This is not surprising since John was living is America and was independently wealthy by that time. There is something a bit odd about the will which I will point out to you when I sent a copy to you.

I was also able to download the 1818 will of Henrietta Rhodes, spinster of Bridgnorth. She is probably a relative if not the daughter of Nathaniel.
