Dear Robert:

Thanks for yours of March 13th. It came the day my wife had Major Surgery at Richland Mem. Hosp. She is still in "intensive care" but I believe is recovering well. If my letters have seemed incoherent it is because my mind has been concentrated on her. Our eldest son, The Rev. David M. Stubb, Jr., Rector of Colleton Co., arrived on the 12th I was with her during the operation, but had to leave ^{P.M.} of the 13th for home.

First let me say that the Brunson book is full of errors.

Nor did I want them to use my line - i.e. Joseph's - because there was no time to get up the lists of hundreds of others, descendants of Joseph. They and my line anyway, ^{Isaac had enough for a book}

The release you refer to from John Brunson & wife Abigail, Bradocet's 1st sons, to Barnaby Bradford (Mar. 1, 1743; 202-a Berkeley Co.) is explainable thus: Ann, the wife of John Brunson (s-of Joseph) was dead by 1731, at the birth of their 3rd. child, Mary. I find no marriage of this John to an Abigail, but such must have been the case. Also ~~I believe his~~ ^{sister of Samuel} ~~name was Sumner~~ ^{Sumner}, and, I think the dau. of ~~John~~ ^{Samuel} ~~Stevens~~ ^{Stevens} ~~Sumner~~ ^{Sumner}

Since 1st wife, b. Ann Way, was dead by 1731, and John was married to Abigail (Sumner), by Mar 1, 1743, she had a dower interest in his lands. This Abigail Sumner was not my ancestress. Ann was & her dau. Abigail was of course. Now Abigail (Sumner) Brunson never did have survived long after Mar. 1, 1743, release, for in Aug. 1743, John Brunson & m-d. widower; m-d. Savannah Peterson, widow

according to pub. records of Pt. F's ^{Rev. H.S.} parish church.

"Abigail" was definitely a name that ran in the Brewster family up in Conn. The brother of John Brewster (will, 1711) was Abigail Jewell. He also had a slightly younger sister named Abigail + so that Mary Abigail Brewster, wife of Stephen Peck, was prob. named for her G. Grandmother, Abigail (Jewell) Brewster.

Mary, the wife of Preserved Ford, was an orphaned grand-dau. of old John Brewster + wife b. Hannah Scott. She came with her for Conn. in 1696, was provided for in J.B.'s, 1711 will, etc. Mary's name before marriage was Mary Hills, as she must have been the dau. of a deceased dau. of J. & H.S.B. Mary Hills Ford, while first cousin to John Brewster of Pt. F's per., ^{but} was his Senior by 11 years.

Of course I know Matilda Gerard. She is over good friend of late; visited us at our Mountain home in N.E. Ga. last summer. She has been most helpful to me - and, I sent, unto say - vice versa. We are tangentially related by way of two Brewster Brothers, the frn Isaac, & frn Joseph. We are more closely related however, through Brewster of Black River - Tiverton, frn Va. (d. 1782); and his son known as "Mr. Brewster, Sr."

I have relied heavily on publ. works - (1) Mrs. Harriet Brewster Sibley's Brewster Lineage, 1917 (copy in Rich Co. pub. lib.) + Rev. Jacques Straey's Hist. & Records of Newbury Church. I am a copy of this fine book, privately printed + financed by Bakers (circa 1940), now given to Mr. May Jr. Book Basement, Chelmsf. for \$ - ex locate, Edmon Peacock one of the 2 former Deans. He ^{can find one for you.}

I have been unable to connect John Bradford with Wm B. I don't seriously think they were in the same circles, either economic or social. The Bradfords of St. Andrews parish were far wealthier & intermixed with families for whom ~~generally~~^{other} than did Mrs. of St. George. I can find no connection ~~with~~^{between} Bull's, Brewster's, 1700ds, Middletons etc. and the very Disease but unquestionable Congregationalists. In fact the very breeding of St. George's parish church in the first yard of Dorchester, or to speak, had much to do with the immigration of a large part of the Dorchester going to Georgia. in my opinion. The two elements were not compatible.

Mar. 18th My wife is now better; got out of "intensive care yesterday after 96 hours of it. The youngest of our three sons came Fri. p.m. got in a few visits with his brother but flew back home (Hamden, near New Haven) at 4th m. yesterday. He studied for the ministry one year at Berkley Seminary, New Haven, but, by then, with a wife & 2 children he could not return to finish.

After 5 surgical operations on my eyes my sight is greatly improved. So excuse this poor writing. Meant to rewrite it for you but no time nor allowable for it. It is less or nothing

To repeat John Brewster (1st s.c. 6. generation) m. (1) Anne Bradford; (2) Abigail Sumner, sister of Samuel; & (3) widow Susannah Robinson. Don't ask me for citations now. My work papers etc. are at our Duxbury, Ga., home. True John married Susannah quite soon after Abigail's death, but, in those days, circumstances (like smallpox etc.) dictated great remarriages. I can document all I have given you. Cordially,
