Note: "In 1556, soon after the revocation of the Edict of Nantes, David Robert and his son Pierre, a Huguenot preacher, the record of whose ordination is still in the old Hugenot church at Basle, Switzerland, came over as exiles for religion's sake, and settled at Santee, South Carolina. Soon after his arrival Pierre Robert became the first pastor of the Huguenot church of that place and served in this capacity until his death. The church has since died out, but in the old Huguenot church at Charleston is still found a tablet bearing the following inscription:

PASTEUR PIERRE ROBERT French Santee So. Ca 1656 1715"

Note: The Rev. Pierre Robert was baptized 30 Dec 1655. He graduated at St Etienne as a physican; attended the University of Basil, 1674; and ordained on 19 Feb. 1682. He was a pastor of a Waldensian church in the Piedmont Valley in Switzerland. It is claimed that the Waldenses were the ancestors of the present day Baptists. He immigrated to South Carolinia in 1686 and served as the first minister of the Huguenot (later the Anglican, now Episcopal) church at St. James Parish, SC, continuing his ministry until prior to 1 Jan. 1710. He was the first Huguenot minister in America. He was the first rector of St. James Anglican Church, although it is unclear to whether he was ordained as such since there was no Anglican Bishop in America at the time.

Pierre Robert arrived in South Carolinis in 1686 with Captain Philip Gendron and settled in St. James Parish, on the Santee. He was the first French minister to preach in Carolinia and served until his death.

The first Hguenot church built in Charleston is still standing in a good state of preservation at this day (1946) even though it is more than two centuries old. On one of its inner walls may be seen a tablet placed there by some of the descendants of Pierre Robert with this inscription (Pasteur Pierre Robert - French Santee, So. Carolinia - 1656 - 1715.")

Joseph Lawton was an exemplary man, contributing to his society in religious, patriotic, civic and social activities.

He was born on October 18, 1753 on Edisto Island at his father's plantation on what is now called Steamboat Creek. He was the fourth son, the youngest child and the only child born to Captain William Lawton by this third wife, Mary Sams, the widow of Paul Grimball 1

By the time of Joseph's birth, seventy-three years after the first permanent English settlement in South Carolina, Edisto Island had settled into the relatively comfortable security of freedom from the Spaniards and of the prosperity brought about by second and third generation wealth. His inheritance on Edisto Island from his father and three half brothers were considerable for the day, and it is not known what prompted him to come to the wilderness of the Black Swamp area. However, he was on Black Swamp before the Revolution, along with his Grimball half brothers and sisters. By 1774, he had sold his Edisto plantation and was acquiring the first of the properties at Black Swamp, that were to become his Mulberry Grove Plantation.3

Joseph, not quite twenty, married on March 18, 1773, eighteen year old Sarah Robert. As tradition has it, the ceremony was performed at Indianland, or Stoney Creek, that indomitable stronghold of Calvinism, where Sarah's father, Jacques Robert, is said to be buried. Her mother, the former Sarah Jaudon, came on to Robertville subsequently.4

Joseph and Sarah reared seven children to maturity, beginning with William Henry, the eldest, born on February 23, 1775, and ending with The Reverend Winborn Asa, born on June 23, 1793.5 Each of the seven children deserves special attention, but time prevents telling the interesting points of their lives.

Sarah's surviving letters and commentaries on her, reflect her education, cultured French background and her concern with her family, the neighborhood and the church. 6
Sarah's great grandson, Joseph Thomas Robert, in 1878, wrote of her, "she was very intelligent, fond of reading, hospitable, and eminently pious and exemplary." Mr. Robert said of her father, Jacques Robert, "Her father was a man of culture, well educated and fond of scientific researches, as we learn from records of philosophical apparatus belonging to the family. His children were brought up to be intelligent and influential members of society."7

Joseph and Sarah reared their children at Mulberry Grove in a two-story home that was sufficiently imposing, we learn from Sarah's will, to have a parlour and other accoutremants.8The summer house, at Transpine, where the family spent its summers hoping to avoid malaria and miasma, could easily be reconstructed from the detailed specifications in Colonel Alexander J. Lawton's diary.9

In her later years, Sarah was seen through the eyes of a Yankee schoolteacher as the matriarch of the large Lawton clan, and as the grand dame of Black Swamp, riding about the countryside in her chair, or chaise. Charlotte Verstille, daughter of the famous miniaturist, William Verstille, had been preceptress of Phillips Andover Academy in Massachusetts before coming to teach the Robertville gentry at the newly formed Black Swamp Academy, and it is from her descriptive letters to relatives in the North that we draw this picture of Sarah.10

To Sarah we owe the precedent of the first Lawton family reunion. It was held in 1831, almost a century and a half ago, when according to Mr. Robert, "Grandmother determined to invite all of her children and grandchildren then living to meet together at her residence at "Mulberry Grove" and spend a day once more as a family in social enjoyment." (Now we might know (this is the end of page 47)

For example, Dr. James Stoney Lawton simply says that his grandfather Lawton was an officer in the Revolution;17 General Henry Martyn Robert states that his mother was a granddaughter of Major Joseph Lawton of the Revolutionary War;18 while several sketches written of General Alexander Robert Lawton, who lived at Mulberry Grove with his grandmother, and who was twenty-one when she died, state that his grandfather, Joseph Lawton, was an officer in the Continental forces.19

Someday, a search of repositories may well prove by primary evidence, that General Lawton knew whereof he wrote. It is unfortunate that many records of the Revolution in the National Archives at Washington were burned in the War of 1812 and in another subsequent fire there. Records of many South Carolina soldiers are at the Huntington Library at San Marino, California, libraries in Ann Arbor, Michigan, the Draper Library in Wisconsin, and in many other public, institutional and private collections in the United States.

Many Revolutionary War records are in the South Carolina Archives at Columbia, although considerable South Carolina records of the War were burned, lost, or placed through various means in other places. The records at Columbia prove that Joseph, as a Lieutenant in Colonel Stephen Bull's Granville County Regiment of Militia, received funds for provisions for a scouting party in May, 1778, and two pay bills prove he commanded the Black Swamp Company of Foot at Two Sister's Ferry from July 5th through July 11, 1778. It is singular and somewhat ironical that numerous records at Columbia document the lengthy war records of two other Black Swamp officers: Captain William Maner and Colonel William Stafford on almost a day-to-day basis throughout the war.

One story of Joseph's Revolutionary record is of special interest. The Reverend Fred Jones in the 1895 Minutes of the Savannah River Baptist Association may have taken inspiration from Parson Weems accounts of Washington, Jasper and Marion et. Al, or he may have based what he wrote on documents or tradition passed down by word of mouth. At any rate, the story, written by a non-Lawton, is interesting and we should be proud to have it. The Reverend Mr. Jones wrote:

During the Revolutionary War, Lawton owed his life to a British officer, who was once befriended by him. the officer lost his horse near Mr. Lawton's and to his surprise, the Whig Lawton, furnished him one, with the remark, "I am not fighting men, but for principles". When the Tories betrayed Mr. Lawton and he was about to be executed by the British, the officer went to the execution through curiosity, and on discovering his benefactor, saved his life, with the expression "Such a man must not be executed."

Notes for THOMAS* WILLINGHAM:

"Sarah and Thomas H. Willingham had one child, a son named Thomas, born December 23, 1798, Santee, South Carolina. When he was only three months old his father died, and the widow, Sarah Willingham, married Elias Gabriel Jaudon (1772-1826) on November 14, 1799, they had ten childen. My mother often told me how devoted to him was Thomas Willingham's old colored mammy; when she died her last words were, "God bless MarseTommy." I imagine his colored mammy had much to do with his rearing as his young mother married for the second time while she was still in her teens and he less than a year old. His nurse's prayers were answered, for God blessed him greatly. On November 13, 1823. Thomas married Phoebe Sarah Lawton. He moved to Savannah, where he was a cotton merchant, but his health became impaired and on the advice of his physician he located in the country. He had plantations from the rice fields of South Carolina to the sea island cotton lands of South Georgia. All of his plantations were well improved, hospitals provided for the sick, and everything conducted in the most orderly and methodical manner. He was a kind master to his slaves; there was an attachment existing between master and mistress and their slaves which one who had never borne such a relationship could ever understand. Thomas Willingham built his home, a lovely old house at Lena, South Carolina, long before the War Between the States, which was burned by Sherman's army in 1864; he rebuilt it but that house was also burned by fire caused by a defective flue in 1930. His grandson, Thomas Oregon Lawton. who was my father's first cousin, writes me in 1941, "All evidence of Grandfather's handiwork has gone except the old hewn timber barn on one side of which a hole was cut through which Wheeler's cavalrymen loaded corn as they passed through, ahead of, or behind Sherman's army." Thomas Willingham died July 7, 1873, at Allendale and is buried in the old Lawtonville Baptist Church cemetery. He was a deacon in this church for over fifty years. In his home no day was ever begun without the family gathering for prayer at which a chapter in the Bible was read, a custom which was kept up by many of his descendants. He had seven sons, five of whom fought for the Confederacy, and four daughters. His second son, Benjamin Lawton Willingham, my grandfather, was born at Beaufort, South Carolina, on April 21, 1829. and died at Macon, Georgia, February 17, 1898. He was educated at The Citadel, Charleston, later spent one year at Madison College, now Colgate University. While attending The Citadel he met Elizabeth Baynard"

From the Eastman, Georgia paper dated Thursday, August 16, 1917:

PROMINENT AND GREATLY BELOVED LADY OF EASTMAN IS INSTANTLY KILLED BY SOUTHERN FREIGHT TRAIN

"Mrs. E. H. Bacon, one of Eastman's most prominent and greatly beloved women, was instantly killed and her body horribly mangled at 11:45 on Saturday morning las by a local freight train No. 97, southbound, in charge of Conductor Dave Simpson and Engineer Burgess.

The accident occured at the railroad crossing just south of the Southern depot, and in the heart of the business section of the city. The engineer was switching cars, and had pulled down on the eastern side track for theswitch to be turned so as to run a car back in on the side trackextending toward the W.&T. line. Mrs. Bacon, who was driving a horse, evidently thought the train had pulled on down the road, and was not expecting it to go back into the side track connecting with the W.&T. She therefore drove onto the track just in time to be struck by the rear car attached to the engine, which was a coal car. The buggy she occupied was completely demolished. The negro brakeman, Millard Cullers, who was attending the switch, seeing the danger that threatened Mrs. Bacon, ran to the rear of the train, threw on the air brakes, and grabbed the rear wheels of Mrs. Bacon's buggy, making a desperate effort to throw it around and clear the track, but was unable to accomplish his purpose. His arm and shoulder were struck by the car and were badly bruised. The desperate effort of this negro to save Mrs. Bacon's life, in which he really risked his own, is a worthy act that has been the subject of the highest praise. Mrs. Bacon was the widow of the late Dr. E. H. Bacon, who was for many years a prominent citizen of Eastman. She was born in Allendale, SC in 1849 and was 68 years old at the time of her death. She was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Willingham. Soon after the Civil War her parents moved to Albany, Georgia, and it was wile a resident there that Mrs. Bacon attended Monroe Female College, now Bessie Tift College, named for Mrs. Bacon's sister, from which she graduated with first honors. In 1881 she and her husband moved to Eastman, since which time she has resided here. In young girlhood she became a member of the Baptist Church, and of this institution she was all her lfe a devoted member and staunch supporter. She and Dr. Bacon were important factors in building the first Baptist church in Eastman, and she was a teacher of the infant class in the Baptist Sunday-School here for thirty-five years. She was organist of the church 26 years. No woman in the state, probably, has had a greater effect upon the religious life of the section in which she lived than has Mrs. Bacon. Her life has been filled with useful service in the Master's cause, and although she is dead, her works will live after her, a continuous benediction to the livs of those who have had the benefit of her kindly ministrations, her influence and association."
