DAVID SMITH MARKER UNVEILED BY DAR

More than 200 were present to witness the unveiling of a marker on the grave of David Smith last Sunday afternoon. The exercises took place at the Smith Cemetery on the Hog Mountain Road a few miles from Winder.

Mrs. I. E. Jackson, regent of Sunbury Chapter, D. A. R., was in charge of the following program: Assembly call, Allen Carrington, bugler; prayer by chaplain, Mrs. M. C. Roberts; pledge to the flag, led by Mrs. C. S. Williams; America, assembly; remarks by regent, Mrs. I. E. Jackson; life of David Smith, George N. Bagwell; address, Mr. J. C. Flanigan, Lawrenceville; unveiling of marker, Jean Perry and Bill Camp, dressed in Colonial costume; placing of flowers, Louie Smith and David Hammond; color bearer, Dan Williamson Jr.; prayer; taps, Allen Carrington.
