Will of Jacob Phillipps : Original Hampton Co. poor condition

State of South Carolina } In the name of God Amen.
Hampton County } I Jacob Phillipps Farmer
in St Peter's Parish in the above named county
and State being advanced in life and feeling
that my bodily strength is growing less, but
thanks be to God, being of sound mind, memory
and understanding; do hereby make the following
distribution of my earthly estate as my last
will and Testament revoking all others
previously made and executed by me; and
do nominate constitute and appoint my Son
Preston Phillipps and my friend and neighbor
George H. Smith executors of the Same. Having
already provided for my Sons by deeds executed
by me to them, their Wives, and their Children
(that is my Sons Children) I now direct,
that after paying my funeral expenses and
lawful debts, then be paid to my Daughters
Mrs. Emily Cook, wife of Harford Cook and
Mary Smith wife of Sam'l Smith the Sum
of five Five Dollars each as their portions in
full of my Estate. To my beloved wife Mary
Phillipps I will all my plantation and tract
of land whereon I now reside containing one
Hundred and Seventy acres more or less; together
with all my farming implements Cattle,
Hogs, Sheep Horses mules (?) Household
and Kitchen Furniture provisions on Land,
growing crops, moneys, credits owned by me
at the time of my death, said tract of land
Bounded on South by lands deeded by me to my
Son Preston Phillipps, on North by John Cuming
east by lands of Mrs. Henrietta Phillipps west
by my Son Jesse Phillipps containing as

of said One hundred and twenty acres more
 or less. according to a survey made by
 Felix W. Tutten and plot ~~made~~ ^{dated} the 15th
 November A.D. 1869 made by him, with all
 the rights (illisible) and appurtenances
 thereto belonging for her use and benefit
 during her natural life and widowhood that
 is to pay all her interest in and claims to
 the said Estate real and personal shall cease
 and terminate at her death, or as soon as
 she shall marry, and all the property hereby
 willed to my beloved wife Mary Phillipps
 shall then become the property of my daughter
 Jane Cornelia Phillipps if alive, and if
 she shall die before the death of my wife
 Mary Phillipps then the said property
 shall be equally divided between my
 sons Preston Jacob Brantley and Jessie
 Phillipps for them illisible their Heirs.
