#### DAR HISTORY AWARD MEDAL

#### \* ALLOW AT LEAST FOUR MONTHS TO PROCESS ALL APPLICATIONS FOR DAR HISTORY AWARD MEDALS \*

#### PURPOSE OF THE AWARD:

The DAR History Award Medal is given to a nominee whose study and/or promotion of some aspect of American history, on the local, regional, or national level, has significantly advanced the understanding of our nation's past. Nominees <u>must</u> demonstrate significant contributions to the study and/or promotion of American history <u>outside</u>, <u>above and beyond</u> that which is required for <u>any</u> paid employment in order to be eligible for this award. Persons eligible for this DAR award include archivists, manuscript curators, or professional staff members of archives, historical societies, libraries, museums, or other organizations focusing on history; college professors, writers/editors of significant historical publications, historical researchers, and persons involved with preservation efforts of historical buildings, artifacts, or records. Persons whose primary work is in the field of genealogy are **not** generally eligible for the award unless they also have made significant <u>history-related</u> contributions to the study of American history. Since the History Award Medal requirements stipulate that work that is either multi-disciplinary or is completed in other disciplines, such as genealogy, museum studies, anthropology, or political science, **cannot** form the principal basis for the History Award Medal nomination, it is recommended that a different DAR honor be pursued for persons whose primary work is outside the field of history. Secondary level educators (grades 6-12) should be honored through participation in the NSDAR Outstanding Teacher of American History Contest. Members of the NSDAR are eligible for this award; however, they must meet the same rigorous requirements as non-NSDAR nominees. The DAR History Award Medal's purpose is to honor the contributions of just one person, rather than a team. NOTE: The award is not presented to more than one person involved with a specific historical project.

#### THE NOMINATION:

Complete the application form and include it with the required materials. An application form and the explanation of the materials that should be submitted in support of a candidate appear on the reverse side of this form. A nomination may be submitted by a DAR chapter or state society, and must be signed by the Chapter Regent, State Historian, or other DAR official designated by the nominating body as its contact person. The letter of nomination must state that the chapter or state society guarantees payment for the DAR History Award Medal. The nominating chapter shall <u>not</u> advise the nominee that he/she is being considered for this particular DAR award. For no reason may the nominee contact, at any time, the Historian General or her staff concerning any aspect of the nomination.

#### CRITERIA BY WHICH NOMINATIONS ARE JUDGED

Each nomination is judged only on the accomplishments of the nominee in relation to the criteria listed above. Nominations are not compared or contrasted with other nominations. In addition to the requirement that a substantial portion of the nominee's contribution to American history must have been made during the last <u>five</u> years, the following criteria are used in evaluating a nomination for the medal:

(1) Originality and significance of the nominee's contribution to the understanding and/or promotion of American history;

(2) The magnitude of the impact of the work of the nominee; and

(3) The positive recognition of the nominee's work by a majority of those knowledgeable in the field.

Dear Ms. Hanahan:

With a life long interest in and passion for the study of history, it was natural that I should encounter the Rev. Dr. Robert E. H. Peeples upon first coming to Hilton Head Island in the 1980's. Following my retirement in 1994 from Rockwell International Corporation as a financial officer and subsequent move to Hilton Head Island in 1994 I have devoted much of my time to the study of history and genealogy. I have worked closely Dr. Peeples over the last 14 years. In my various capacities as President of the Hilton Head Island Genealogical Society; Life Member and Treasurer of the Hilton Head Island Historical Society; and Founding Member, Senior Librarian and currently Vice President & Treasurer of the Heritage Library Foundation, Inc. I have found Robert's knowledge and enthusiasm to been invaluable.

Robert Peeples was one of a handful of people instrumental in the formation of The Heritage Library, a not-for-profit history and genealogy research library here on Hilton Head Island. When the idea of having a room dedicated to local island and Lowcountry history and genealogy contained within the Hilton Head Branch of the Beaufort County Public Library was rejected by county library officials it was determined to create an independent facility to serve local historians and genealogists. We, therefore, began the planning process for forming a private not-for-profit Foundation and named it, The Heritage Library. Robert Peeples was a founding member and life member, a member of the original steering committee and has served on the Board of Directors since the inception of the Library. In the nearly four years of its existence The Heritage Library has grown from the germ of an idea to a well known and highly regarded "state of the art" research center do in no small part to the efforts of Robert Peeples.

Dr. Peeples has served the local historical community in many other ways such as serving as Founder and President of the local Historical Society for the past 32 years. In this capacity he is constantly engaged in the protection and preservation of the history of the Carolina Lowcountry and the Sea Islands. He has served as President of First Families of South Carolina and Sons of the American Revolution. In addition he has served on the boards of many historical societies such as Chatham County, Georgia Artillery, South Carolina Huguenot Society, Heritage Library, and Descendants of Colonial Clergy.

South State

Since moving to Hilton Head Island in 1952, Dr. Peeples has worked religiously gathering data on Island and Lowcountry history. He is an accomplished author. Some of his works with which I am familiar include:

- (1) A View of Thomas Heyward—Thomas Heyward was local planter and patriot who became a signer of the Declaration of Independence. In addition to writing about our local patriot Dr. Peeples leads a group each Fourth of July to the Tomb of Thomas Heyward. Groups participating in this event include two chapters of the DAR, Thomas Heyward and Captain William Hilton, Dr. George S. Mosse Chapter SAR, The Hilton Head Island Historical Society, The Bluffton Historical Society, the Children of the American Revolution and the Beaufort Historical Society as well as local citizens interested in attending this prestigious event.
- (2) Dr. Peeples has documented Island history and points of historical significance in his papers, "A History of the Northwest Corner of Hilton Head Island"; "The Dynastic Families of Hilton Head Island"; "Dr. George Mosse, Militia Surgeon"; "Mongin Bluff, Now Spanish Wells, Owned by Patriot John David Mongin". These and other papers have been presented to such groups as the local Chamber of Commerce, DAR, SAR, SCSAR, Colonial Dames, Lion's Club, Island Women's Club, Historical Societies of Hilton Head Island and Bluffton, South Carolina, South Carolina Huguenot Society and many more too numerous to mention.

As a native South Carolinian, Dr. Robert Peeples has carved out a niche of South Carolina Lowcountry history that cannot be equaled. Recording local history since 1952, when he and his wife, Cora McKenzie Peeples first moved to Hilton Head Island, Dr. Peeples provides newcomers and transplant Yankees, such as myself, the opportunity to learn, read and meditate on the historical significance of our Island home. Both Robert and Cora are constantly vigilant to the need to preserve and protect the historic heritage of the nation as it is reflected in the lives of present day South Carolinians. Equally important has been their zeal for communicating their knowledge to the present and future generations of our Island's residents and to visitors from around the world.

Rev. Dr. Robert E.H. Peeples, noted low country historian and author was born in Estill, SC 1918. He received his bachelor's degree in Economics from the College of Charleston in 1938. From there he went to Augusta, GA and worked for the Citizens Southern National Bank. In 1948 he married Miss Cora McKenzie After graduating Virginia Theological Seminary in Alexandria, he was ordained an Episcopal priest in Augusta GA on Palm Sunday of 1949.. Drafted into World War II, he served as Sergeant in such exotic locations as India, Pakistan and Australia. He served as priest for Christ Church in Cordele, GA, St. Paul's Church in Jesup, GA and Trinity Church in Statesboro, GA and in St. Mary's, GA at Christ Church. In 1953 he and Miss Cora moved to Hilton Head Island where they purchased the 10<sup>th</sup> house built on the island. He is the author of Tales of Antebellum Hilton Head Island Families and Miles Family Genealogy, along with numerous articles in South Carolina Huguenot Society's periodical Transactions. Dr. Peeples has been president of the Hilton Head Island Historical Society since 1970, and was president of the First Families of South Carolina 1987-1991; Chaplain of the Chatham County, GA Artillery and State Chaplain of the Sons of the American Revolution: and member of Magna Carta Barons, Descendants of Colonial Governors. It is written in a well-thought, easy to read manner. This publication provides the reader a wealth of information in a small package.

To say the very lest, Dr. Peeples has a brilliant memory and often delivers presentations such as his, "Religious Currents During the Confederate Era", and "Proprietary Land Grants in Granville County –Beaufort District" directly from memory without benefit of notes or other documentation. He is an engaging, gifted, and to great credit, at times comedic presenter.

Dr. Peeples has over the many years he has faithfully served here, spearheaded numerous historical endeavors locally, to name but a few:

- 1. Erecting historical markers for Revolutionary and Civil War sites;
- 2. Establishing the annual pilgrimage to the Tomb of Thomas Heyward, signer of the Declaration of Independence and local hero;
- 3. Obtaining, the Zion Chapel of Ease Revolutionary Cemetery, and overseeing its annual maintenance
- 4. Personally researching and documenting the history of each Plantation located on Hilton Head Island and in the Bluffton area as well.

It is rightly said that for the last nearly 50 years, Dr. Peeples has devoted his time and talent to God, the church and our country. Without his vast considerable knowledge, investigation and documentation of the lives and events of local heroes and citizens, current residents and historians would spend countless hours researching on their own time for precious clues to our past. In a mere half hour conversation with the good Doctor, a researcher, can save at

least a month's worth of research in the archives. He knows of what he speaks, and can lay his hands on the documents, while talking to you. He not only can site and find documents and facts, but he has the gift to bring them alive. He can set the context correctly to every historical event I have ever present him with. He is a rare find in himself, and a living cornucopia of knowledge, whose fruits are freely enjoyed by one and all.

I do most heartily, and highly recommend him to you, and hope that you will consider post haste, The Rev'd Dr. Robert E. H. Peeples as a most worthwhile candidate for the DAR History Award Medal, an award I believe that the good doctor should have been awarded twenty years ago.
