FURTHER PROOF of all this: An original affidavit found in old family papers concerning DAVID SMITH (grandson of ARCHAR 1702-1760), a Revolutionary Soldier. Was filed with S.A.R. papers for Dr. Prentiss Edward Smith, Burnice Whittier Smith, Hattiesburg, Miss., Dr. Hobart Amory Smith, Hattiesburg, Miss. (These three brothers are sons of Dr. Henry Pinkney and Mattie Ann Mathis Smith, Hattiesburg, Miss.) This affidavit was dated Oct. 1850 and the same MAGISTRATE who signed the affidavit, attached to it a note which reads as follows:

"The Bible Record named in the affidavit, SHOWS that Sarah Rebecca Lindley and David Smith were married Thanksgiving Day 1782, after a war-romance. David Smith had been held prisoner by the British but escaped and found refuge with the Lindley family who hid him under the house. Later he married a daughter of the family...The Bible Record gives birth dates of their son William etc....."

One page of the Bible Record is headed, 'THE SMITH FAMILY', under which is the following statement:

David Smith was son of Daniel Smith and wife Mary Screven, while Daniel was son of Archar Smith and wife Edith Elizabeth Waring. The latter couple had another son George who also married with a Waring, namely- Elizabeth and among their

children was a son John (b. bef. 1758) who m. with his cousin Elizabeth, she being dau. of James Lauren Smith and his 1st wife.

On page 7, it also states - David Smith with his first cousin John and John's two sons, James and John, together with the older John's brother-in-law, all left S.C. together for Georgia and other parts.

Sarah Rebecca Lindley was the daughter of Thomas Lindley and his wife, Elizabeth Ridgeway Lindley. She was married to David Smith in Abbeville District S. C. in 1782 by Jonathan Downs, Esq. Mrs. Sally Roseman who died in Georgia was one of the waiters. One of Rebecca's sisters, Mary Lindley Abercrombie of Abbeville, S. C. born in 1764 testified when Rebecca was applying for a revolutionary pension. So did a brother, Jonathan Lindley born 1771, (Abbeville, S. C.) of Cobb County, Georgia.

Job Smith (B. Feb. 15, 1793 in S. C., D. June 8, 1840)

married Nancy Camp, daughter of Thomas Camp and Susan Wagner in Jackson County, Georgia on August 10, 1817. Job Smith was the first ordinary of Walton County, Georgia. Nancy Camp Smith was born March 7, 1795. She died Nov. 27, 1887. Both buried in the Smith family cemetery near Winder (Barrow Co., Ga.)
