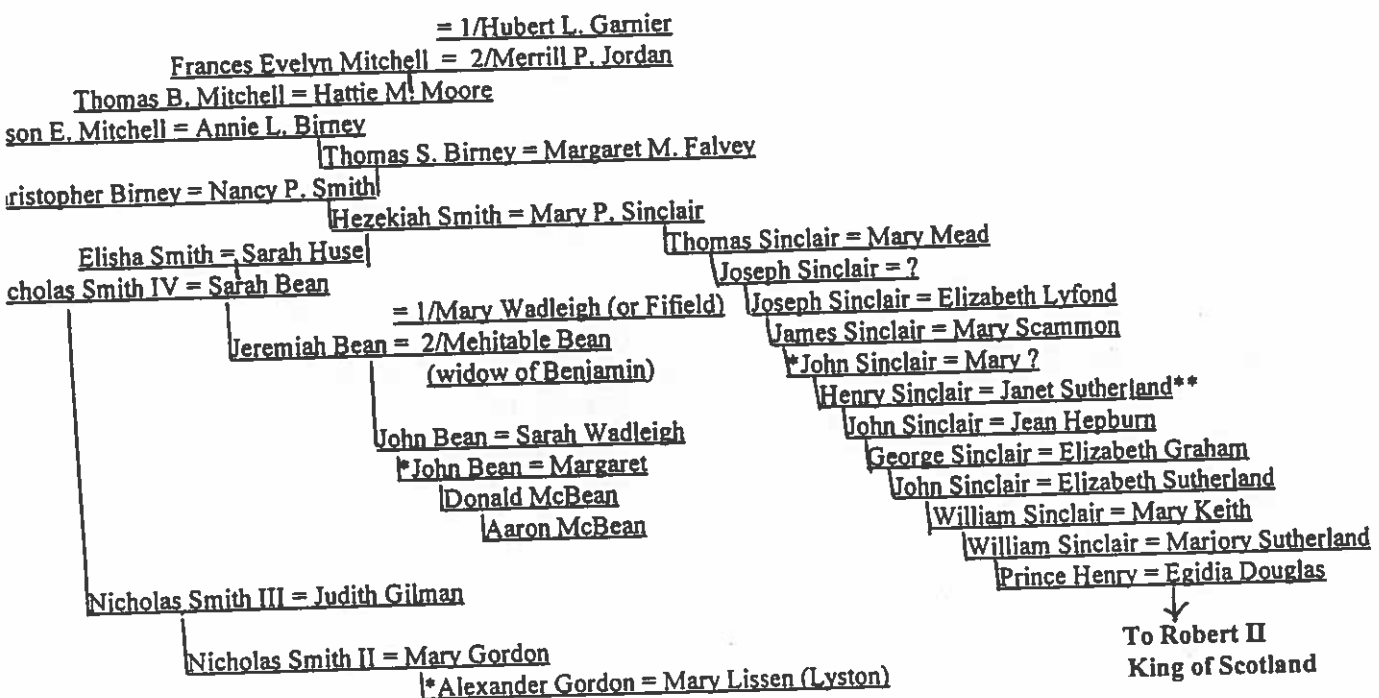


SINCLAIR GENEALOGY

From Marjorie Anne Calvert Barrow (#839): Judge James Henry, b. Foveran Parish, Aberdeen, 1698, d. Accomac County, VA, 1757.

From Florence Windsor Hillyard (#868): Lord William Johnston of the Johnstons of Annandale, Scot., came to America in 1722, arrived in Spotsylvania Co., VA, settled in a place later to be called Fredericksburg.

From Barbara Anne Denton Brassell (#792): Lady Diana Skipworth.

From Clara Kingman Damon (#L99): Hector Bruce, b. Jan 24, 1842 in Loth, Sutherlandshire, Scot., came to Pictou, Nova Scotia, on ship Hector.
