

"Departed this life, Captain Thomas Rhodes, of this city, and son of the late Dr. John Rhodes of the city of New-Haven in the State of Connecticut; who served faithfully in the revolutionary armies of the United States, and whose upright, just and faithful conduct through life is well known to the first characters of this city - He has left a widow and three children to lament his loss."
