The John Roberts, Cusaw/Cousaw, later John's Island, d betwn 14 October, 1730, & February 1731, when his Will was Proved. 2 sons: Thos est born 1700 & John given 10 Shillings; Juliana Wiatt est bc 1708, Johnanna who receives 2/3 Est - Thos. 1/3. Thos d 1741 leaving 2 daus. John - Nothing D.N.

We could, at a later date, examine the Seals on the 1725 Mortgage to Jas. Laurens; and the Power of Attorney Feburary 1730, 10 March 1731, Rec'd S. C. Nov. 13, 1732 Capt. John Gascoyne etc for Purchase of 6-8 12000 A Barronies. If they are preserved then something new would be known.

Perhaps copies of these would clarify some, and if the Originals can be had, then I'm sure we'd know more.

* Question: Who was the Ann, [or Mary] Robert, that MC 1740 John Horry, who had Peter Horry b 1743; & Hugh Horry bb 1745-51? Pierre's dau Mary d UM Charleston, according to my Rough Chart. Pierre III had also: Ann; Susannah; & Hester, & they are spoken of as - just sis in Wills, no married name. Miss Lynch names Mary Horry in her will 1812. Mary names Nephew Peter Horry, Mary Lynch Horry, youngest dau of Nephew Jonah Horry, Ann Horry sis of Mary Lynch Horry; & The Hugers, The Belins 1803 Will. This bunch has always confused me.

Anyhow, it was NOT the Cousaw Island John Roberts who had the Barronies. It could be his son John, but somewhere, I had something that led me to believe: that it was NOT he, but our Jean Robert.

To date, my thinking has been: that Rev. P Robert took out the 1st looking for Jean Robert & Wife to show up, shortly after; but they had to wait for a baby to be born, then showed up in Virginia, 1701.

I connect the 1st Warrant to the 150 A. Plat, Nov. 1754, Col. Vol 6, pg 261, Control No. 335, on Half Way Swamp & Santee River. Then 1756 Quit Rents, pg 358 show John Roberts, 150 A, Berkley County, & I wonder if Berkley is an Error? Saw about the same for Jacques, on one of his.

Now, if Pon Pon Church Records Existed, we could know, for sure, but I have been written, they burned.

Please Note, that May 11, my Typewriter Wrote, again MC 1719, for A-I. Told you I was getting "Rum Dum". Mc 1739.

In the past, I've thought the Pr. Fredericks Church, Robert Roberts, could be our Abraham Robert Roberts. Dau Helen Baptz. Nov. 27, 1743, born Oct. 26, 1743. Wife-Mother Jane, (not Elizabeth).

Then, in reviewing John Robarts 1740/41/42 File, his youngest dau was Jane. Now, again, I'm wondering if Eliz. Jane _____? - Wife-Mother.

If you have time, please give me your thoughts re the Land Warrants, we should be able to get Originals.

We seem to have a Robert Roberts in each Generation, perhaps to Remind us that we were Robert/Rhobart, in A-II Branch of the Family.

Now, if the 1729 Benjamin Robert & Abigale Halbert Vol Q, p 224, part 16, 9 May; can be checked out; maybe I've done some worth while Work. Where did the Writers: Miller & Stafford get 3rd son Elias, when I have not been able to get one Item on Elias?

After trying for around 6-7 years to find the University Rev. Pierre Robert attended, 2/1674 to 2/1682, am following the suggestion of Julian H. Miller, Jr., Athens Georgia, Sept. 1977, and writing you.

son of Daniel & Marie (Patricia of Alsace) Robert, born 1656 St. Imier
Rev. P. Robert was at U of Basel, Immatriculating Jan 13, 1674, in the Prep School, & Ordained at the Huguenot Church, Basel, Switzerland 19 Feb. 1682. He was Dekon (Ass't Pastor) of l'Erguel (St. Imier) 1682-85.

The Present U of St. Etienne is at St-Etienne - Loire, France; but -- was started about 1950. About 20 letters have been written to the varioue Universities/Colleges/Academe, but no success, and I can not seem to find any clue to where he was during the above years 1674-82.

1674 m Jeanne Braye (Jan. of John & Susanne), born 1660 Basel

q.may 1675 Pierre Jr. Baptized at Basel
I am reasonably sure Jean/John & perhaps Elias were born while Rev. P. was finishing his education; and maybe, Records exist of their birth. I also think, Jean Robert, est b 1678, M in France, or Suisse, then came to Virginia, from England, 20 Sept. 1700, with wife & young dau. Then to S. C. c 1707, with John Thomas, Claud P. Richebourg, Le Grand, Michaud Families. Where Rev. P. Robert had taken out a Land Warrant for him in 1695. This is contrary to both of the writers, Miller & Saafford, but they were not real interested in the two younger sons, it seems. There may be other children of Rev. P. & Jeanne Braye Robert.

If you know of anything that could possibly help, or have any ideas, please let me know.

* It looks as if we have them back another generation: Another Wm. Robert est b 1570, sons: Wm., Daniel, & Pierre grown & in separate households April 1623 l'Erguel List of Strangers. Wm. bc 1570 descd then.


The Coat of Arms: To another Sir. Wm. Robert, without the Crest, some time between 1300 to 1520 (when Crest were 1st used). The Arms of Gascoign (Capt John of HMS Alberough - Agent for Jean Robert 1731-32) are very similar to the Roberts of Middlesex, England & Robert of Suisse.

Dear Rev. Peebles:

Many, many thanks for your letter of 3/13. Your thoughts & comments are appreciated.

So far, I have not been able to find a Sir Name: HUGUENT, but do have Huguenin - Neuchatel; Huguet; Huguenet; Hugonet, Wm. 1470. Nor a place spelled: COCLOQUES, where Marie HUGUENT was from. The, her Sir Name is sure a help.

For the Wm. Robert, est b 1570, two List have been put together: 1621 etrangers B 187/23; & April 1623 B 183/23 FROM: Archives de l'Ancien, Eveche de Bale, Porrentruy 2900, Suisse. The ROBERT Family of this Area, had been here since about 1400, & my thinking has been probably of the Family that came from Wales/England with the g-dau of Edw I, who M Count of Bar-le-Duc, about 1350. Mrs Burns has photo copies of everything I've done, such as this, I'm reasonable sure.

Coat of Arms: You are correct re the Mullet in Chief, Sable. When this was written up, 1970 & '71, two Shields were sent, & since the Welsh shaped shield had Roberts on it, Mrs Burns chose the one with a Crescent. Since then, I've sent a new photo, with the Name changed to Robert, The motto is: Calon Wrth Calon, Duw A Digon."

Some are still around the Suisse Area, & some went to old Provence, c 1780, where they quarter their Arms: 1 - Azur, 2 Chevrons Or; 2 & 3 Gules, 1 Tour/Tower Or = Eleanor of Castile, wf of King Edw. I; 4 - Cortice/Stripes @ an Angle Azur & Argent, every 2 pieces, Lion Sable. Andrea Robert.

* Ours are the Arms of John Fitz Robert d 1240, without the Mullet in Chief. Wm. Pierre Robert, b 1873, Centerville, Wilkinson, Miss. goes back to Magna Charta from these: Richard de Clare & King Edw. I; Roger Bigod d 1220 & King Ethelred II; Robert de Roos & King Donald I. This may be thru the Smith, since to date have not been able to get a copy of his data.

At the 1st of each year, a few Foreign letters have been written, then if interesting, followed up on. This year, only the U of Nancy.

A French King burned the Towns of St-Imier & la Chaux de-Fonds. So all of the Records are gone. This Area was actually under French Rule for several years, after Rev. P. had left.

Daniel may have been alive in 1696, List, since he was not referred to as: fils feu. Daniel may have been a Dr. too. A copy of the Pass Port, which list him as: Gentleman is needed, but these are in Genealogical Publications, & have not tried too hard to locate.

The exact time to Suisse would help, and I'm inclind to believe: c 1598 to France, (but where?) then c 1615 to Suisse. So far, I have not been able to confirm the b of Wm. b 1598 Aberyswyth, Wales p 195, O.F.C., which I assume came from, "Dwnn, Lewys" Heraldic Visitation of Wales", but do not have all of the Cardigan Section. When you use Dwnn's, you really have to have an imagination, with the spelling they use. It is even worst than mine.

The head of the Swiss Heraldic Society says, "The Coat of Arms is too Noble for this Area", then quit on me. So, I figure they were associated with the Prince of Basel, in some way; pro Soldiers; or just staying with old-old Relatives, until they could figure out which way to go. See attached photo copy, re Arms of the ROBERT of this Area.

There were other Rober in the 1621 & 23 List l'Erguel 7 Abraham, 1 Jacquet/Jacques/James, & 1 Jonat/Jonas. Guillium, Daniel & Pieret were To-gether.

Well, I've bored you enough for this time.

Rene Fry witnessed the Baptism of Pierre Robert, Jr. 1675, & one is a Professer at U. of Basel, 1976. I wonder who the Demoisells Eliz. Tudore who witnessed same was. Some of this name were quite prominent in South Wales.

Well, I still think Rev. P. Robert was at a University from 2/1674 to 2/1682, that is 8 years, about enough time to pick up a Doctorate, M.D. just like Miller writes, & Stafford doubts. Both of their work is sure appreciated, even if I question an item or so!

Please pardon my rough typing this morning, & if the above rambles, it too. I have tried to answer your 2-3 questions, but so many items, that I think are much needed, for this family, keep running thru my mind, it is difficult to concentrate, this day.

ROBENHAUSEN (Kt. Zürich, Bez. Hinwil, Gemeinde Wetzikon, S. GLS). Dorf, ehemal. Zivil- und Schulgemeinde. Am heute ganz vertornten Ende des Pfäffikersees entdeckte J. Messikommer 1858 eine steinzeitliche Pfahlbaute. Diese Siedlung, sicher eine der grössten der Schweiz, wäre eine der interessantesten, wenn sie wissenschaftlich ausgebeutet worden wäre, denn an einer Stelle wurden drei über einander liegende Siedlungen festgestellt. Leider fand die Ausgrabung zu einem Zeitpunkt statt, wo man lediglich nach Museumsstücken suchte; so wurden die Funde aus den drei Schichten mit einander vermengt und haben deshalb allen wissenschaftlichen Wert verloren. Messikommer, der Erforscher dieser Station, verkaufte eine Menge Fundstücke ins Ausland. R. lieferte neben dem gewöhnlichen Material der neolithischen Stationen auch zahlreiche Holzgeräte: Flachsbrecher, Bogen, Beilschäfte, Dolche u. Schüsseln, eine Keule; zahlreiche Gewebe versch. Struktur, wirkliche Stickerei und Netze. Die ziemlich grobe Töpferei wurde zweifellos von der Michelsbergkultur in Süddeutschland beeinflusst. Aus der oberen Station stammen ein Kupfer- und ein Bronzebeil, sowie mehrere grobe Gefässer, die entweder als Lampen oder Schmelztiegel gedient haben mögen. Was von R. noch unerforscht geblieben ist, wurde von H. Messikommer der Schweiz. Naturforschenden Gesellschaft unter der Bedingung geschenkt, dass vor 50 Jahren dort keine Ausgrabungen vorgenommen werden. — ZWChr. 1908, p. 36; 1917, p. 310. — H. 

I feel that if South Carolina has an active orginazition, then you-all can secure a copy. When I get over to Miss. will ask around, but right off, do NOT know any ROBERT there. This is about 15 miles from where Dad was born. In 1816 Abraham Robert II was closer to the Robert settlement. They knew each other, but if they wrote anything down, it has been lost. Now, I find the A-II & Rev. Isham Nettles (Pr. Fred's Parish) went to Rapides, La. for about 2 years, to form 1-2 Baptist Churches, & are noted in the Chenyville Baptist Church, Beulah, 1817 - 1820 appx.

Elias Robert, b 1745, s of Jacques, some of his children m Nevilles, & are on in Thomas County, Ga. 1850, as Roberts. Then Pierre III sons and daus are noted as Roberts. They have been quite difficult to really do a decent job of putting them together. I calculate 1800, at least 147, perhaps 200, between 1700 to 1800.

Rev. P. was not at U. of Nancy 1575 to 1682, so I've written again to U of Basel. Perhaps they can offer a worth while suggestion. It is very good to have Daniel R. d 1698. Would you think, l'Erguel - St. Immier? I may try for a Will, or Estate Settlement, this year. Then too, I may try for the Arms, in France, "Univ. Nobiliare", by L. de Magny, to see if I can match up the Arms, with a Location, Time, & Given Name. They want \$13.00 to copy all except - Daniel Robert to N. Y. 1703, which I have.

The sons of John Fitz Robert, d 1240, took the Sir Name Eure & Clavering, but perhaps there was another who would not let the King dictate to him, & took the Sir Name Robert, with his dad's, of g-f Arms. The others were changed to Quarterly: Or & Gules, I think.

Or, a dau, g-d, may have M a man with the Sir Name Robert, & they used her male parents Arms. I've seen where the Clares had at least 1 who did similar.

You sure have been of help, & hand write a very interesting letter!

X Lt. 1775 Colleton County Regiment, Pon Pon, (son of Jean Robert), and apparently d 1789, & shown as Capt. Roberts 1790 Colleton, St. Bartholomew, ♀ O O O 21 Slaves. What in the world became of his children/descendents. There are no Rev. War Indents for he, or his Estate, & feel he was probably Prisoner on Ship in Charleston Harbor, with Col Joseph Glover. Capt. Issac Hayne, Ensign Thos. Smith are other Officers of his Company, only shown on 1 payroll, that I've found. If you can get me an address to write, of someone that might know, or descend from him, or have any Idea, such will be most appreciated.

X Gen. Marion's Bodyguards, 4 Nesmith bros, apparently served just a few days more than Abraham Roberts II, 84 days, by the amount claimed, as they did not note the number of days.

X A new thought: A correspondent has sent Abstracts of the 1st Robert/ Roberts Land Transfers, and noted is 1729 ----Benj. Robert, Craven, wife Abigail Halbert, dau James Halbert, & others sell 300 A. to Noah Serre. Now this is too Early for the English Roberts, and he must have been born c 1700. He is listed in Pr. Fredericks Church, and I'm thinking, "this puts a very different view on the Georgetown Robert/ Roberts", if for sure, he is a Robert. Can this be Elias Benjamin? Many had 3, even 4 names, and a new one from you, Jacques de Bourdeaux.

Some of the Irish Church Records, exist, and maybe, just maybe, we can chase those Records, in a little while. I am trying to get lined up, to do a little more in Wales. Preaching Cuzan "Wee Willie" Roberts, of Houston, (Rev. Wm. F., Jr,) was supposed to make a trip, & take a look for me, but could not, last year. (about 6f.3" - 250-275#),

Me, I was 60 in Feb. & trying to help mother make 91, next Feb. Have been out of work, for about 2-3 years now, can not go where Water Well, & Pump Work is, and am getting older, grouchier, etc, so please say a Prayer for me.

It seems to me, that the Rev. Pierre Robert Family has not been done Justice, in the Publications. Just a scattered few, at least that I have found. All of them seem to have been fairly Good People. Now, you-all have gone and taken ROBERTVILLE, S. C. off of the Map.

If my Preaching Uncle (Will F. Sr) had not dropped his Search, like a Hot Potato, c 1932, this soul probably would NOT have become interested. Now, I think, rather than a Horse Thief, he ran into another Abraham Roberts, in S. La., when he was at Franklin, St. Mary, La., and this stumped him.

Someone has asked, "Did Rev. P. have a dau Mary, who M 1 _____ Wingate, M 2 John Hays 1704, (re E. P. Davis Recotds)? So far, I have not been able to verify.

The Videaul - Vedel connection does give something else to work on. I may try to get the Huguenot Society of London, Transactions that are in Houston, copied, and this could perhaps open up some new lines of thought, re Rev. Pierre Robert Family. There were about 5-6-7 John-Jeans if I remember correctly, and I did not note them, since at that time, was taking the 2 main writers word, that Jean & Elias were b in S. C.

Thanks for the suggestion I join Lawton & Allied Families, but from my last paragraph 4/18, you can see I'm not joining much, In fact, have just about Quit Everything, Engineering Societies, etc, except the Huguenot Society & Methodist Church.

Thanks for the Map. I never seem to have enough of these, and wish there was a List of the Available Maps of S. C. 1675 to 1800. There was 1, somewhere, probably down the Road, that had a whole bunch of ROBERT Houses noted, c 1720, Fr. Santee & St. Stephens, I think, but did not run a Copy then.

For a Project, it would be very useful if some group would Index the Early S. C. Newspapers, for Sir Names, rather than just Deaths & Mgs.

On the 3rd Question: Who was the Bishop Roberts, who D 1739, St. Phillips Parish, wife & young son Mitchell, wife: Mary, also noted in 1747 Will of Wm. Watkins? Then whh was the Daniel Roberts, who had a son Daniel, who D c 1745, at the same Church? Knowing something about these could possible fill in some of them for my chart.

Note Wtns: Robt Baron, Robt Keowin, Thos Melven Codicil add Wm Fishburn. Note the Memorial is always to John Roberts, 500 A Colleton 1769 X, p 3. John Roberts, Jr. Cherokee Expdn fm Colleton, but apparently of Dorchester 1759. Baron is Rector of Pon Pon & others quite prominent.

Pon Pon Regiment: 9th 1861: E. P. Davis, A. C. Izard, Fishburn, Roberts, & Sanders. So, apparently, some were still in Colleton.

Rev. War: Horse Shoe Company, Colleton, John Sanders Lt. & Col Y=1637, G-S OH G-G-S of Jean Robert, bc 1745 mc 1770 Eliz. Fishburn. I have tried to follow the Sanders on down, but real success has evaded this writer. One came to Miss. w/ A. Roberts II 1807.

To date, my thinking has been, they were in the Defense Militia/Nat. Guard, and therefore were officers when War broke out 1775. Col Owen/Maj. was bc 1715, m late and had a grown son Richard Brooke, at the start.

Owen's name seemed to be in almost every publication, when this work was 1st started, but kept putting it aside cause I was looking for ROBERT. Now, I look for all variations of Spelling, including Ro bin, Ro bard, etc.

Elias Robert 1745-1820 m 1774 Mary Rue. Another Spelling Roux. Relative? — Albert Roux, Capt. Rev. 1783. This one sure has tried to put this group together, but have not completed the Task, so far. They turn into Roberts, by 1850 Thomas County, Ga.

So far I have avoided your: Amarenthia Smith Richardson, & others of the name dau Wm. Smith & Eliz. Schenckingh. Somewhere, in the back of my mind, something strikes a cord, & it seems to be Medway Church, Liberty, Ga. ----a similar 1st name ---- 1765, or so. Let me ponder, a spell. Yes ---but no connection. Amarinta Roberts, dau Daniel Roberts & Amarinta Elliot M 1774 Stacy 1894 pg 77 & A. L. Baker 1951 174. This Daniel was from Wales, & possibly one of the Robert/Rho Bart that stayed in Wales c 1598. At least, this is how I have him noted.

At Least Wilkinson gives most of his References, and if the Errors are not Deliberate Cover Ups, a careful Searcher can detect the Errors, that somehow will creep in. A Good Critic is always needed!

Monday, I'll try to look at "Wirts - Magna Charta", with the notes I have, and if the copying machine is ready, (they are working on an addition), will run a few of these pages. There are errors in these, but if one is careful, they can be worked around.

Suppose I enclose the attached, you note/photo copy, or such, & send on to Mrs. Burns at Charleston, for ROBERT FILE. Write to you Monday!

Enclosed are pages 2532 - 2536, "Magna Charta", Wurts Chapter 272 Coleman-Manning pages are 2529 - 2542, (Volumn VIII), with notes on Wm. Pierre Robert b 1873 Centerville, Miss. & Sally Bolling Robert, from the Index of Vol VIII. (Rear Pencil)

Also, a page re South Carolina Early Items. I think most of these are in the Lib. of Cong. M/Film; and I know, almost know, that if properly pursued, a few Items on Rev. P. Robert will show up.

Still, your questions re Amarenthia Smith have not been answered. So, unless she was part of the Boston, Phoeby Smith Family, I can not say a thing. There was a short note, in another Volumn, that Phoeby was a cusin of Landgrave Thos. Smith, and of course, it was never checked out. I thought his, Thos Smith's land was in Geo. Dist., and he spent some time there, is the 1st thing thought of, re John Smith & Commander.

If you run into the Parish Militia Census, age 16-60, & what years, do not know, any thing will be appreciated. The Archives say SPG, but that is not right. Probably 1700 to 1775, how often, & if any Exist. These are referred to in a Publication Foot Notes.

Many thanks for your clipping, & other notes. I'll keep doing a little, trying to stay out of "Devilment", etc, and perhaps something worth while will show up. Sorry about the Rambling preceeding!

Jacques Robert (1711-1774) 1735 , Wf: Sarah Jaudon

David Robert prior to 1759, Wf: Eliz. _____? St. Marks
May be son of Benj. above
Wm. Robert Est b 1705-10 prior to 1759

Benjamine Roberts, about 1735, Wf: Mary Holton ? M 1737 St.PH.
Or, is this 2nd mg for the above Benj.?

There are notes on Orangeburg, 1760 May Batz. John Jacob Roberts, son of John Roberts & Charlotte _____? Est b 1738 - 1810+. Noted as possibly a son of Thos. Roberts, & g-s of Jean Robert. Prob. to Miss. 1810: John, John, Jr., James Roberts.(Your Rev. John J. Roberts.) (1851-67)

Stephen Robert s, of Barnwell 1790 1800 1810 bc 1755-1823. His sons to St. Helena, La. c 1811 Daniel & Stephen b 1789 & 1790 Dep. Surv. of St. Helena, which "says Robert", to me. They also say fm Colleton. 1840 E. Baton Rouge, La. next doof, Frances Roberts 70/80. They too, are tied in to Ratcliff/Radcliff, as is A. Roberts II.

Beaufort, St Lukes 1810 pg 131 Issac Roberts 2 - - 1 - X 1 1 - 2 - This I'm sure is Abraham Issac Robarts, son John, g-s Abraham I. Next to, or very close by Abr. DuPont, who held bonds for his g-m. 1820 pg 35 St. Lukes as Abraham I/J Roberts. Will shows in Camden, Ga. or Adm. of Est. 1832 June 5. It seems sure he had Property here, & maybe Chikdren.

Hezekiah Roberts, Purrysburg Merchant, bb 1755-74, I have not been able to place, but since some of Elias R. b 1745-1820 descendants had a Hesikiah 1850 Cens Thomas, Ga. 704/704 (Elias Roberts, SR. & Nancy Nevills - he b 1790 - she b 1803 - Hes. b 1841); ----I am inclined to believe they are Robert & Ours. Josua Robert goes on to upper S. C., it seems. (Laurens - 96 by 1789 -) Joshue'

Now, for one of the daus of Abraham Robert s I & Eliz. _____? In Lib. Ga. Eliz. Sandiford helps Thos Shepard Adm. Est of Eliz. _____ Robert Shepard 1785. Now, 1810 Beaufort, St. Helena, pg 140/268 Eliz. Sandiford + ② - - X - - ① - 1; 135/258 Mrs. Eliz. Ferguson. There again 1820 pg 7: ① son bb 1794-1800 & Eliz. Sandiford 45+. (Or G-S)? b prior 1764

If for sure she belongs to Abraham Robert I, or the _____ Shepard, I have not been able to tell positively. Our Records say several girls, which I take to mean: 3 or 4. This was just found, a month ago.

In 1800 Beaufort there is a Robert Shepheard 26-45, maybe a half bro, or bro. It is good to get some lead on those gurls, back then. Have tried to do them justice!

SMITH: Can you get "Smiths of Exeter," by Arthur M. Smith 1896, and check the Original? If you-all are down to the very fine points, then it pays to look at the Original Data, not 2-3-4 hand.

Your Chart is ok, but whuh - I count 5 Thos. Smiths - Do you mean the II Landgrave had 20 children, 10 by each marriage? That is a lot! Yes!

II Landgrave (1670-1738)

There are some notes taken of Thos. Smith Will D May 6, 1738; P Aug. 13, 1738; Rec'd July 6, 1739, p 292. Kings Grant 2000 A. Mr. Commander, Mr. Robertson (which have felt could be Mr. Robert son, _____). Dorothy, dau Rev. Nath. Bassett, cousin. Sons in Law: Benj. Waring, & Jas. Scrivan, dau Eliz. These do not tell much, and I've added, "Must be Jr. II - [1648-1694 for I] - II d Aug 1738, "probably from Wilkinson.) It looks as if I'd have to get a copy of the Original, or WPA Transcript, to really tell anything.

If you folks are going over what you have collected for a spell, then you do not need to clutter the thing up with Robert, at this time. At least I can only work 1 Family, at a Time, & do half way right.
