having lots of Flu around here, Mrs. Rivers has been quite ill for over a week and Mr. Rivers is taking it now and that means at least 6 weeks spell with him. I dread it. Mike Rivers whole crowd are still down with it.

I sent Estell some preserves and jelly and pears etc. yesterday to help her out in her little housekeeping, hope they will get to her in good order.

Ma tell me the size corset you want and I will go to Varnville and select what you want and send them to you, but I dont know your waist measure. Tis real cold here this morning and I have a bunch of work to do. I hope you all will keep well.

Bob will be away for another week so he wrote me this morning I certainly do miss him.
