In the name of God Amen. I Gideon Hagood, formerly of Barnwell District in the State of South Carolina, but now of Hancock County in the State of Georgia, being of sound mind and understanding to make this my last will and testament in manner and form following -

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Hagood all my estate both real and personal, which I have in this state, and which I got by her in consequence of our marriage, consisting of forty eight Negroes, Lands, Stocks of Cattle Horses, Hogs, Household furniture and plantation implements, and Blacksmiths Tools, to her and her heirs and assigns forever. I also give to my said wife my Carriage, which I have bought since our marriage - Concerning my estate in Barnwell District South Carolina, in my first marriage, I made a married Contract, which was afterwards carried into effect in which I made over to Trustees my whole estate, for each of our joint use during life, and afterwards to our children, which contract I do hereby confirm - but concerning all my estate which I have purchased since I made said Contract, I do hereby give and bequeath to my children, George Johnson, Harriett, Amanda, Susan Julia, Thomas Gideon, and Emma M. Pherson, to be equally divided among them share and share alike, I do not think proper to give any part of this estate to my Daughter Elvira Ann M. Pherson because my son in Law James M. Pherson is in independent circumstances, and because I have already given her a Negro woman named Emily whose increase, will be more than an equal share with the rest of my children -

It is my will and desire also that all my just debts be paid by my said trust estate and that I have now given to my children, I mean all debts which I have contracted for or on account of said estate, and which was absolutely

necessary, not only for myself, but also for my children, and which debts I do more particularly enumerate, the amount of which I do not particularly know in each case. Thomas Gillison (on Bond), Estate of Aaron Smith two notes - the estate of William Sampson Smith, Bond, James Higginbottom & Co. Note, George W. Collins & Co. Note, James Fines Note - Doct. John S. Fowler note, Mr. Jowers Note, Colonel Brown Note - Samuel Gillison one note, and Messrs Pelly & Sprad of Savannah, & Thomas Watton of said place. Also I charge said estate and my Executors hereafter named, to pay my two notes to William Williams of Calontow in this State, for one thousand five hundred dollars, in which my friends Cullen Battle and Doct. A. Battle has been my security, and ^{I do} also hereby put into the hands of my Executors in this State hereafter named, all my estate which I brought with me from South Carolina, as assets in their hands, until the said debt is paid - and as Mr. Williams has agreed to indulge two or three years provided the interest, which we agreed upon is regularly paid I do hereby direct my Executors in South Carolina hereafter named, to pay the said interest regularly until my estate is able to discharge the whole - and I do hereby exempt the estate which I have given to my wife to pay any or any part of the debt or debts above mentioned, as my estate in South Carolina ought to pay all the debts I contracted for said estate, and this last mentioned sum was borrowed for to extinguish the debts due in that State, and which I have lately appropriated for that purpose.

I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my friends Cullen Battle, Doct. Andrew Battle and James Shivers my Executors to this my last will and testament, to act in this State, and I do hereby nominate and appoint my friends Thomas Gillison, George W. Collins, William Smith and Angus Patterson not only my Executors, but Guardians to my children in the State of South Carolina - It is my Will and desire, that the estate hereby conveyed to my children,

shall be conveyed to my Executors & Guardians to my children in Trust for them, and their heirs, I mean the heirs of their body, and in case of the death of either of them without such heir or heirs, it is my will that the survivor or survivors shall have such deceased child's part - I give to my son Thoms Gideon when he shall get large enough to take care of it my good Watch - It is my will that my children shall be educated in the best manner my estate is able to afford -

And lastly I do most earnestly request my friends to whom I am indebted to be as indulgent with my estate for the respective debts due them as the nature of their case will admit of - Should it have pleased God to spare my life I would have paid all in one or two years at most - I commit my soul in the hands of Almighty God who give it me, with a firm hope of a glorious Immortality, through the Redemption that is in Christ Jesus - Amen -

Given under my hand and seal this twentieth day of February 1824 - (Signed) Gideon Hagood

Signed sealed and declared by the said Gideon Hagood, to be his last will and testament, in the presence of us who at his request and in the presence of him and each other have subscribed our names as Witnesses thereto - the words "to our children" in first page 19 line - and the words "to my wife" in 3rd page 11th line being first intended -

A true and perfect inventory of all the Goods, Chattels and personal estate of the Reverend Gideon Bogard late of Brunswick in the State of South Carolina, Planter, deceased made by us whose names are hereunto subscribed the 28th day of January in the year of our Lord 1828

All the negroes named and included in this inventory are said to be subject to the provisions and trusts expressed in the will of the testator bearing date 18th March 1796 & 2^d July 1809, which deeds are in my possession, and ready to be submitted to the inspection of all persons interested. In addition to the negroes here named & appraised, it is said that there are at the late residence of the testator in the State of Georgia, Louis a young fellow about forty years of age supposed to be worth \$400. - Next an African about forty years of age supposed to be worth \$300 - and to be a boy about eight years of age worth \$200. - Who belong to the same estate as those herein enumerated, but these negroes have never come to my possession.
