Jesse S. Eddins married Margaret Robert, daughter of Hadley Peter & Ann Eliza.

I have never met Ruth Cook in person, only on the telephone and writing. I've been searching some of Margaret's, brothers, namely Ben & Tom, their offsprings, I knew that Ben had a daughter that married a Mallard, so went to the telephone book in Palestine and found a Jack Mallard, sure enough he was a relation and he directed me to Ruth.
