
In 1782, NICHOLAS I deeded to his eldest son NICHOLAS II, for 10 shillings, 100 acres of his 1749 grant of land on Crim's Creek. No record has been found concerning the disposition of the remaining 50 acres of the grant. Neither is there a record of the death of NICHOLAS I or his place of burial.

Records indicate that NICHOLAS II was a son of NICHOLAS I. Based only on census records it is believed that NICHOLAS I had at least three other sons, JOHANNES ADAM, JOHN, and ADAM. All four of these sons will be discussed in later chapters.
