MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF MANAGERS OF THE SONS OF THE REVOLUTION IN THE STATE OF GEORGIA, 30 September 1987

The meeting was called to order by President Thomas Coffey at 1730 hours. Past President Donald Naismith gave the Invocation. Present were Thomas Coffey, Lindsey Henderson, Ben Jones, Ralph Kelley, Albert Lufburrow, A. Patterson Little, Archie Morris, Donald Naismith, Thomas Spillane and William Travis.

In as much as each member of the Society had received a copy of the minutes of the previous meeting, the minutes were accepted as mailed.

The Treasurer reported that the General Fund had \$19,307.00, the Twiggs Memorial Fund had \$7,429.00 and that all bills had been paid.

Under old business, Chairman Archie Morris reported that all arrangements for the picnic on 18 October had been completed. He asked for a few volunteers to help on the last minute work; Coffey, Henderson, Kelley and Travis offered their talents.

The Georgia Society representative to the Birmingham Meeting of the Board of Managers of the General Society will be Archie Morris. He will bring up the subject of the high cost of medals and awards for officers and members.

Lindsey Henderson reported that arrangements for the 19 October Victory Day celebration are complete. The U.S. Army Band will play; the speaker will be B/G Michael Hendricks. All patriotic organizations will be invited to attend.

Lindsey Henderson also reported on the Junior ROTC awards for the year. Benedictine, Jenkins and Johnson units were recognized this year. Full participation by all schools will be the target for 1988, Henderson said.

President Coffey reported that Robert Arnold of Atlanta is active in the preparations for a chapter of the Society to be formed in the Atlanta area. His address is in the Roster; please contact him if you are interested, if you have not already done so.

President Coffey appointed a nominating committee for officers in 1988. The Chairman is Savage Lynah, Sr. with Archie Morris, George Fawcett and Donald Naismith.

The Registrar presented four completed applications for consideration: George Austin Blood, Clinton Ward Effinger, Robert James Quinn of Savannah and Thomas Wayne McCormack of Dunwoody, Georgia. All were voted into membership by the Board. President Coffey will write a letter welcoming them to the Society. Two proposals were read and given tentative approval, pending completion of a formal application.

First Vice President Pat Little is working on a system for the processing of new applications to define responsibilities and procedures. This will insure that all applications will be properly and promptly processed.

The Annual Banquet will be held at the Plantation Club, Skidaway Island on 26 February 1988. Jack Kingston will be overall chairman, Pat Little will produce the program booklet and the secretary, with help from Ben Jones and Albert Lufburrow, will handle seating arrangements. The President has nearly completed the speakers slate. No limits will be placed on the number of guests invited by members.

A study of possible, worthy projects for the Society to develop is being made by Mel Dunn, to be reported on later.

The Twiggs Memorial Cemetery is in excellent condition. A second, smaller plot in the churchyard is also being well tended. Another effort will be made to find a suitable organization in Augusta to take on this responsibility.

The Treasurer was directed to procure the necessary medals and awards for the Banquet in February.

A letter from the General Society urged members to make a contribution to the Faunces Tavern Museum in this BiCentennial Year. The sum suggested was \$200.00 for each member to give as a personal donation. The Board authorized a gift of %500.00 towards this fund.

The meeting adjourned at 1845 hours.
