In glancing thru the 1982 S. C. Archives COMPUTER INDEX: ROBERT, James (Jacques 1711-1774) there seems to be a GAP between 1740 to 1756, or on to 1760, in anything now shown for him.

The Items from 1756 to 1760 seem to be only Grants-Plats-Other with notations, adjacent to James Robert. 1760 is Judgement Roll vs Johnathan Wood 51 A: 238 A. However, the 1758 Plat for Wm. Wood, Williamsburg, 6:378, James R. may be Dist. Surv. again. It will take a whole lot of looking.

I have written Thos. O. Lawton (Jr) requestion an opinion if any of the Land, Very Early Grants etc, in S. C. can rightfully be ours to-day. Somehow, I just had to ask someone.

Thank you for the SEABROOK Data. I am more sure, that we need more Private Places, and a whole lot less Government Doings, such as this.

Miss Virginia Gourdin, of Charleston, re the Cook Map of 1763, which does not show up in "S. E. IN EARLY MAPS", and she write back 8 pages of her 1972 Trip to Basel, Suisse, which was very interesting, & informative. (Had written her)

Hopefully, I can secure a few more Early Maps for the Society. There is one that List the PLANTERS on the Side: Moll Map 1715, or 1729; which seems to be an Item, the Library Needs.
