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RECORD OF THE
CLYDE NELSON CLARK FAMILY

Elizabeth Roller, eldest daughter of William and Martha Roller (born December 22, 1873 - died October 1937), married I. Elmer Clark (born 1864 - died 1896). Little is known about his family. They settled in Cygnet, Ohio, having migrated there from Titusville, Pennsylvania. For some unknown reason he was called "Charlie". To this union was born one son. He was called Clyde Nelson Clark, born March 7, 1894 - died November 1, 1973.

"Charlie" Clark, father of Clyde, was killed in a boiler explosion while working in the oil field on the old Roller homestead of William and Martha Roller. Clyde was about 2 years old when this happened. After the accident, Elizabeth brought her son back to Dowling and they lived with her parents. Clyde grew up on his grandfather's farm.

On November 24, 1915 Clyde married Ada Mae Cordrey, born October 11, 1893 - died February 1, 1951. She was the youngest daughter of James Buchanan Cordrey (born Dec. 8, 1856 - died August 26, 1907) and Charlotta Christina Reidenbach Cordrey (born August 15, 1856 - died May 3, 1941). Ada's father died when she was about nine years old. Her mother continued to live on the farm for the remainder of her life.

To this union, between Clyde and Ada, were borne six children:

Charlotte Ann - May 5, 1927 at Dunbridge, Ohio

Opal married Walter Kuzmich (born January 29, 1915) in 1944 - divorced 1948. On October 20, 1951 she married Edward N. Nasef, a widower with two children. He was born March 12, 1914 - died May 26, 1962. He had two children by his first marriage; Richard, born April 23, 1943, and Nancy, born March 18, 1948. To this union, Edward and Opal, was borne one son, James Edward on September 18, 1953 in Inglewood, California, where they made their home. Ed always called her Lucille, her second name.

Martha married Edward Kalim Azzam, born November 18, 1918, in Jerusalem, Palestine. They were married on February 8, 1948 in Bowling Green, Ohio. They met while Martha was in Palestine working for the State Department. To this union was borne two children; Edward Kalim, Jr. (born July 12, 1954 in Inglewood, California), and Jadine Ann (born March 24, 1959 in Inglewood, California).

HORRIBLE.

Boiler Lets Go At Dowling With Fatal Results.

Arlo Brown and Samuel
Miller Killed Instantly.

Charles Clark Blown One
Hundred Feet Into Space.

He Succumbs In a Few
Hours to His Injuries.

Fragments of the Boiler Scattered
Over the Surrounding Country—
Full Details of the Calamity.

A horrible and death dealing disaster, scarcely paralleled in the history of Wood county, occurred near Dowling, Monday afternoon at 1 o'clock.

By the explosion of a pumping boiler on the William Roller farm two men were instantly hurled into eternity and a third died a few hours afterwards from his injuries.

THE THREE VICTIMS

Were Charles Clark, ex-postmaster of Dowling; Arlo Brown, a nephew of Justice J. M. Brown, and Samuel Miller.

Mr. Clark was married and about 30 years old. He leaves a young wife

and it is safe to assume that the real facts will never be known. Parties who were at the boiler a few moments before the explosion claim that it contained two gauges of water. On the other hand it is claimed by some that the accident was caused by the water being low.

INEXPERIENCED MEN.

One thing is certain and that is both Clark and Brown were inexperienced men and that neither of them were competent to operate a steam engine.

As stated before they were attempting to run a tank of water. The boiler since tested that it would not work. It was run the morning "tour" and he had put on a big head of steam in obedience to the orders of the gauger who said that more steam was required to run the pump.

Clark has just come on to take the afternoon "tour."

The boiler was literally demolished and fragments of it are scattered over the surrounding country.

TWO NARROW ESCAPES.

Jay Roller had driven past the boiler just a moment before on a road that passes through the field. When the explosion occurred the barrel end of the boiler took the same course and landed within a few rods of his team. James Charbet, a driller, was inspecting the "donkey" pump at the time and saved himself by falling flat on the ground.

They had on a 140-pound head of steam and the heavy pressure found vent through the safety valve. Clark thoughtlessly picked up a heavy wrench and climbing up on the boiler hung this additional weight on the valve lever, thus cutting off the escaping steam.

Instantly the boiler exploded with a deafening sound. Clark was thrown high in the air and came down about 12 feet from where the boiler stood. He was scalded in a horrible manner from head to foot. He was badly cut about the head and face and was otherwise injured a few moments. Brown had been thrown to the southwest and his head struck against a tree 8 feet above the ground, dashing out his brains. His body bounded from this tree against another and then against another before it struck the ground. His death must have been instantaneous.

DEATH OF CLARK.

After telling the story of the accident Clark lost consciousness and never rallied afterwards. He was carried to the house of his father-in-law, William Roller, where he was attended by the doctors. But his injuries were of such a nature that medical science was of no avail and he expired at midnight, Monday night.

The body of Arlo Brown was removed to the home of his uncle, J. M. Brown, where it was prepared for interment. Samuel Miller was taken to Jack Marron's where he boarded. Undertaker Finkbeiner prepared the remains for shipment and on Tuesday Wm. Osborne took them to his former home in Pennsylvania.

FUNERAL OF CLARK AND BROWN.

A RED HOT BOLT

One inch in diameter was driven through the thick of his thigh and the surrounding flesh was literally scorched. Workmen in the vicinity crowded to the scene and found Clark still conscious. And he was able to tell how the accident happened.

The explosion shrouded the entire community and attracted a large crowd. Miller was still alive when assistance arrived but expired in a few moments. Brown had been thrown to the southwest and his head struck against a tree 8 feet above the ground, dashing out his brains. His body bounded from the tree against another and then against another before it struck the ground. His death must have been instantaneous.

Kind and Affectionate Wife.

It is with the greatest
of pleasure that I sit down this evening to address you with
a few lines & to inform you that I am well & enjoying
good health & early hope this may find you & the children
enjoying the same blessing. I have been very anxious to hear
from you & looked very much for a letter today but was
disappointed. Since I last wrote you we have had march over
a good portion of the State of Mississippi as it least over
one hundred miles we started on the morning of the 14th
& arrived here in camp on the evening of the 21st we
were all tired enough to drop down on the ground
& rest for the night my health has been very good
while on the march & also all the boys of my Co. stood
the march well the boys are all in good health. We in number
we had no commissioned Officer with us I therefore had
to take command of the camp. Our Brigade did not meet
with any difficulty but we could hear cannonading &
firing & going on with our advanced troops the Rebels
were about thirty thousand strong they would not stand
any battle with us but they would watch their opportunity
& make a dash on some of our weakest points. The 12th lost
two men one killed & the other is not heard from this
happened by their straggling from the Regt. we were
drawn up in line of battle on the 3rd day by a volley

of some five or six years but that was the last
that we heard of them for that day & we did not
have a chance to fire off our guns. I received a letter
from you dated Sept 27 on the morning that we started
on the march it gave me great pleasure to hear that you
were all well you wrote in it that you did at one time
stop family worship I never that there was something
wrong by your two letters that I got before the last. They
were both full of trouble & they troubled me very much
but I have not left off my family worship and I am still a
praying for you & the children. I have regret to tell you
Dear Jane about this you know Jane that you worked hard for
to get me to shake off my evil ways & join the church &
which by so doing we have taken comfort & enjoyed sweet
happiness & prosperity and it will be so with us as long
as we try to live as good Christians this I know to be so
and I know Dear Jane that if we give up leaving the good
God now that war & destruction is our portion I can see
it & I know it to be so you know how it has been Dear Jane
and it will be ten times worse if we fall from grace & leave
off family worship. O Dear Jane you should pray without
ceasing to the good Lord that your husband might continue to
pray & to lead a Christian life. that you & your dear children
might live in the enjoyment of peace & happiness & plenty
and enjoy all earthly happiness for such is the Christian lot
the good Lord tells us that we must be persecuted
and we must pray for those that persecute us & if you are
persecuted Dear Jane do not leave off your praying but
pray the more sincerely for those that persecute you.

and the Lord will Bless you & relieve you from your
trials the more you Pray the happier you will feel.
This is the way it is with me & I know it is so with
every praying person. you wrote in one of your letters that if
I told more of your persecuter than I did of you I should
say so or something like that this hurt my feelings
very much. for you know Dear Jane that there never
was a man that loved his wife & children more than I do
and there is not a being on earth that I love so well as
you and all my letters and actions & words goes to prove it.
and I never could stand it to hear any one say one word
against you. and I am bound to protect you & care for you
toward do all I can for you at all times hoping that you
will always do to others as you would that they would do
to you. it looks so sorry had you & your will with
neighbors try to live in peace with all. when I come
home I want to meet all in good friendship. how much
pleasanter it would be to do so. and I know Jane that if
we all live to see this war over we will take more solid comfort
together than we ever did before if we keep up family worship & if we
stop that I dont know what will become of us. Praying Jane is all that is
a going to make us happy and prosper in this world. The trials & hardships
that we are receiving now is for our good. when this dark season is over
we will know how to appreciate good things & pleasant times. but we
must be patient & content always giving thanks to the good Lord for all things
you never have told me how you potatoes turned out or whether you
got the well dug or not. nor hardly any thing about home. I want
that back field seeded down next spring at all events. I suppose there
was nothing on it this summer only a few Potatoes. if it had been sowed to

grass seed it would have fetched you fifty Dollars but this way its worth nothing
Oct 14th we are all well this morning the weather is quite cold & wet
the most of the camp is on picket this morning I sent you my
commission for first sergeant you that that I was a working for
something that I could not get but you see that I did get it. I should
like to hear wheather Will is a coming back to the Regt or not. I have not
heard from John lately I expect he is at Annapolis. Jake Baker is a going
Home next on furlough. I believe I have told you all the news it so
cold I cant write I want you to set down & make up your mind to
to write me a good long letter when you get this. you never said a
word what Mr. Brown said about us nor anything of the kind things
that I want to hear about you leave out. I hope that I wont
hear any more speaking I dont want to hear about that.

give my love to Father & Mother & to all
your truly
I have sent me a pair of shoes had
had look with them last ones you sent me
I have sent you a little money set the post of
one up to help me think and
send them by Baker.

you wanted to know wheather I ever paid any postage on your
letters I never paid a cent on a letter in the army
our Regt Postmaster has no rite to take any money
a letter that is not paid will be stoped before it gets in the
Regt. & it is nothing but a shave that you have to pay postage
on my letters when I have paid it. unless they mean to charge a
Soldier more than they do a Citizen. it seems that they do.

My love & well wishes to Almeria & Emma & Gray &
