To all whom these presents may concern, I Josiah Powell Lawton of Beaufort District send greeting:  
Whereas I the said Josiah Powell Lawton by my certain promise all and well and bound unto the said John W. Anderson's Sons \$60. for all advances made or  
to be made during the year Eighteen hundred and  
Sixty Six to my son Wallace Lawton.

I now show all men that the said Josiah Powell Lawton in consideration of the above obligation  
and for the better securing the payment thereof to  
John W. Anderson's Sons \$60 and also in considera-  
tion of the sum of three dollars to me the said  
Josiah Powell Lawton in hand well & truly paid  
by the said John W. Anderson's Sons \$60 the receipt  
whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, ban-  
gained sold & released and by these presents do  
grant bargain sell & release unto the said John  
W. Anderson's Sons \$60. all my interest which  
interest is one half of all that plantation  
or tract of land situated lying & being in the  
District & State aforesaid called the "Trowell Plan-  
tation" and bounded as follows. - North by  
lands of Estate of Ephraim Baynard & A R Stokes  
East by lands of A R Stokes & Est of Wm Birtw &  
Tho Willingham, On West by a Canal separ-  
ating it from lands belonging to Thos Willingham  
and South by lands of Edward S. Peoples, and con-  
taining two thous and acres more or less.  
Together with all & singular the rights

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members hereditaments and appurtenances to the  
said one half interest belonging or in any wise  
incident or appertaining, to have & to hold all  
singular the said Premises unto the said John  
W Anderson's Sons & Co their heirs or assigns for  
ever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs, Ex-  
ecutors or administrators to warrant & forever  
defend all & singular the said premises unto  
the said John W Anderson's Sons & Co their heirs  
& assigns from and against me and my heirs, Ex-  
ecutors, Administrators and assigns and from all  
persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to  
claim the same or any part thereof of my my  
half interest - Provided always nevertheless  
and it is the true intent & meaning of the parties  
to these presents that if the said Josiah Lawton  
Lawton do & shall well & truly pay or cause to be  
paid unto the said John W Anderson's Son & Co  
their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns  
the said advances; then this deed of bargain  
& sale shall cease determine & be utterly void  
otherwise it shall remain in full force & virtue,  
And it is agreed upon by the said parties that  
the said Josiah Lawton shall hold &  
enjoy the said Premises until default of payment  
shall be made. Witness my hand & seal the the  
tenth day of June in the year of our Lord One  
thousand Eight hundred & sixty seven and  
in the nine first year of the Sovereignty &  
Independence of the United States of America,
