The library here say they cannot get it on an inter-library loan (I really think they're just lazy!) There should be a copy at Sylvanis Georgia, Atlanta and Orlando Fla. I know the one at N.Y.C. Public cannot be removed from the reference room - but they do have one (that is where I did my reading!) The Mormons have a copy in Salt Lake City, and may make copies of pages for you.

I believe your Jane descended from James McCall who was the cousin of my Francis. They came to America together from Ireland and landed in Pennsylvania. Later they all moved (both clans) to Mecklenberg Co. N.C. My line came on to A.C. while there are still some of James' line in the Charlotte area.

A fragmented name search through the pages I have makes me wonder if the line you are seeking is through William McCall (James') who married Elizabeth Stewart. Names of only two of their children are known: Matthew³ & James³ who were both soldiers in 1812, Mecklenberg Co. William had a sister named Jane and McCall's are apt to pass names along.
