

Mary H. Rhodes, widow of Nathaniel Henry Rhodes, M. D. (8-136 Miscellaneous Records)  
dated 9 Dec. 1819 at Charleston S.C., a marriage settlement with Dr. Richard B. Scriven  
of Charleston and Georgetown.... Trustees for the bride to be are John Rhodes & James Bowman.  
Much property and many slaves listed... 4 1/2 lot in Columbia bounded by Wheat, Giddens, Blossom  
& Wagner Sts. and another 4 1/2 lot in Columbia bounded by Gervais, Henderson & Pickens Sts....  
600 a plantation on Port Royal Island in Beaufort Dist. bounded by lands of Nathaniel  
Rhodes, Stephen Lawrence, Robert Barnwell and said lands bought from Charles  
J. Colcock.... 2 town lots in Beaufort formerly belonging to the estate of Thomas Bowman  
now deceased... and the undivided interest in certain plantations and slaves on  
Euhaw which belonged to the late Christopher Leacroft and the houses and lots in  
the town of Columbia, S.C. which belonged to the late Christopher Leacroft and of  
which Nathaniel Henry Rhodes, M. D. was the legal heir.... many other slaves and  
properties including certain slaves made in a deed of trust to Dr. Paul Hamilton  
by a deed of trust dated 2 June 1812 by Nath. H. Rhodes in his life time.... if no  
issue of the marriage between Mrs. Mary H. Rhodes & Dr. Richard B. Scriven, then  
all the widow's dower in estate of Dr. Nath. Henry Rhodes deceased to which  
Mrs. Mary H. Rhodes will be entitled after at her death to go to her four  
children by Dr. N. H. Rhodes, Wit. Mary L. Christian, Morton A. Waring & Susan  
B. Hamilton.
