- (1) Point Comfort, 1,000 Acres.
- (2) Cotton Hope, 400 Acres
- (3) Haigs Point, 1,100 Acres
- (4) Pine Lands, 1,000 Acres
- (5) Coggins Point and Springfield, 900 Acres.

The case papers also include a tax sale certificate for each of the five plantations. These certificates give the location and description of the plantations.
