only child was Betty Irene Wyman, B. 26 August 192 ; she mar-  
ried 12 April 1947 Ashley Edward Owen in Savannah, Ga.

His eldest son, Thomas<sup>7</sup>, seems to be the Thomas who on Jan. 15, 1817, bought from Charity Creel 100 a. in Barnwell Co., adj. John Washington and others. Deeds in Barnwell have not been completely checked to find when he sold there.

John A.<sup>7</sup>, 1792-1841, 2nd son of Josiah<sup>6</sup>, m. c. 1830 to Ellen<sup>4144</sup>, b. 1811, and had 3 ch.: Eliza<sup>4144</sup>, b. 1837, John A.<sup>4144</sup>, 1839, Susan<sup>4144</sup>, 1841. Ellen m. 2nd as his 1st wife Wm. Joyner Peeples, but had no ch.

Henry<sup>7</sup>, 3rd son, was in Beaufort 1820-40 incl. He m. c. 1818, wife's name unk. He owned land, as shown by an 1832 pat. to his bro. Alfred, adj. "Mr. H. Peeples". He had 2 daus., names unk., and 2 sons, Abraham<sup>8</sup> and Wm. Joyner<sup>8</sup>.

Abraham<sup>8</sup>, 1824-1861, was killed in battle at Swift Creek. He had m. c. 1855 Eliza E. Tuten, b. 1827. Ch.: Emily E., b. 1856; Wm. Preston, 1857; Wm. Henry, 1858; Mary A., 1859; and Duncan, 1861. Wm. Preston<sup>9</sup>, m. Annie Taylor, 1855-1926, and had son Charles Cornelius<sup>10</sup>, whose son Wm. Rodell<sup>11</sup>, m. his cousin, Lillian Peeples, who has been active in gathering family data. They had a son, Howard. No inf. on dscts. other ch. of Abraham<sup>8</sup>. Eliza E., his widow, m. 2nd as his 3rd wife, William Joyner Peeples, Abraham's bro., no ch.

William Joyner<sup>8</sup>, 1828-1893, 2nd son of Henry<sup>7</sup>, m. 1st to Ellen, widow of his uncle, John A. They had no ch. He m. 2nd to Nancy Altman Tuten, widow, mother of Elizabeth E. Tuten (his 3rd wife). He m. 4th c. 1871 Laura L. Tuten, 1853-1900, dau. of Felix Tuten and Tabitha Peeples, 5 ch.: John A.<sup>9</sup>, 8; Thos. M.<sup>9</sup>, 6; Tabitha, 4; Walter McNeil<sup>9</sup>, 2; Kimmie, 6/12, in 1880. They had 7 ch. b. later, 12 in all. Walter McNeil<sup>9</sup>, m. Julia Wynne, and had dau. Lillian, who m. Wm. Rodell<sup>11</sup>. (Above) William Joyner (Sabe) Peeples (5 Apr 1833-16 July 1966) had son Hagood of Varnville and a brother Wm. Peeples of Varnville; left 9 grandchildren and 23 great grandchildren.

Wiley<sup>7</sup>, Josiah's 4th son, was b. 10 June, 1797, at Cedar Grove, Hampton Co., d. 1890, age 93. He m. c. 1820 as her 3rd husband Nancy Ann (Peeples, Reid Speaks), dau. of John<sup>6</sup> Peeples, Sr. They had 2 ch.: Alexander McBride<sup>8</sup> Peeples, June 28, 1821--Jan. 16, 1894, and Eliza R., Mar. 28, 1822--Sept. 5, 1908.

Alexander McBride<sup>8</sup> Peeples m. 1st c. 1842, Rosella Catherine Goethe, Aug. 1828--11 Feb., 1867, 3 sons, 5 daus.: Alex. McB.<sup>9</sup>, Jr., b. 1843, d. inf.; Rev. Edwin Wiley<sup>9</sup>, b. 1845, Sgt. Co. B., Kirk's Squadron, surrendered Durham Sta., N.C.; Julia Eliza, b. 1847; Mary W., b. 1849; Rosa., b. 1851, never m.; Ida E., b. 1853; Ada C., b. 1855; Henry A.<sup>9</sup>, b. 1855, moved to Tampa, Fla., became a Judge, m. twice and left many dscts. Alexander McBride<sup>8</sup>, C.S.A., was wounded at the Battle of Pocatigo; later he became Treas., of Beaufort Co., retiring in 1883. He was the founder of Varnville, S.C.

He m. 2nd in 1867 Caroline Julia Murrell of Charleston, dau. of Walter Murrell who was killed in Conf. army. They had 5 sons, 3 daus.: Alex. McB. Jr., b. 1868, m. Elizabeth Kalb, who as widow lived with dau. Elizabeth in Washington, D.C.; Eugene Murrell<sup>9</sup>, b. 1871, m. Emma Johns of Colleton Co., dau. of Jasper I. and Rebecca (Folk) Johns: 1 dau., Aline, and 2 sons, Eugene M.<sup>10</sup>, Jr., and Earl F.<sup>10</sup>. Theodore A.<sup>9</sup>, 1873--1948, m. Susie M. Robertson, had 7 sons, 3 daus.: Fleetwood<sup>10</sup>, Theodore A.<sup>10</sup>, Jr., Alix<sup>10</sup>, Carl<sup>10</sup>, Murphey<sup>10</sup>, Edgar<sup>10</sup> and Robert<sup>10</sup>; Bessie, m. Deloach, Carrie, m. Granger, and Sadie m.
