Crim Creek is a creek between the Broad and Saluda Rivers in the Dutch Fork section in S.C. In 1749 Captain John (Hans) Adam Epting had a grant on Crim Creek. German settlers had been in this area before that time. The earliest census 1790 list: Lawrence, Peter Grim, and Zechariah Crim, three heads of families in S.C. in 1790. I have not checked the Newberry county records or the Journals of the Commons House of Assembly, the Charleston Newspapers of the 1730-1740 and the Land grants in the State Dept. of Archives for the background of the Crim family, but this is what I have. History of Cogburn Family Annie Laurie Crim Mother

The Cogburn family is of Scottish descent and migrated from N.C. The first Cogburn was thought to be John Cockburn who lived in Edgefield county on Hard Labor Creek. It is thought that John Cogburn changed his spelling and held land in 1802 on "Ceda Creek" and another tract on Walnut Creek and other land on "Turkey creek". John was the first deacon in the Baptist Meeting House on Horns Creek, possibly as early as 1768. Later he helped start the Antioch Baptist Church eight miles west of Edgefield. John Cogburn m Hannah had eight children; only Rachel, Moses and John Jr. survived. John Sr b 1745 d 1810. John Jr. b 5 Dec 1781 d 19 Mar 1870 m Letty Still dau of John and Jean Still and had thirteen children including Jesse m. Cogburn 4 Dec 1811 m Eliza Murrell both buried in Mt. Olives cemetery. They had seven children: Randolph, Anne m William Jennings of McCormick, 3 Susannah Cogburn m Jack Holloway of McCormick. 4 James Polk Cogburn 5 Caroline B. Cogburn 6 Benjamin Still Cogburn m Agnes Ferrin Cogburn dau of Lewellyn Robert Cogburn 7 ELIZABETH "LIZZIE" COGBURN B ~~1854~~ MARRIED JETER WASHINGTON CRIM parents of Annie Laurie CRIM. 1854

The Cogburn family or Cockburn came from Cockburn path in Scotland and was started by the Vikings in 1000 A.D. The Cockburn tartan is rich blue and greens, with narrow red and crossed white lines in strong colors. It is said that the Cogburns are descended from Edward I. This means that a Cogburn married a king's daughter.

This year 1983 I visited John David Crim and Marion in Sanford Fla. John David is retired and Marion have three or four daughters. Then I visited Jeter E. Crim in Greer, S.C. and his wife Jewell. I saw their son and family a few years ago when J.E. and Jewell celebrated their Fifty Year Anniversary. Both are still active and J.E. and son ~~*****~~ Jesse Ewell own Crimson Electric near Greer, S.C. Then I visited Lip and Vic, Lip is Carrie Elizabeth Crim Had Vic is Emmie Victoria Crim. Both are fine and Lip is now Mrs James W. Whatley. Vic is now Mrs. Bertram Ponder. Both live in Johnston, S.C. While visiting them I copied the following from a book at Lip Whatley's.

CRIM FAMILY

"In 1860@ Clouds Creek, Edgefield county at that time, But now Saluda county we find Jim L. Crim married to Meosey Crim, with their seven children. Jeter W., the oldest was seventeen at that time, Jane E., J.C., Georgia, Henry, and Mary R. one year of age.

Jeter W. Crim came to Johnston and married Lizzie Cogburn in the year 1874. Jeter was like all other men from Edgefield county. He fought in the Civil War. He was a corporal and was a Prisoner of war at Missionary Ridge, Tenn. After returning home Jeter and Lizzie made their home on the north side of Johnston in the home presently owned by Mr. Herman McGee. Along with farming they ran a General Store on main street.

RHODES FAMILY HISTORY:

The de Rhodes, hereditary knights of Flanders, came to England with the Earl of Flanders and Tofti, Harold's brother, to assist William The Conqueror. (Froissart, Vol. I, p. 121) The Domesday Book records that WILLIMUS and Hugh Rodes were granted the "Moiety of Rodes", an estate located in Chester near Macclesfield, 40 mi. southeast of Liverpool. Hugh returned to the continent to become Hugh I, Comte de Rodez, founder of the Rodez family and the town of Rodez, capital of the Department of Aveyron in southern France. (Dictionnaire De La Noblesse, p.435) Willimus left a son Michael de Rhodes whose descendants have been traced through more than 30 generations to the Rhodes family of neighboring Shropshire:

1. NATHANIEL Rhodes, Bridgnorth, Severn River, Shropshire (Salop), England, 1742 will names sons Nathaniel & Thomas. The Register of Church of St. Mary Magdalene, Bridgnorth has many entries for this Rhodes family.
2. NATHANIEL Rhodes, Bridgnorth, witnessed 16 Sep 1746 will of Thomas George, Bridgnorth, father of his wife: Harriett George: 2 known sons: George Rhodes (see below) & John Rhodes (Bridgnorth 2 Feb 1747-Beaufort, SC 4 Oct 1827), m. 11 Jun 1774 ~~in~~ St. Helena's Ch., Beaufort, Mary Talbird (21 Sep 1751-19 Oct 1811), daughter of Henry Talbird & heiress of 1217-acre Whale Branch Plantation (now Clarendon with extant cemetery): son: Dr. Nathaniel Henry Rhodes (1783-1817) m. Early History Of Rhodes

Rhodes family flourished in England from the time of William the Conqueror. Two brothers Willmus and Hugh, hereditary knights of Flanders entered as warriors in 1066. Village of RODE, seat of the original grant, is still located near Macclesfield in Cheshire. Hugh returned to Normandy as Comte de Rodez, founder of Rodez family and town of Rodez, now capital of the Department of Aveyron in France. William de Rhode left a son Michael de Rhodes whose descendants have been traced through more than thirty generations to the Rhodes family in neighboring Shropshire.

THOMAS RHODES was born 22 September 1775 at Bridgenorth, Shropshire, England, where he was baptized 14 May 1775, eldest son of George Rhodes of that city and his wife, Elizabeth (Betsy) Bache, who were married at the Church of St. Mary Magdalen, Bridgenorth, on 11 November 1772. This George Rhodes was a son of Nathaniel Rhodes of Bridgenorth and his wife, Harriet George. Thomas Rhodes immigrated to South Carolina about 1790 to join his uncle, John Rhodes, who was born in Bridgenorth 2 February 1747 and immigrated as a mere boy to South Carolina where he grew up to become a prosperous merchant of Charleston and Beaufort, planter of Whale Branch Plantation on Port Royal Island which he acquired by his marriage 11 June 1774 in St. Helena's Church Beaufort, to Mary Talbird daughter of Henry Talbird. On 10 July 1795 THOMAS RHODES MARRIED in St Philips Episcopal Church, Charleston, Mary, daughter and heiress of the late John Wright of Charleston, a planter. They settled in Beaufort District where Mary died, leaving two children: THOMAS WRIGHT RHODES and Sarah Rhodes. Thomas Wright Rhodes later married Elizabeth Phoebe Jenkins daughter of Col. John Jenkins, planter, of Edisto Island and his wife, Sarah Phoebe Chaplin. Thomas sister Mary married a Fripp. THOMAS WRIGHT RHODES and SARAH PHOEBE CHAPLIN had eight children. Henry, Julia, (married Porter), John Jenkins, Emma, Richard Wright, Rosa, (married Ficklin), Fanny Balgay, (mar. Meyers), and DANIEL BENJAMIN RHODES.

THOMAS RHODES married secondly, around 1799, Mary Elizabeth Cater, born 25 June 1776 at Cater Hall Plantation, St. Peter's Parish, her father Thomas Cater was a Captain during the Revolutionary War and he represented St. Peter's Parish in the Legislature of the State of South Carolina in 1782. Her mother was Rachel Miles, planter, daughter of Capt. Silas Miles, planter, of Poplar Springs Plantation, St. Paul's Parish and his wife, Elizabeth, daughter of the famous Indian fighter, James MacPherson, Capt. of the S.C. Rangers, who escorted and protected General James Oglethorpe and his party of settlers from Beaufort to found the City of Savannah and Colony of Georgia on 12 February 1733. Thomas Rhodes and Mary Elizabeth Cater had three children: GEORGE RHODES was born 11 Jan 1802 on Calliwassee Island, St. Luke's Parish on land originally granted 29 Oct. 1709 to his mother's forebears. His wife sister, Rachel Cater Rhodes, who married Ulysses Maner Robert of Robertville by whom she had seven children. ~~He had~~ Nathaniel Henry Rhodes, who married Sarah Julia Haygood, Sister of Thomas Hagood of Colleton County and of the family of Gen. Johnson Haygood. Nathaniel Henry Rhodes (George's Brother) was the father of five children including two sons who left descendants: Thomas Haygood Rhodes and Nathaniel Henry Rhodes who married Belle Grayson and left eight children in Georgia. George Rhodes father Thomas died 25 April 1809 leaving Mary Cater Rhodes with three small children and a plantation. She married Winborn Asa Lawton, son of Joseph Lawton, planter, of Mulberry Plantation, Black Swamp, St. Peter's Parish. George Rhodes was sent by his mother to her aunt, Mrs. Susannah Miles MacPherson Widow of Gen. John MacPherson and to her cousin, Elizabeth Mary MacPherson, wife of the Hon. James Reid Pringle. For his formal education the Pringles sent young George to the famous school which Dr. Moses Waddell had founded in 1804 at Willington in Abbeville County. Dr. Waddell in 1819 to become President of Franklin College which later became the University of Georgia. George Rhodes step-father and his mother had four children: Winborn Benjamin Lawton, Mary Cater Lawton, Alexander Robert Lawton, and Narcissa Melissa Lawton. George was 18 years old when accepted the job as instructor for the newly-founded Lawtonville Academy for boys and girls. The following year George Rhodes married Thursa Evelina Robert, born 4 Sept 1801 daughter of ~~James~~ James Jehu Robert, planter, of St. Peter's Parish, and his first wife, Charlotte Anne Lawton, daughter of Joseph Lawton, Mulberry Grove plantation, and his wife Sarah Robert. ~~James~~ James Robert was the son of John Robert, founder of Robertville, and his wife Elizabeth Dixon, daughter of Capt. Thomas Dixon, planter, of James Island, and his wife, Elizabeth Smith, granddaughter of the First Landgrave Thomas SMITH, Governor of Carolina in 1693. Landgrave Smith and seventeen others qualify us as Eligible for First families. GEORGE RHODES first child was named James Pringle after his Charleston relative, born 27 Dec 23 Two daughters, Sarah Cater and Mary Charlotte and mother and ~~daughters~~ died 1823

GEORGE RHODES MARRIED ELIZA JANE ROBERT younger daughter of ~~James~~, James Jehu Robert, Christmas 1828, daughter of Charlotte Anne Lawton. This is George's second wife-both daughters of Charlotte Anne Lawton Robert. Eliza Jane Robert was born 30 Jan 1810-died 11 Jan 1867 and was 18 when she married George. Two sons, George Milton and Theodore Augustus were born 17 October 1829 and 18 Jan 1832. The first daughter arrived 5 August 1833 and named Thursa Evelina after her deceased aunt. George Rhodes joined the Baptist Church and was elected a deacon in 1831 at Pipe Creek Baptist Church. Around 1850 Pipe Creek moved to Lawtonville and became Lawtonville Baptist Church. A third son, named Joseph Nathaniel for Lawton and Rhodes grandfathers followed by Henrietta Eugenia on 8 Dec 1835 and Phoebe Miranda on 28 Sept 1859. A fourth son named Thomas Willingham was born 1 June 1841. Rachel Minerva (Minnie) was born 18 July 1843 and a fifth son, named Jehu Robert was born 13 Feb. 1845. George Rhodes' first son by his first wife was James Pringle who married Margaret Polhill Lawton, his cousin. They settled in Erwinton area twenty miles north along the stagecoach road. Their first son was George Augustus the first grandchild of George Rhodes. George Augustus married Julia Baynard and had two daughters, Josephine and Mae. Mae married Earnest Augustus brother of Theodore Milton Rhodes. Josephine Mc Nair was Aunt Mae's niece. *GRAND NIECE* Ella sister of George Augustus married Thomas Ellis.

George Rhodes had five more daughters: ADELINA GERTRUDE B 20 Mar 1847 MARRIED DANIEL BENJAMIN RHODES her $\frac{1}{2}$ first cousin. Daniel Benjamin Rhodes mother was Elizabeth Phoebe Jenkins daughter of Col. John Jenkins of Lands End Plantation and his wife Sarah Phoebe Chaplin. Sarah was daughter of Thomas Chaplin and Elizabeth Fripp was born 24 May 1778. Thomas Wright Rhodes B. 6 May 1796-d. Nov. 1862. Wife Elizabeth Phoebe Jenkins B. 20 Jan 1798-d. 1854. George Rhodes And his wife Eliza owned an elegant Southern Plantation home boasting floor-to-ceiling pier mirrors, chased brass fireplace fenders and window cornices, crystal chandeliers, mahogany furniture and silver service. George was elected with another large planter, Langdon Cheves, to represent St. Peter's Parish in the Convention of the people of South Carolina to consider relations with the Federal government. The convention opened on Monday, 17 Dec 1860 in Columbia but adjourned to Charleston because of the smallpox epidemic. George boldly signed his name to the Ordinance of Secession which dissolved the Union. The War and Sherman's undisciplined crossed the Savannah River at Sisters Ferry and totally destroyed every Residence. George refugeed in Forsythe Georgia with his oldest surviving son George Milton. After the war they came back to the Hermitage to rebuild. Eliza died in 1867 and George died 1881.
