" I have a photostat (which I have copied on the typewriter and indexed) of a diary of George Robison Black of Georgia, owned by a descendant of the same name who lives in Miami, written in 1863 and mostly an account of his ancestors. Elizabeth, who married Sheriff John Leacraft, was the daughter of James Black who came from Scotland before the Revolution and settled in Virginia. He married Rachel Adams in Christ Church, Philadelphia Nov. 6, 1762, and died during the Revolution. (She has this note: Rachel Adams was supposed to be a close relative of Pres. John Adams) He (James Black) had moved to Beaufort District. (He was the greatgrandfather of the diarist.) She married second Joseph Longworth. Ann, another daughter of James Black (born Dec. 16, 1768) married James Bowman and afterwards John Bythewood. Mr and Mrs. James Bowman were mentioned in a letter (quoted in the diary) written 1799 by Mrs. Robert Reid, whose daughter married William, son of James Black.) W *Sarah Hanson Reid, dam, Robert and his 2nd with (m.c. 1750) Joannie Garner (without of James Miles), m. 25mm 1802 Wm, son of James Black. Note: She goes on to say that she planned to lend this diary to the Rev. Mr. Peeples etc.

She also gave me the following which may be of interest to you: SCHM XXX, p 118. Departed this Transitory life, at his plantation, on Hilton-Head Island, on the 15th inst. John Leacraft, Esq., after a tedious illness. From Charleston Courier (Wed. Aug. 27, 1806)
