John Roberts sells 300 A 1809 Barnwell D:527, & most probably the Family in Georgia Passes Feb. 1, 1810, with a James Roberts un-m. In Orangeburg, there was a Robert/Roberts Family prior to June 1760, according to "Hist. of Orangeburg", Salley, pg 192.

In the past, I have felt these were not Rev. P's, but later, about 1975, it began to look very much like they could be Rev. P's.

There was a Capt. James Roberts living in O.B. prior to Rev. War.

There is a Conveyance RMC for Stephen Robert fm Henry Gafkin, or Gaskin Y 5: 225 1787-88, which have not seen.

His son being Dist. Surv., the 2nd son named Daniel, and perhaps his 3rd marriage to Mrs. Eliz. Campbell, when 1 of the same name witnessed the Will of Mary Roberts, day of P III, & Mary Lynch; are little items that have led me to suspect he belonged to Rev. P. Again, no real proof.

I would like to see, sometime, what has led you-all to believe Stephen is not Rev. P's.

Like the 96 Pendleton, S. C. Roberts, it seems some work is needed on this group.

It occurs to me, you are asking to have the John Roberts, Colleton, d Dec. 1759, (I think) Will: Vol 8, p 435-6 25 Jan 1760, proved to be Jean Robert????? To stand up in a Court to-day, do not believe I can, but.....

Dau Ann Sanders to have Negro Lucy, & her son Abram Tom & dau Lyda.

Son John: L 50 & 2 Lots Dorchester Town, so he had Land there.

Son Thomas: Plantation I now live on. Seems to mean he has owned others, & probably verbal, or otherwise transfered them to sons, sons in law. Thos. apparantly, no Heirs when Will Written.

Eliz. Robert, later Shepard, was around Pon Pon after A-I d; as was John Roberts, & his f in 1, Anthony Lambright.

Look at the Cattels/ Cattells around Round "O". Wid of Capt Wm.: Ann Faser, m Lt/Capt Owen Robert s.

Ann Sanders day Mary m 1 1769 Stephen Guerry; 2 1774 Jonah Robert which does not prove anything, except there was a Huguenot Connection, & Ann was around French Santee, at least 2 times, since both weddings were at Fr. Santee.

There seems to be a couple of more, but so far, have not put them down on paper.

My thinking has been: around Fr. Santee, he was Jean Robert, away, & other matters, Land & such, he was John Roberts. Maybe because of the anti feeling about the Huguenots. Still that does not hold water, since John Abraham Motte was quite active, as Agent, and Jacob Motte was in Government Office, Recorder (Clerk of Court?). Others were in Government, and apparantly, able to do about as well in S. C. as wherever they came from. Many Officers in Milita were Huguenots, or part French Blood.

Is there another that could come close to fit Jean Robert? Why did Jacques & his go to Colleton, after his reverses. I believe Yamassee No. is Colleton. Jacques was Dist Surveyor, which did not know, until a month ago.

So Sorry, that is the best I can come up with, this morn. What made Stafford refer to this one, I do not know. They would not answer my letters. (L. W. (Chip) Robert, Mr. Demecrat, Cons. Engr. Atlanta & Washington, D. C. did, a few years back. He also addressed me as: Esq.)
