Purrysburg: 1732 or so

Pierre Robert had a Lot there, according to Huguenots of S. C.', pg 28. & I show ft. motes 28-29. This must have been Pterre/Peter III, 1704-1740. Peter IV, or bro Thomas, must have Descendents around here. Where did Jonah's son Peter go to? Until clearified, I'm thinking all of the Savannak & Purrysburg are Rev. P'd Descendents. There was another Jonah & Wm in Liberty County, prior to Rev. War, that feel sure are ours. (Not ROBARTS).

John Robert 1742-1826 M 1770 Eliz. Dixon DAR 69813, somehow, I think he did Duty in Cont. Estblm., but do not see notes/ref in file out. Res; James Island during Rev. War, Robertville after War. Whem M 1770, of Indian Land (Acc Santee-Geo. Dist).

IMMIGRATION from Above: Va. Penn. etc: Actually, they had a Super Road between Philadelphia & Charleston. They logged Locations as: so many miles from Charleston, then somany S-W of Phil. In Old Baptist Log Books.

There was one about 1700. One about 1740. That I've noted from the North.

There seems to be quite a few from the Heavy Populated Areas of S. C. to the Back Country, or Indian Lands. Up the Watertree 173501750, some Irish, some English, & some with Huguenot Names. One: Roger Roberts around 1750, with Paget, Paine, McKenzie. This Roberts, I'd like to know a little more about. Another, perhaps Jr. M Marion right after 1800 Mary Bovine Davis, next door neighbor of A. Roberts II 1745 - 1821+ (1972 d date).

After the Rev. War, there seems to be quite a movement to upper S. C., some of which was considered TW Mecklenburg, N. C. Stephen Robert s to upper Orangeburg 1784, with Wm; then John & John Jr. 1785 from Lower O.B. A Sanders, Thos was already there.

Then you have my notes on the Camden, Chester I think, ones that went to 96 Pendleton for a few years 1790 - 1800: Zachariah, Lt. Zephaniah, John, Elias, the 1st 2 are noted as: ROBERT is County Records. and as Roberds 1800 Census. These all served in the Rev. fm S. C., but do not have their correct addresses, except perhaps all fm Camden.

Did you know Colleton County went up to 96 Dist Line; & Granville too? Not until this Map Book arrived!

July 31, 1760 Killed by Indians, Carolegic???, Ga. John Roberts, Pack Horeman. News Letter (1704-63)
Would you think any of these are OURS?

That's all for now

In a way, I'd sure hate to see my Correspondence Gone Over Close, in 2078. They'd ask, "What Grammer School did he get run out of". This Type of Work has been done, quite un-professionally, by this writer. Generally, I just grab up what seems to be useful, a few lines, with no explaination, sources, etc; always thinking the receiver knows a little more than me.

In addition to Roger Roberts Camden, 1735-1750; there is another I'd like to know a little more about: Isham Robert s, Berklet 1759/60 Cherokee Expdn., Amercer 1782, July 30 Effingham, Ga. with James Roberts, Arthur(Ryals) Robert s, & others with S. C. Names; in Bullock County, Ga. 1805, wife Polly (Mary), dau Mary M Thos Hylton; another possibly Jun: wife Sally: Bullock 1801; 1 d by June 1810. "The Rev. Records of State of Georgia", Vol III, pgs 166-169, Allen D. Candler 1908.

It may be a wrong guess, but somehow I've felt he was from Elias, and went to Georgia fairly early. If ROBERT, then most of the Bullock & Screven, Ga. are Rev. Pierre's. OTHERS:

If we could get some Private Data from some of these, perhaps these would fit in, or could be ruled out. Anyhow, you have what I have, except the 1820-30-40-50-60 Census Notes - a whole file.

*I'm trying to say Mourning Roberts, sons Roger, & Ryal, were in Camden, then in Beaufort, 1820 Cens. Pr. Wm. Bapt. Ch. she is Dismissed to Black Creek/Swamp Sept 1827. Apparantly, wife of Zachariah R. 1800 Beaufort, Pr. Wm. See Camden, Ga. Deed Book I-78, 4/1813. Also, Zake Roberts 1820 Camden Cens, pg 58, 2 2 - 1 2 - X 1 1 3 1 1 Georgia.

Suppose I should add: Or, wife of Roger Roberts, Sr. Camden/Sumter 1790.

Gosh, I guess you have enough diversion, from Smiths, for a while.
