There was a p-c on top of a desk here, for about a year, & it was ither filed wrong, or Cuz-an Crystelle ROBERT Wickett, Ft. Worth, Texas was sent, what I thought was a p-c of the P-C, for her Records. After re-reading several times, I felt sure, postive, it was Jacques ROBERT. So, a note was made on my INDEX of The Misc Records, with just the Month & Year, & what about.

Oh, another item: Rowan N. C. Wills 1753-1805, Books A - 5, publ. pg 47, Original C:235 July 28, 1801, Proved 1805, Mary Kerr Her Son: Joseph Kerr, money from Legacy from her brother Arch. Hamilton of S. C.

There was some kind of connection between Rowan County, N. C. & the Pee Dee Area of S. C. Sam'l Lusk of Rowan, N. C., was living in Craven, Quit Rents, about 1760 without looking, Geo. Dist. and Mariah Ann Roberts, d of Abraham II, MC 1807 in Franklin, Miss. John Houston Lusk, his son.

Also in Rowan, N. C. DEEDS Vol II, 1762-1772 Edward Roberts, Sr. & Jr. along with Nathanile - Elinor, & John, William, & Wm. J. are noted. These may be the Edward/Edmund Robert Land Grant York, S. C. 1763 FAMILY.

In the last noted DEEDS Vol I 1753-1762 Archibald Hamilton is noted from May 1753 to July 1762. ------Which must be another Archibald H. as if your letter is correct, that A-H d prior to May 1749, when Madelaine Robert re M Wm. Gough, at St Helena, Beaufort, S. C.

S. C. RMC Books C+3:465 27 Nov. 1762, Recorded 21 Dec. 1764 Arch. Hamilton in noted as resident of Rowan, N. C. & I do NOT have all of the data noted.

In Looking Back: 2 ROBERT Jacques & Samuel settled very close to Georgetown, N. E. of Jamestown-French Santee; 2 more Benjamin & Abraham I settled N-W, Benj. Williamsburg, North West Part, & A-I on up in Geo. Dist. Pr. Freds Parish. With all of the hullablue it is very easy to get confused; but they are all Rev. P. ROBERT FAMILY. Who Samuel was, I am not all sure, but those on the Horry Census & just over in N. C. are most probably his. (1732 - 1740)

Jean ROBERT received 1 of the 200A Land Grants of Rev. P. Robert, which was sold to Geo. Chicken, less 7 Acres (Home Place-Burial Gd?) Memorials 3:184 1733. With the Wtns Will P-II, this ---to me-- is enough proof Jean/John is s of Rev. P.
