Henrietta Phodes.

Henrietta Rhodes, daughter of John Phodes and Mary Talbird, was born at Beaufort, S. C., in 1792, and died March 26, 1852.

Her husband and herself are buried at Whale Branch plantation.

She first married Dr. Paul Hamilton. He died Oct 5, 1877—
leaving one child, Col. Paul Hamilton, who still survives, and
resides at Port Royal, S. C. He married Catherine Campbell,
Sept. 13, 1837, and has a number of children and grandchildren,
who reside at different points in Beaufort District, S. C.

William T. Potter, in June, 1880. He diedMarch 8, 1879. They survived their day, Henrietta Rhodes Potter, daying II Feb. 1834 in had no children, infancy. I remember my aunt, Mrs. Hamilton, or Potter. My father and mother lived on a plantation adjoining Cotton Hall from 1830 to 1837. She was a woman of very superior intellect and culture.

As before stated, the facts and dates from which these sketches have been prepared, were obtained from family memoranda, and from letters of Col. Paul Hamilton, and Mrs. Anne H. Waring, and from a letter of Dr. Henry Talbird, copies of which accompany

this paper, and will be found to contain many interesting details not hereinm mentioned. The account of the Talbird family, by Rev. Dr. Henry Talbird, will also be found very interesting in its details.

Henrietta, born 24 June 1790, died 26 March 1852, buried Whale Branch Plantation Cemetery, daughter of John Rhodes (born Bridgenorth, Shropshire, England 2 Feb. 1747, died Beaufort, S. C. 4 Oct. 1827, buried Whale Branch Plantation Cemetery, married 11 June 1774 Mary Talbird, born 21 Sept. 1751, died 19 Oct. 1811, buried Whale Branch Plantation Cemetery), married (1st) 30 May 1809 Paul Hamilton, Jr., son of Secretary of the Navy and former Governor of S. C., Paul Hamilton and Mary

daughter of Edward Wilkinson; he died 5 Oct. 1817; Issue: 1. Mary Rhodes Hamilton, born 13 Jan. 1811, baptized 21 July

1811 by Campbell, parents sureties. Died young.

2. Col. Paul Hamilton, married 13 Sept. 1837 Catherine
Campbell; numerous children and grandchildren.
