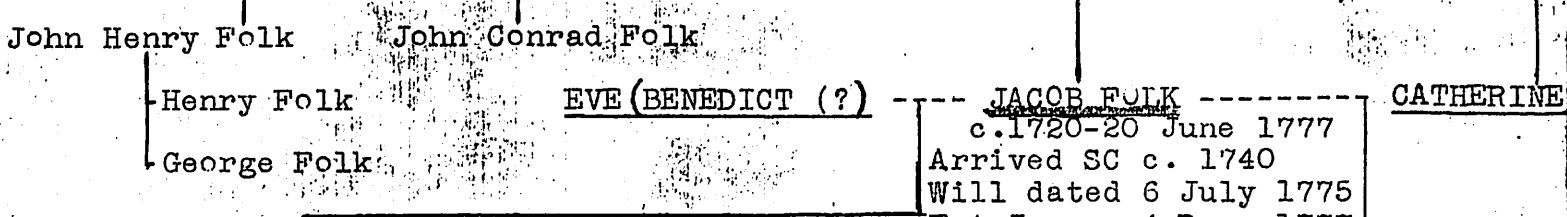

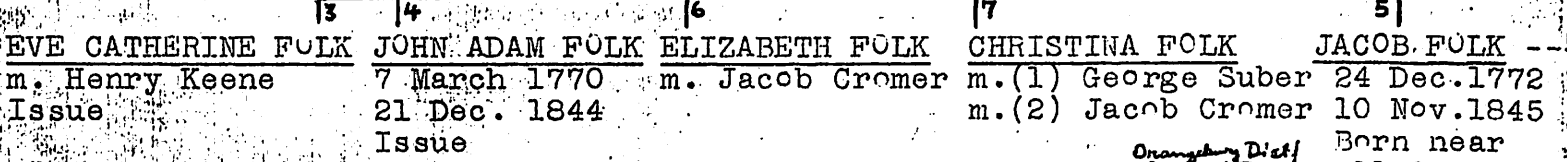

Dear Dr. Peeples,

It was nice to talk to you the other day and find you were still active after all of these years. Per our discussion, I am enclosing information on the early Moles.

1. A copy of the ship Anne information indicating the possibility of a George Maul, as well as John and Henry Maul.
2. A copy of the information from the Coller History of Orangeburgh, listing Jacob Mole as a 1798 road commissioner.
3. A chart with three pages of notes, trying to make some sense of the early Mole census records.
4. Two copies of internet pages concerning Moles (and in one case, Varus).
5. A copy of a Viren Varu Tyree talk indicating that Mary Magdalene Varu's mother's maiden name was Rickenbaker before ~~shortening~~ shortening to Baker. I know you are less interested in the Varu's than you were when we talked twenty-eight years ago, but thought you may be interested.

I would appreciate any information you have that would help explain the early Mole history, including the Copes. As you can see from the My Lowcountry Families pedigree chart, they say Mary Cope's father was Jacob^{and} was born only five years before her husband (and the year given elsewhere for Mary's birth).

I am also looking for information on the Sauls and Green connections to the Mole family. John Jacob Mole's wife was named Sara Ann. She is buried in the Gillisonville Baptist Church cemetery in a plot with her daughter Ursula Mole Horvey's family. Several internet sources give her name as Sarah Ann "Annie" Sauls but my father's notes give her name as Sara(b) Ann Green, a sister to Mary Green who married to Theophilus Sauls, Jr. (A second marriage, his first marriage was to Susannah [Susan per internet] Mole, John Jacob's sister and your Susannah's niece.) Sara(b) and Mary's children Augustus James Mole and Sara Jane Sauls were my great grand parents. Notes that^F made from a discussion with my

great uncle John Mole also said that Mary (known on the internet as Mary Ann Francis Green) and Sarah Ann were sisters. They were his grandparents, so he should have known. I have been unable to trace Sarah Ann to any Sauls or Green family. One source says Mary Green's father was named William and this is easy to believe since her grandson and my grandfather was named William Green Mole! One internet source traces a William Joseph Green to the Barnwell District and there is a W. J. Green ^(near the Moles) listed in the 1850 Beaufort District of about the same age with a wife of the same name but I can't close the gap. On the Sauls side I have information from the internet that ^{Theophilus Sr} he had three wives and I am descended from his first un-named one. As I mentioned to you, he is ~~mentioned~~ mentioned in a Barnwell Court procedure settling an estate as having married "a daughter". The person settling the estate was a Amy (or Anny) Long Cone. Since Theophilus Sr's second wife was a Long and third wife was a Cone, I probably won't be able to find out who

Theophilus Jr's mother is.

I know this is a lot to send at one time but I hope some of it is new information for you. As I said earlier, I would greatly appreciate any insights you may have. I did not enclose a copy of the Maul (and Hiers, Platts, et al) land grants with present highways superimposed as you said you have a copy of the Hiers book that I made my copy from.
