Dear Rev. Peoples,

Thank you for your response to my letter, especially since there was little for you to share with me.

As far as we know, our Richardsons are not related to Henry Richardson, although they came from Scotland, also. You have the tombstone information from their Black Swamp Cemetery, don't you? ("father of Henry was Rev. James Richardson, minister of Morebattle, Roxburghshire, N.B.")

I'm glad to know that John Richardson, m. Elizabeth P., from Edgefield Dist, S.C. who lived in Savannah for some time, was a son of Henry. Didn't Dr. Henry also have a brother, John? I have bits of information on all.

Especially as I research Savannah - Chatham Co. I have a copy of deed of slaves sold by Geo. Fraser, attorney of John Fraser of Sav'h to John Richardson, Port Royal Island Planter, 1810. I assumed this John was old Henry's brother. Do you want it? (over)

I thought, since Henry owned land in Edgefield Dist -
"Summerville" that he might be related to some of
the Richardsons up there. Did James, his father, come
to America?

If you would like to have the bits and pieces of
information I have, on Henry's line, let me know.

I don't think Richard Richardson of
Savannah is related because I saw something in
a deed which seemed to infer that he came to
Savannah from England. Our Richardsons were
in S.C. a long time before Chatham Co.

I have been corresponding with Sue Kaufman
for some time. Her line is probably related
to mine, but I need "older" ancestor links.

At least now, I can know for sure where John
and Elizabeth Richardson came from and can
put that information in Henry Richardson's
file.

We like Darien, too. We are originally of
Chatham Co. but always liked this little town,
so finally moved here after living all over.
We have an old cottage we are restoring, too
slowly. Things happen to hamper the work. We
"did" a couple of other houses and weren't really
as eager this time. We are do-it-yourselfers
and, of course, it is an "Artist's" house. Come see
