

BERRIEN PEEPLES, GEORGE ANSON 1820-1890

George Anson Peeples was born in South Carolina, May 1, 1820, a son of Henry Peeples (Vol.III). He came with his parents to Hall County, Ga., in 1825, and taught school for some years in various counties in North Georgia. In 1850 he was living in Murray County up on the Tennessee line, where he was teaching school. His wife, Martha A. Willis, was born Mariack in that part of the state in 1826. They had eleven children:

Soon after the creation of Berrien County in 1856 Mr. Peeples moved there, his parents and others of the family having already moved there several years before. He located at Milltown (now called Lakeland) where he first taught school, then farmed, then engaged in mercantile business awhile. Between 1874 and 1877 Mr. Peeples and family moved to Polk County, Fla., and settled on Whiddon's Creek between Bowling Green and Fort Meade, where he farmed, grew citrus fruits and cattle, and lived until his death Aug. 10, 1890.
