INSTRUCTIONS.

1. This schedule is given out in duplicate in order that, after filling out both copies, one may be added to the family archives of the person filling them out and the second may be returned to the Eugenics Record Office, which is by this method building up a good index of the natural traits of the better American families. Preserve carefully your copy of the schedule and enter new data on it from time to time.
2. In filling out this schedule decide first on your own place in the pedigree—father, mother, child, or the like, depending upon which place will give you the greatest number of connections. Make entry for yourself and then assign the other members of the family to their appropriate places. E. g., if you are a father of grown children enter yourself as "Father" and your wife as "Mother."
3. It is important to bear in mind that this record will be much more accurate and complete if consultation be had with the oldest living members of the family.
4. It is especially suggested that, after filling out this schedule, the person making the study interest other branches of his family in making similar records, in order that they may be articulated into a scientific genealogy—a record of natural inheritance within the pedigree.
5. On request to the Eugenics Record Office additional pairs of this schedule will be sent free to other branches of the family, or to friends and associates similarly interested in adding such records to their own family archives and in filing duplicate copies with the Eugenics Record Office.
6. The data contained in these schedules will be used in the study of human heredity. It is expressly pledged that all information thus received will be held as confidential, and no names will be published.
7. All schedules received will be given a secure filing place where they will be permanently available for reference by members of the families described.
8. In case this blank schedule is lost, accidentally destroyed, or spoiled while being filled out, the Eugenics Record Office will, upon request, be glad to supply as many fresh copies as the particular collaborator may need.
9. It is expected that 10 years later you will be asked to bring record down to date. Please notify this Office of changes of address.

Note: Persons who have successfully filled out this schedule, and would like to expend the additional time and effort necessary to work out a more extensive analysis, are invited to correspond with the Eugenics Record Office in reference to the more detailed schedule "Family Distribution of Personal Traits." This latter is an indefinitely expandable, loose leaf system, each unit (Individual Analysis Card) of which provides for the personal history and a certain amount of analytical data concerning the mental, temperamental, and physical qualities of each member of the family tree. The aim of this schedule is to provide for a record of the usual genealogical type, with names, dates, and connections, and in addition a scientific record of natural inheritance such as will enable a student of heredity to evaluate the hereditary potentialities of a given member of the pedigree in a particular mating.

Extending Family Trees. Records will be sent to the above addresses in order to extend the family net-work, and thus make it more valuable to science and humanity.

INDIVIDUAL ANALYSIS CARD

- NOTE:—1. These Cards are intended to accompany the *Pedigree Chart*—one card for each member of the family tree.
2. If the study is to be of value, all statements—concerning both “good” and “bad” traits—must be frank and fair.
3. In items numbers 19, 20, 21, 22, 32, 33, 39, 41, 43, 44, 46, 48, 51, 52, 56, 57, 58 and 59 grading by underscoring is called for. In these cases use the following system: *Underscore* with one, two or three lines according as the ability, the predilection, or the possession, as the case may be, is average, is somewhat above medium, or, is extremely high (such as is possessed by one person in 1,000): *Strike out* with one or two lines according to whether the grade for the special ability, the aversion, or the lack, as the case may be, is somewhat below medium, or is strikingly low. Absence of underscoring or striking out implies no consideration of the trait in the person.
