

## Name of Hunting Island Dates Back for 175 Years

COLUMBIA, Aug. 30: Hunting Island, now a state park near Beaufort, apparently has been so named for 175 years or more.

On August 19, The News and Courier published a story speculating on the origin of the island's name. Since then, two readers have supplied additional data showing that the tract has been called Hunting island for many, many years.

Miss Jeannie T. Cason, of 9 Ladson street in Charleston, cited an old French map of 1777 (referred to in a 1940 News and Courier story). On that map, the island in question was identiffied as "Isle de Chasseurs," (island of hunters).

More detailed information came from Robert H. Reynolds, of 10 Asheley avenue, Charleston, who possesses family data on the island. Reference was made to Mr. Reynolds' grand uncle, Benjamin Reynolds, in the News and Courier story of August 19. In that story, Benjamin Reynolds was quoted as having referred to "all the sea islands and hunting islands, from Sullivan's to Savannah river."

According to Mr. Robert Reynolds, early maps of South Carolina show Hunting island to have been named King Philip island, later changed to Reynolds' island. Mr. Reynods said:

"The will of William Reynolds, dated January 14, 1784 and filed for probate December 13, 1788, makes the following bequest:

"'I give to my son, Benjamin Reynolds, the tract of land on St. Helene island on which he now lives and the island known as Reynolds' Hunting island during his natural life and at his death to be equally divided between his two sons, William and Thomas Reynolds."

Mr. Robert Reynolds added that there were none of his family name in St. Helane's parish after 1860, and said he believed the name was changed about then to the present designation, "Hunting island."

He supported the contention of Dr. Havilah Babcock, sportsman and professor of English at the University of South Carolina, that the island was so named because game was plentiful on the island.

To The News and Courier:

Recently I was asked, you from the North"? Well, that question is enough to make my American ancestors turn over in their graves. Richard was the first Capers in our family to come over here. And, although he had made many trips, it wasn't until 1684 that he brought his family over to live.

In 1691 he bought a piece of property in Charleston on Church and Tradd streets, from Thomas Rose. The house he built stands there today. He died in 1694. In 1695, William, his only child by, a former marriage, relinquished his claim in favor of his step-mother Mary and her five children. The

youngest, Thomas, was my ancestor, and the first Capers born in America.

His brother Richard became his guardian. In those days merchants delivered their own merchandise: attached "ie word "gentleman" to their name and had their coat of arms. Their sons were educated in a monastery and their daughters in a convent. And so William came home from a monastery in Wales at the death of his father. And being the eldest son became the head of the family.

His father, Richard, was a brick merchant and delivered his brick himself in his own boat. And our coat-of-arms is authentic. The crest shows that the bearer was a crusader and the second son of a nobleman. This Richard Capers of 1684-and his wife, Mary, have many descendants living who are daily readers of your News and Courier.

My father, Gabriel, called young Gabe by his friends, and his father, Uncle Gabriel, did not believe in secession. Grandfather's will was probated in 1859. He divides up his land and slaves among his wife, Mary Y., daughter of Benjamin Reynolds, of Wadmalaw Island (so the will stipulates) and their children. He was a representative in our state assembly many years, from Beaufort county. When the war came in 1861, father, being a former cadet of The Citadel, took up arms in defense of his native state, like Robert E. Lee. When he came home from the war he found it occupied by Union soldiers and mother and her nurse refugeed elsewhere. He managed to get pos-session of his home by buying it from the federal government, But later, it was burned to the ground by a drunken Union soldier. Both my parents were ill at the time and the news finally killed my father. And so I'm wondering where those Red Shirt and KKK were such horrible experiences.

If I have ever met or even seen a KKK I don't know it. But I do know that women and children and the weak and the helpless need protection. But today it seems to be necessary for women to get up their own legal protective associations. One was in Texas when I was teaching school. Another was in Florida when I was taking care of three boys whose parents were at-tending an Episcopal convention in New Orleans. Their father was an Episcopal minister. There may be many other such legal protective associations of women. We need them. And if I had the money I would get up practical Christian association homes for the aged, another thing that is badly needed. (MISS) A. A. CAPERS.



## **Backward Glances**

News our grandfathrs read in The News and Courier, August 2, 1901:

Those who are perpetually praising old times will be shocked to hear that there were mosquitos in Charleston a century and a half ago. This is proved by the will of Benjamin Baker, of record at the Probate Court in this city. On December 29, 1748 (long after mosquito season in these degenerate days), he bequeaths to his beloved wife, among other bedding, "one pavillion."

Mr. Gevert Dreyer, who owns the handsome store at the southwest corner of Church and Tradd streets, and the small two-story brick building adjoining, is of the opinion that the Sons and Daughters of the Revolution, Colonial Dames, Historical Society and other patriotic organizations are strangely overlooking a landmark which is well worth a brass tablet. It was in the small brick building next to Mr. Dryer's house that the Provincial House of Assembly met. Mr. Charles Fraser described it as "an old brick house on the west side of Church street, two doors south of the corner of Tradd street," and said that it was once the residence of Miles Brewton.
