Stan Rawlings of Missouri wrote in about ROLLINS AVENUE in Columbia, MO., named for Anthony Wayne Rollins, one of the founders of the University of Missouri, descended from Henry of Northern Ireland and Pennsylvania. This street bisects the campus of the University. He also informs us of RAWLINGS STREET and RAWLINGS ADDITION, Bloomingburg, Fayette Co., Ohio, named for Samuel Rawlings, son of Moses, killed by indians in 1787 in Kentucky.

From Ozelle Kilgore of Benjamin, Texas. Mrs. Kilgore's husband was the ROLLINGS. She is not doing any genealogy as she has arthritis and finds it difficult to write. She has some information to pass on to descendants of JAMES ROLLINGS, b. Nov.16,1770 in Virginia...died Nov. 4, 1056, in Smith County, Tennessee. I will quote from her letter: "JAMES RAWLINGS was born in Virginia and died and is buried at Denney's Branch, on the Manning Place. He came to Smith County, Tennessee, in 1825. The name of his wife is unknown, but the children were: Margaret, Jonathan K., Enoch, Caroline and Evaline. ENOCH was born in Virginia in 1805. His wife's name was Martha. She was from Alabama. Their children were: John, William, Enoch Jr., Ammon, Leapolaus, Josephine, Agness and Taylor. AMMON ROLLINS was born in 1838, died March 16, 1906. His grave is located in Smith County on a hill between New Middleton and Brush Creek on the edge of a field. He married a Hearn, according to Erma Williams. After her death he married Agnes Minton. In another article HENRIETTA ROLLINS states JAMES married Mary (last name unknown). In 1948, a J. D. ROLLINS was Sheriff of Smith County.

Lyle B. Rawlings of Corona, California, has amassed reams of information on JAMES MASON RAWLINS who married Priscilla Blount, from whom he descends. JAMES and Priscilla, had sons CHARLES, JAMES and RODERICK, plus daughters ELIZABETH and NANCY. There is the possibility that there was another son named THOMAS, but not proven. CHARLES married Anastasia Gregory of North Carolina, JAMES JR. married Lydia Green of North Carolina, and RODERICK married (1) Sarah King, and (2) Millie Park. When CHARLES died, his children JAMES and JOSEPH, travelled with RODERIC to Taxas. JOSEPH later went to Indiana, and JAMES III to Utah, having become an LDS convert. JAMES, son of JAMES, and his family, eventually moved from Indiana to Greene County, Illinois. Lyle's research has led him to London, England, where he has discovered that a JAMES RAWLINS was christened June 27, 1739, at St. Belolph Without Aldgate in London, son of JOHN RAWLINS and Elizabeth Paris. He also found a JAMES RAWLINS christened January 14, 1759, at St. Sepulcre's in London, son of ISAAC and Margaret RAWLINS. More research needs to be done to discover if either of these JAMES' is JAMES MASON RAWLINS.

Excerpt from a letter from Lois R. Howell, 208 S. Lee Drive, Goldsboro, NC 27530

"With regard to our RAWLINGS family, my great-grandmother was REBECCA JAMES RAWLINGS. The information I have shows that she was born in Halifax Co., NC June 6, 1837. Died July 5, 1925. She was the daughter of HENRY RAWLINGS (b. 1781 in Virginia) and Priscilla Moody (b. 1796 in Virginia). This information is from family sources. Unfortunately, the birth records for Halifax County were destroyed by fire. REBECCA JAMES RAWLINGS married David Rogers, son of John Rogers and Lucretia Highsmith, on November 8, 1855. During my research, I also found the name spelled variously as RAWLINGS, RAWLINS, ROLLINS and ROLLINGS.

According to the Real Estate Book, Halifax Court House, the heirs of HENRY RAWLINGS were: Pauline (or Paulina) Higgs, Jane Pierce, GEORGE RAWLINGS, Rebecca Rogers, Tabitha Morris, JESS RAWLINGS and TOM RAWLINGS.

Incidentally, I have approximately 150 items of correspondence, consisting of letters, postcards, etc., which belonged to my great-grandmother, many of them written by GEORGE RAWLINGS, Jane Pierce, Lina Higgs and others. It is really fascinating. At the time of her death, great-grandmother was living with my grandmother, with whom we also lived. I was a little over three years old at the time. She and her husband, David Rogers, are buried at the old Ten-Mile Church Cemetery near Turkey, NC, as are Pauline and James Higgs. The Church is now called the Beulah Baptist Church."

(from subsequent letter)

"Unfortunately, when I began assemblying my genealogical information I didn't know about documenting the information. I had received some from a cousin who had done research, and I also asked questions of an aunt, who gave me information from memory. I do not now recall where each piece of information came from since I combined the two. Hopefully, this confusion will be cleared up when we receive the records from the family bible.

Apparently HENRY did not leave a will, or one could not be found, since the court appointed commissioners to allot to his heirs the legal number of shares. I hope to go back to Halifax in the near future to do more research."

The following two pages concern a Scots-Irish family from Ireland who came to Pennsylvania in the 1760's. Thanks to Louise Daniels who sent it to Alma Thomassen in 1958.



This Rollins family is supposed to have gone from England to Ireland thence the family came to what is now Pennsylvania but was then part of Virginia.

The following is written on the front leaf of the old Rollins Bible which was printed in 1791 in Edinburg.

"This Holy Book after my death I present to my friend and nephew Dr. A. W. Rollins of Richmond, Kentucky, and I hope it will be with him and unto his family through the blessing of God a fountain of living water springing up unto Eternal Life. May 12, 1828

Anthony Rollins
Allegheny County, Pennsylvania

Memorandum in the handwriting of Dr. Anthony Wayne Rollins, written about 1814, and found in the Rollins Family bible.



"Grandfather was born in the County of Tyrone and parish of Glencoe and township Billygettle about the year 1700 and was married to Sarah Fulton early in life. Followed farming and was descended from honest and respectable parents who lived to a great age. He had eight children—six sons and two daughters; James, Anthony, Henry, George, Benjamin and John, Sara. Anthony married and immediately afterwards moved to America and James, Henry and Benjamin followed shortly afterwards. Benjamin joined the British Army and afterwards settled in Canada. Anthony, James and Henry settled in Westmoreland Co., Pennsylvania, where the two former settled on farms. James was killed by a falling tree twenty two years since, Henry was drowned in Youghaguny River and Anthony is still living on his farm 20 miles from Pittsburg. Henry, who was my father, had seven children. John remained on his father's farm in Ireland. George's settlement is not known."

The following is not in the Bible (Children of Henry and Mary Carson Rollins)

- 1. Sara, married Mr. Jeffrey and lived in Ohio.
- 2. Samuel, died 1831, Lebanon, Ohio. Had a small family.
- 3. Dr. John Carson, lived in New Orleans, had several children only one of whom lived to be married, Orleane, md. Rev. Jerome Twitchell.
- 4. Jane, md. Mr. Smith, lived near Madison, Ind. Had at least one son.
- 5. Mary md. Mr. John Walker, lived in Ohio; at least one daughter, Mary Rollins Walker
- 6. James, man of fine talents. Lawyer, unmarried, lived in Port Gibson, Mississippi.
- Dr. Anthony Wayne, b. 1783, d. 1845, Boone Co., Mo. Attended Washington College, Washington and Jefferson College, 1800-1801. Removed to Madison Co., Ky. to attend to property interests of Uncle Anthony and to Boone Co., Mo., in 1829.

A Dimit from the Masonic Lodge in Dungannon, Ireland, was issued in 1769, so it is assumed that the three younger brothers came to America about that time.

John, who remained in Ireland, was a church warden 1788-1789, Billygettle in the parish Clonoe, Diocese of Armah (Armagh?)

The descendents of George and Benjamin are not known, although it is believed both were Loyalists and went to Canada.

Petitioner says around 1837 he furnished ANTHONY A. RAWLINS Sr., then of
Scioto County, now deceased, \$50.00 to enter 38-88 acres of land NW 2-3-20. RAWLINS
unable to repay on 28 Sept.1839, with wife Polly (Mary) made agreement to lease. (see
Vol. K, P.385 Deed Book). ANTHONY A. RAWLINS died about 9 years ago and Polly died
March 1857, without making a receipt to him for the land on a deed. No estate was
administered for either of them. The heirs were: Sarah Comager of Champaign County,
Ohio; Marian or Marie Prettyman, wife of James, of Champaign County, Ohio; Susan
Aldricci, wife of Gustavus of Arkansas; ANTHONY A. RAWLINS JR.; Lucy, wife of Adam
Kerr; Mary, wife of John Smith; Amanda, wife of Richard King.

When did Mary (Rankin) RAWLINGS die and where is she buried? Was it in present-day Lawrence County, Ill...or Harrison County, Kentucky? Mary was the wife of the Revolutionary War hero NATHAN RAWLINGS (1750-1821), who fought out of Washington County, Pennsylvania, during that war, then from Kentucky with General "Mad Anthony" Wayne in the Indian Wars of 1794 in Ohio, wounded at the Battle of Fallen Timbers. In the early 1800's, some sources say 1816, he and five of his sons went to southeastern Illinois, then Edwards County, now Lawrence County, and settled. Nathan died and was buried in the Springfield Cemetery, an original burial ground for Edwards County. A plaque was placed at the Lawrence County Courthouse in 1976 as a Bicentennial project, which cited him for outstanding service during the Revolutionary War. Since no mention is made of Mary in the Edwards and Lawrence County histories, any information on the burial site of Mary (Rankin) RAWLINGS, wife of Nathan Sr., would be deeply appreciated.
