John Platts' epitaph in the Brant Cemetery (Jenny/Rivers Bridge State Park area, Allendale Co. reads: "His pilgrimage was 71 years, 2 months & 23 days. He was the father of 10 children & grandfather of 24, a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, worshipped at St. Nicholas' Church, Barnwell District, S.C."

Susannah (mole) Platts "departed this life 25 April 1844, age 52 years, 7 months & 29 days. She lived a married life of 33 years & 18 days, was the mother of 3 sons & 6 <sup>(5 or 6)</sup> daughters & grandmother of 16 children."

Christina Elizabeth Platts; "mother of 2 children & grandmother of 15. A member of the Evangelical Lutheran Church and worshipped at St. Nicholas Church, Barnwell County, S.C."

In 1816 John Platts attested that all the executors of his father's 1799 were deceased and applied for letters of administration.
